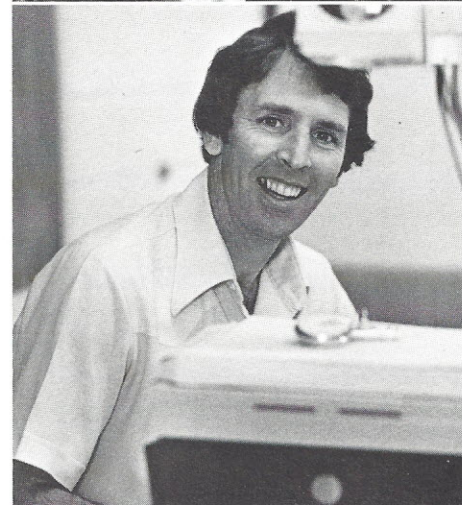


Selection Of Varied Nonacademic Courses Provides Needed Break In Routine
