Pride, Practice, Perfection, and Performance



The band members held their first meeting August 10, and worked from three to four hours a day until the opening of school. After school started, these band students could be seen on the practice field until 4:30 or 5:00 o'clock each afternoon preparing for their halftime performances at Walterboro football games.

During the fall, the band performed at eight football games and two "pep" rallies. After football season the "Marching Bulldogs" participated in Christmas parades in Beaufort, Hampton, and Walterboro.

The highlight of the year came on October 24 when the band competed with 36 other high school bands from North and South Carolina at the Southern States Marching Festival, which was held in Camden.
