A Cappella Choir

Director: Miss Meyer

Southwest's leading vocal chorus, the A Cappella Choir, started when the doors of the school were opened. There were forty-six members in that first choir. That year they participated in the Washington University Music Festival. The first sponsor, Miss Elsie Press, soon left and was replaced by Miss Leontone Meyer. When World War II broke out, Miss Meyer, who was a marine officer, had to leave Southwest. From 1944 to 1946 Miss Thym was the director. After the war Major Meyer came back to Southwest, where she has been vocal director ever since.

Today eighty-three songsters belong to the choir.

These song birds could also be called social butterflies. They, with other music groups, had a party at St. Mark's Episcopal Church. In April they joined with the Boys Glee Club in giving a hayride at Valley Mount.

The serious life of the choir is shown by the calendar on the opposite page. We would like to call your attention to the number of community services that have been rendered. Besides these, during the year this chorus has provided pleasant entertainment for school affairs. Surely the choir has shown its leadership since the opening of Southwest and will continue to be the leader of all vocal groups there.
