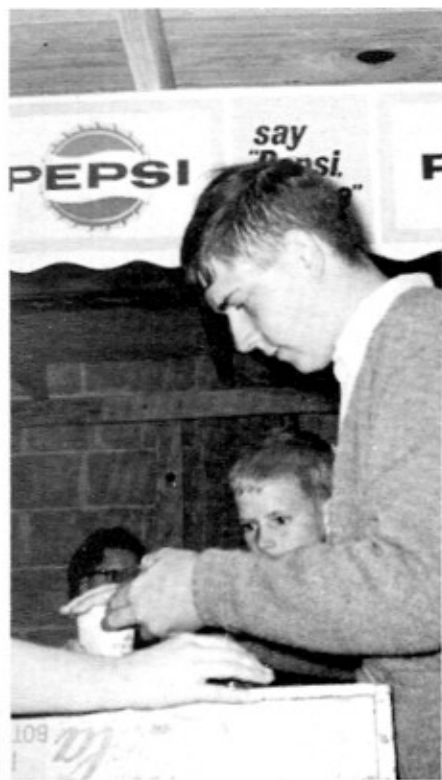

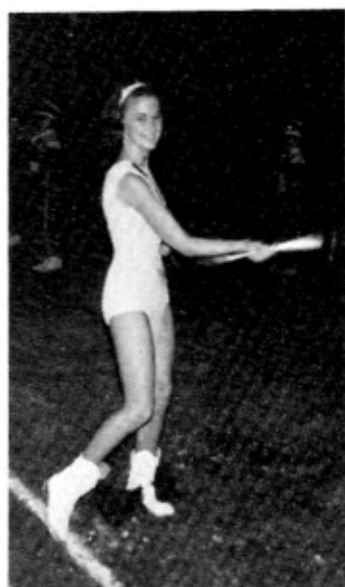


This feeling of accomplishment stamps out all timidity and instills in us a warm certainty of utilizing our abilities and talents.
