

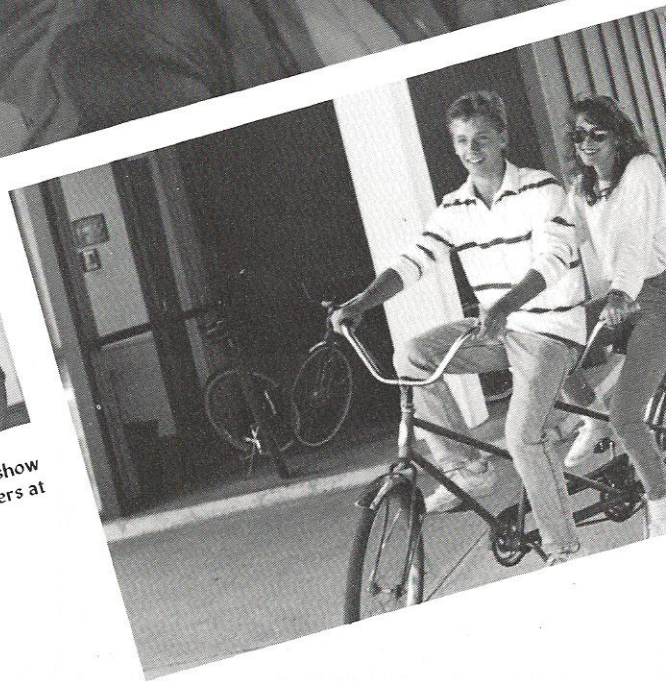
# WHAT A BUNCH OF HAMS!
