The Southwest cindermen gained recognition last year when, in capturing the open division of the Maplewood Relays, they brought SW its first major track trophy. The team of Crowell, Gleason, Jones, Witte, Conklin, and Taylor racked up enough points to lead the field. Later, at the state meet, Crowell, Schmid, Ulbrich, and Jones set a new record for the mile relay with an amazing time of 3:30.0! At field Day, at Public Schools Stadium, Southwest captured third place in the Senior Division with 37½ points. Captain Don Jones was high with 7½ points. Junior point-getters were Junior Captain Jerry Mulkey, who placed fifth in the 440, and Ed Hewlett, who tied for fifth in the pole-vault. When asked about next year's chances, Coach Beezley has this to say, "I never like to make predictions. We are going to have to find some new material for the Junior Division and we need some Senior distance men. But Mr. Merchant and I agree that the present squad was made up of a bunch of fighters and we are looking forward to another fine competitive season."
