## Sponsors: Miss Steffen, Miss Woody

The Forum continued to be the name of the club until 1941 when it was changed to *Hora Latina*. Miss Steffen and Miss Woody were the sponsors, and they have continued to be the sponsors through the years to the present time. Through succeeding years the organization was called the Latin Club, the officers being *Consul Major*, *Consul Minor*, *Scriptor*. The various activities during these years included the reading of a Latin newspaper, *Res Gestae*, games and contests, plays, field trips, and talks given by outsiders and by the sponsors.
