

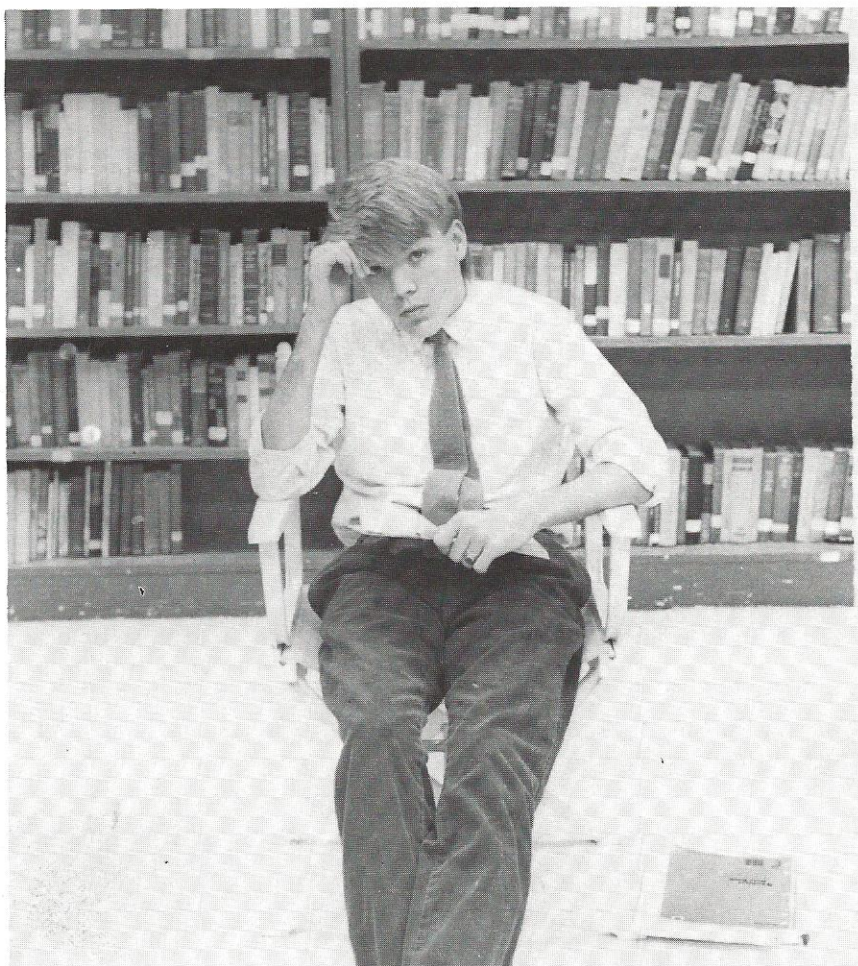
SEARCHING FOR THE LIGHT
