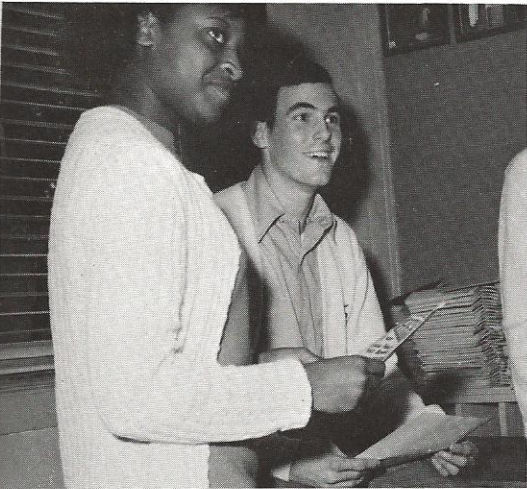
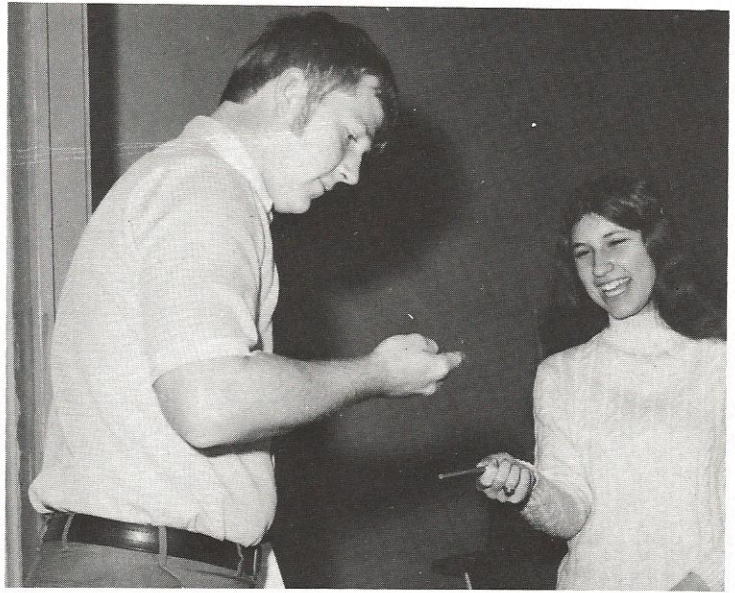
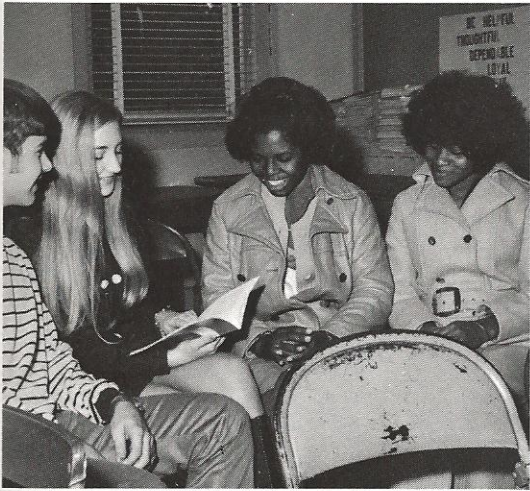
It becomes, in reality, a laboratory of citizenship by doing the things which a good citizen does. It provides a training ground for leaders and followers.

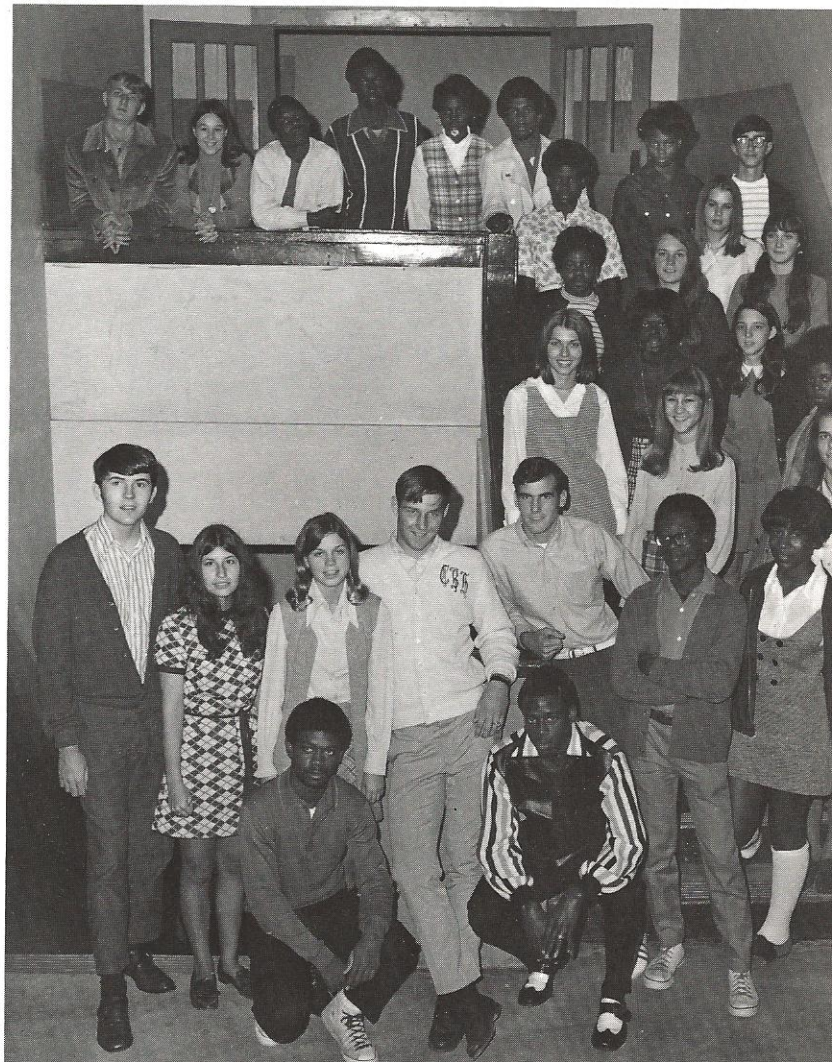

With the advice and encouragement they received, the staff began to create a yearbook which would best depict life at Walterboro High School and be unique as well.



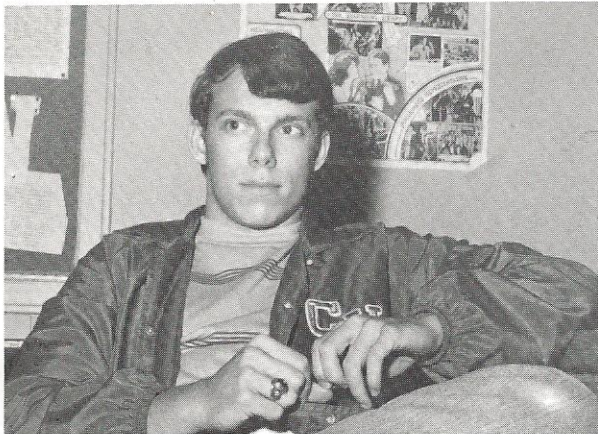

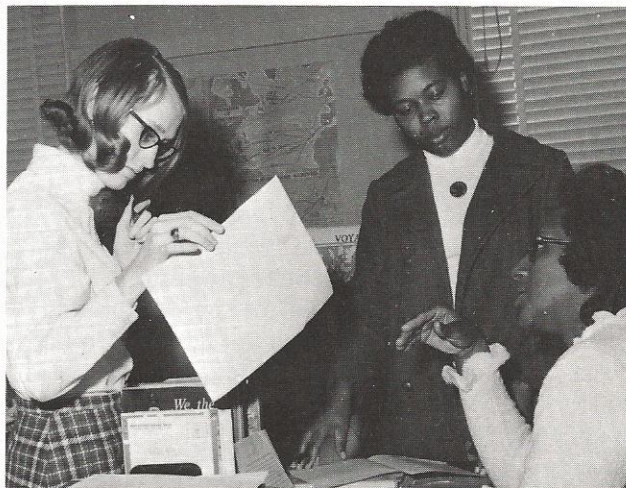
Our newspaper is affiliated with Quill and Scroll and with the South Carolina Scholastic Press Association.

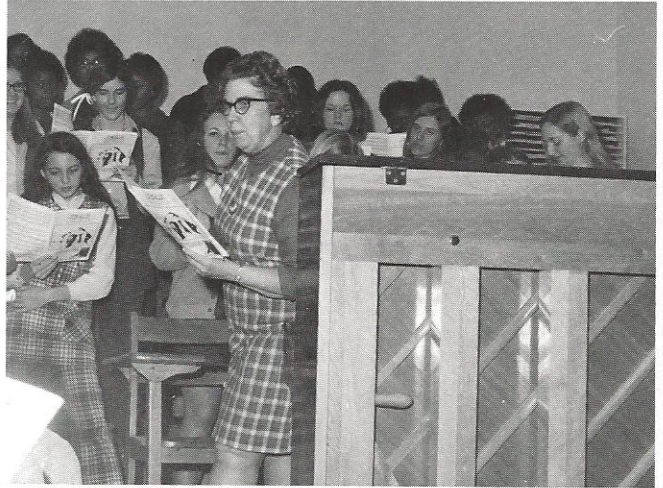
A Hobby, A Talent, A Skill

The highlight of the year for the chorus is its spring concert. This production involves much hard work and many nights of practice. The performance given is always delightful.

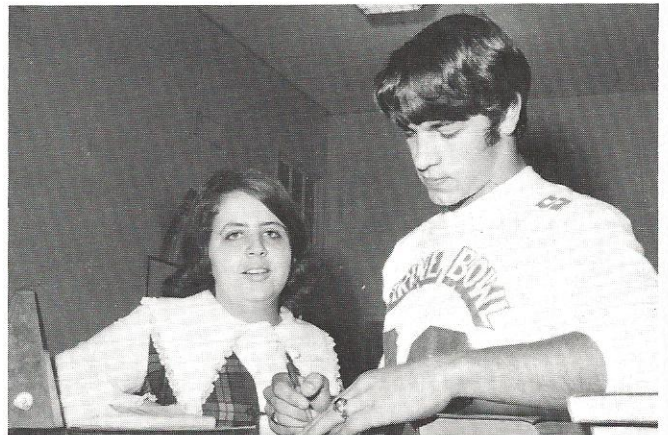

In the spring, the Walterboro High School Concert Band was formed.



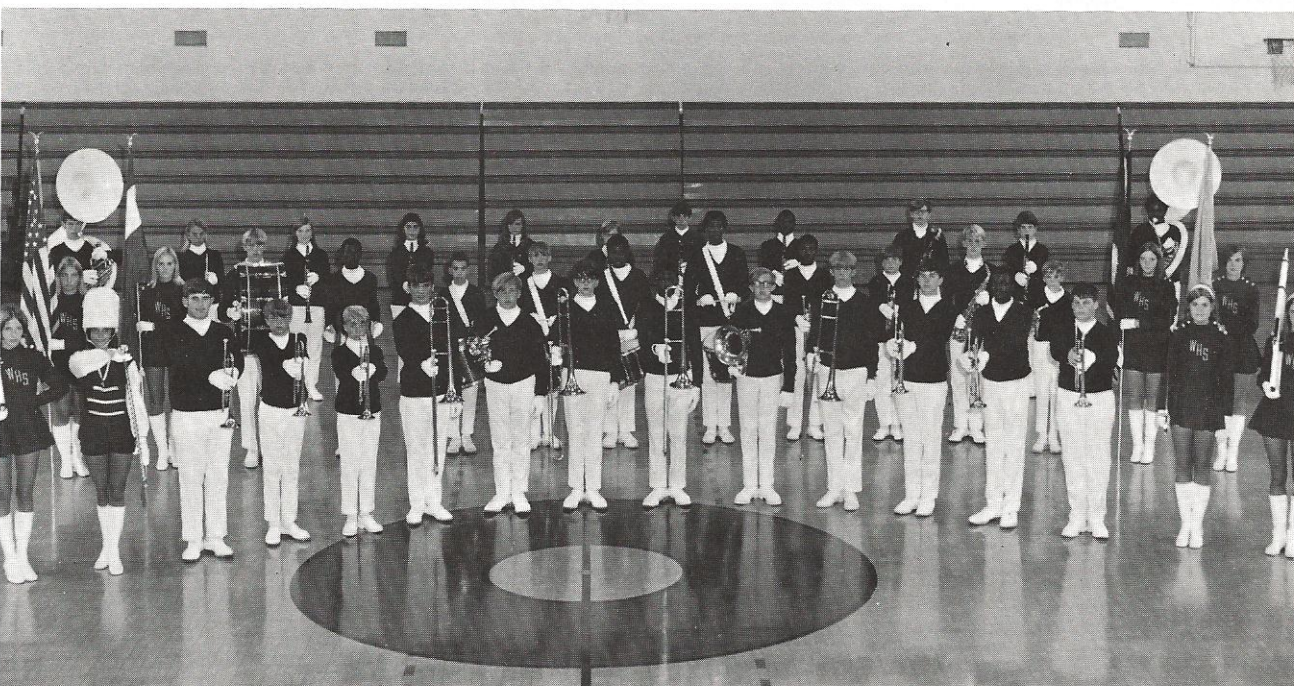

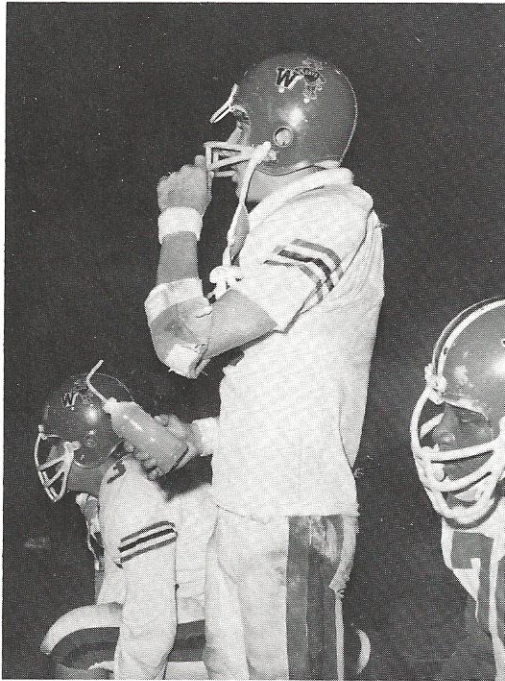
The program is under the supervision of the local school board and the school administration with the help and cooperation of the local merchants.

The activities of the club were: Officers Training at Wade Hampton Hotel; Field Trip to Tri-County Tech.; District Eliminations and State Conferences.

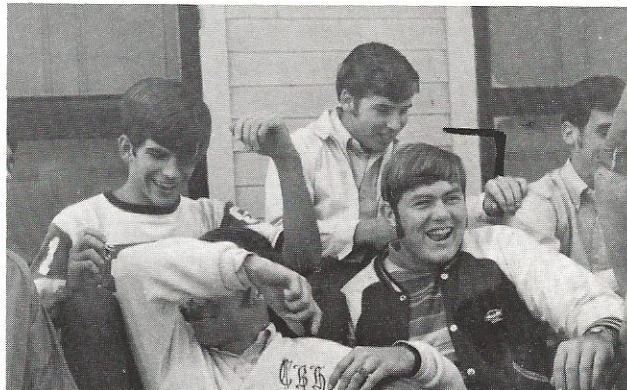

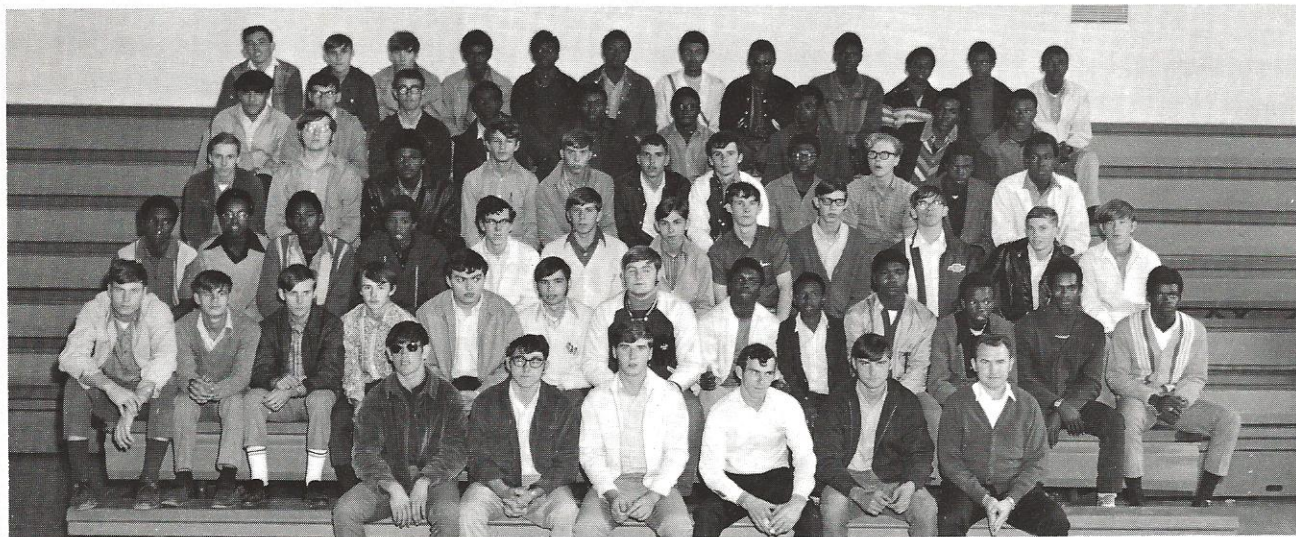
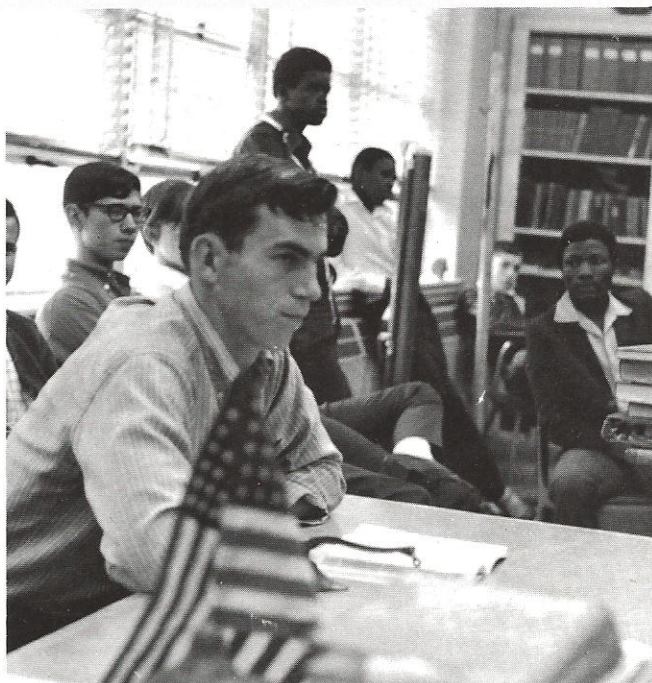

The projects of the Future Farmers of America this year were a calendar sale, a candy sale, and shop projects.

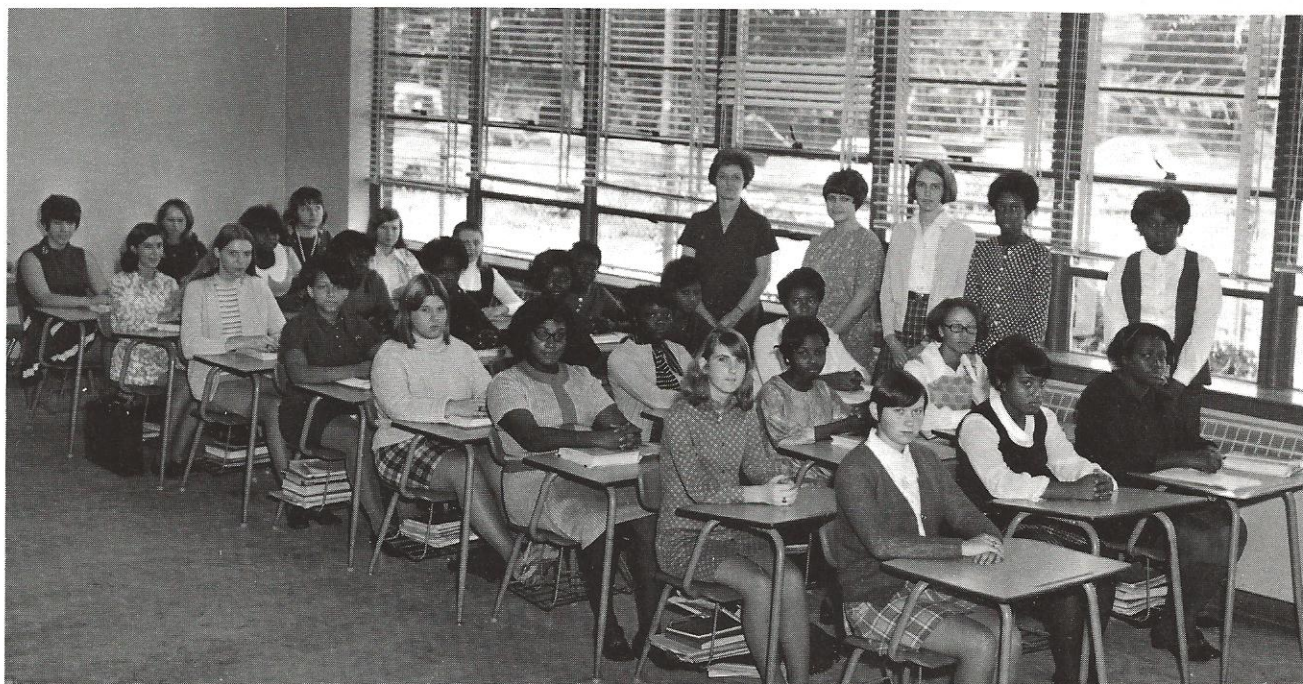

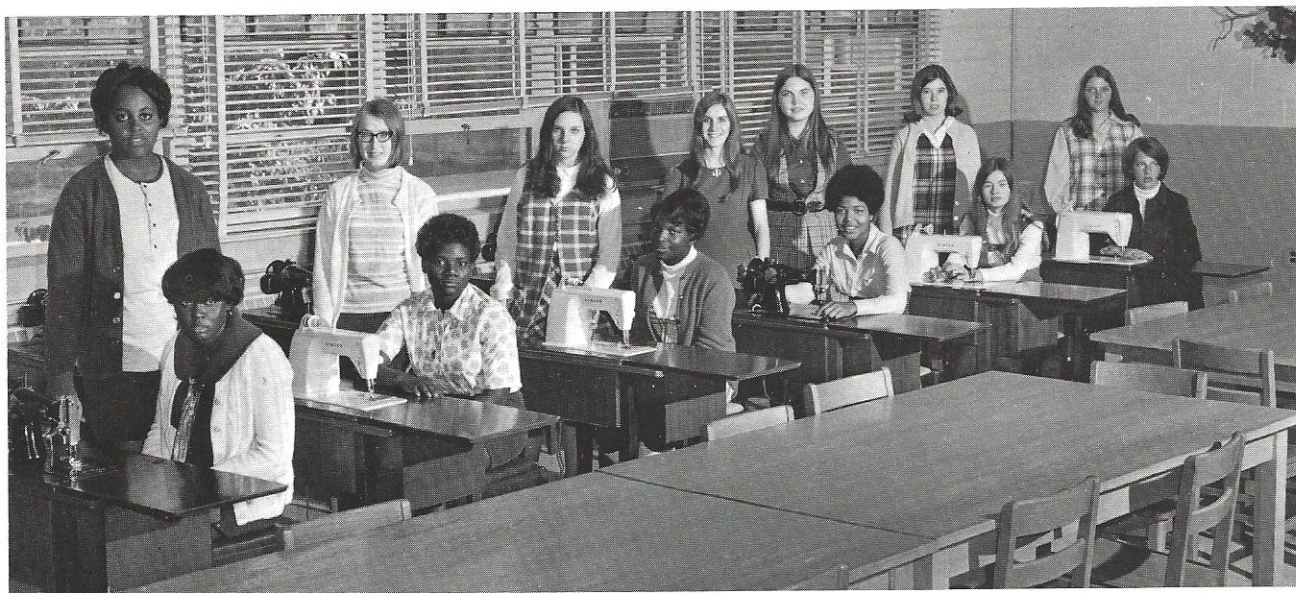
Homemakers in the Making

The officers of this organization attend a leadership workshop that is conducted in the district. One delegate from our school attends the annual FHA Convention that is held in Columbia.



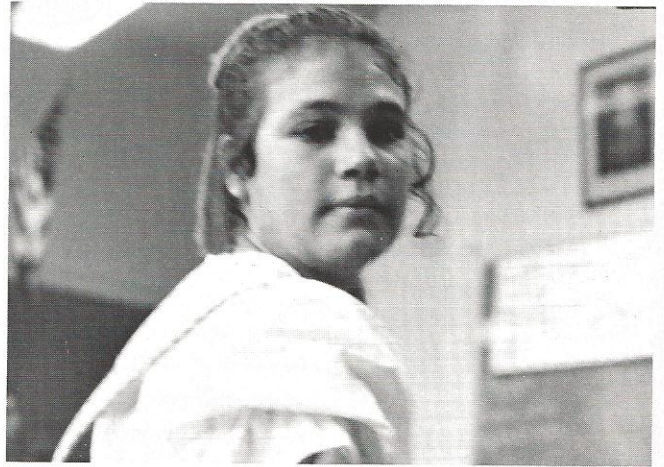
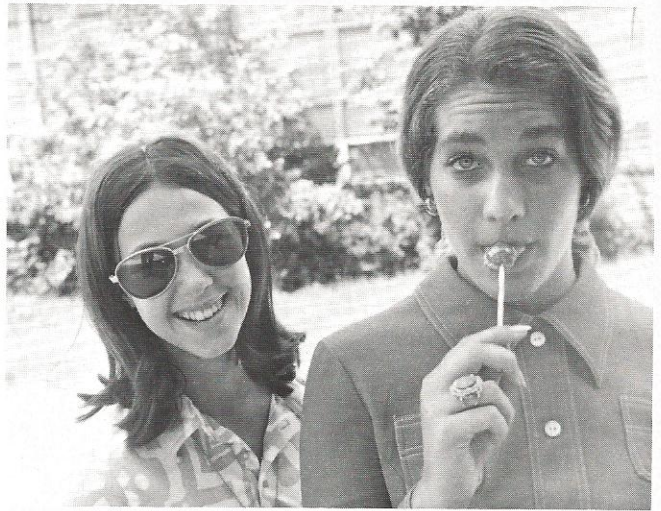

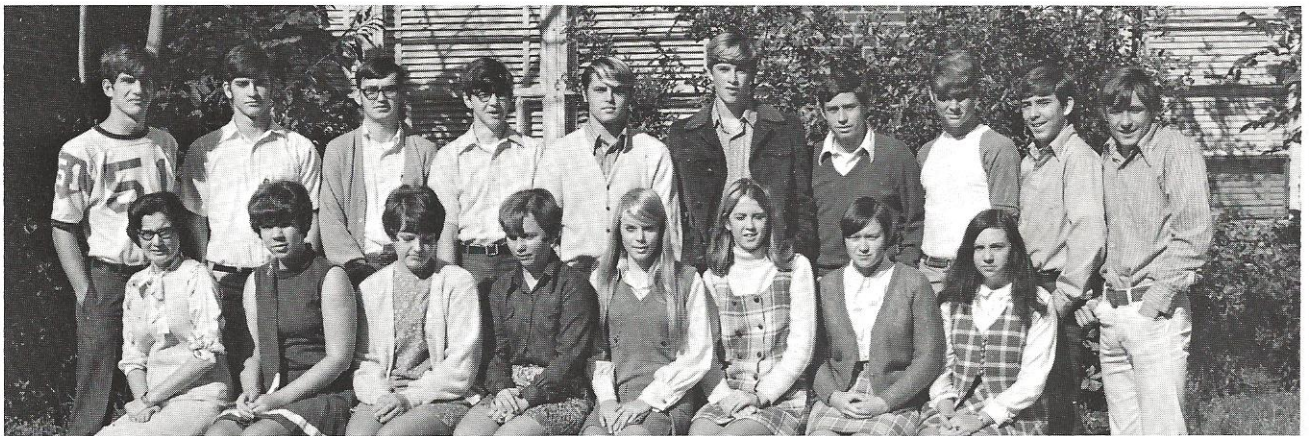
Projection Club Provides Service to School

Members are selected on the basis of mechanical ability and interest and must have an overall average of a 3.



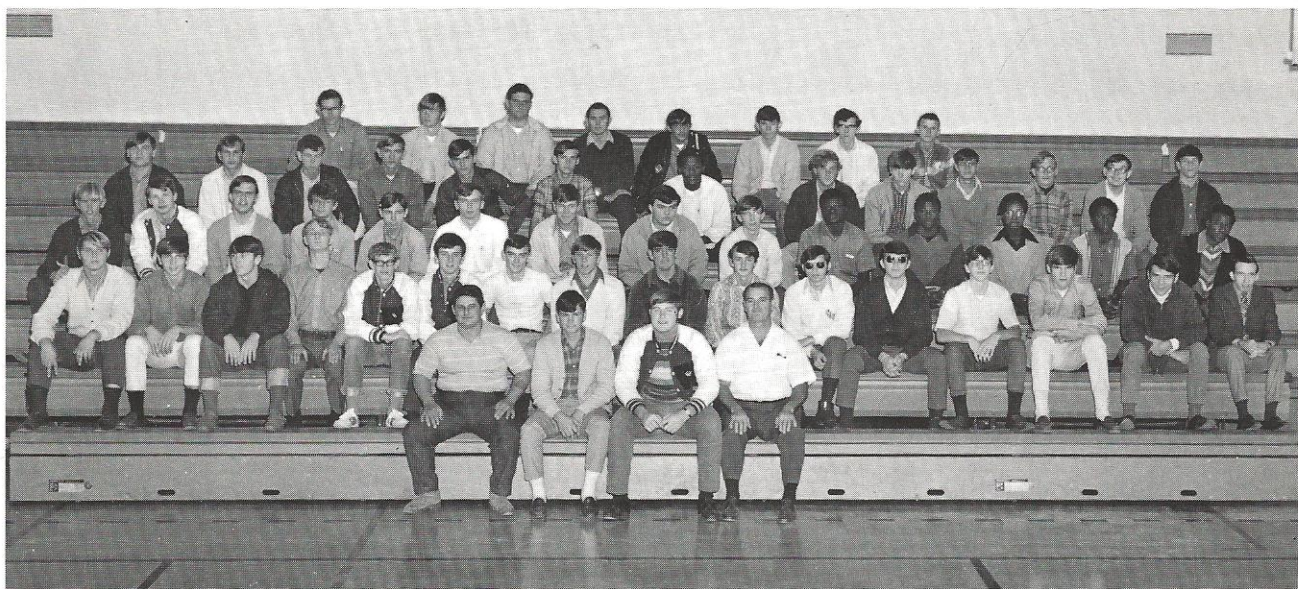
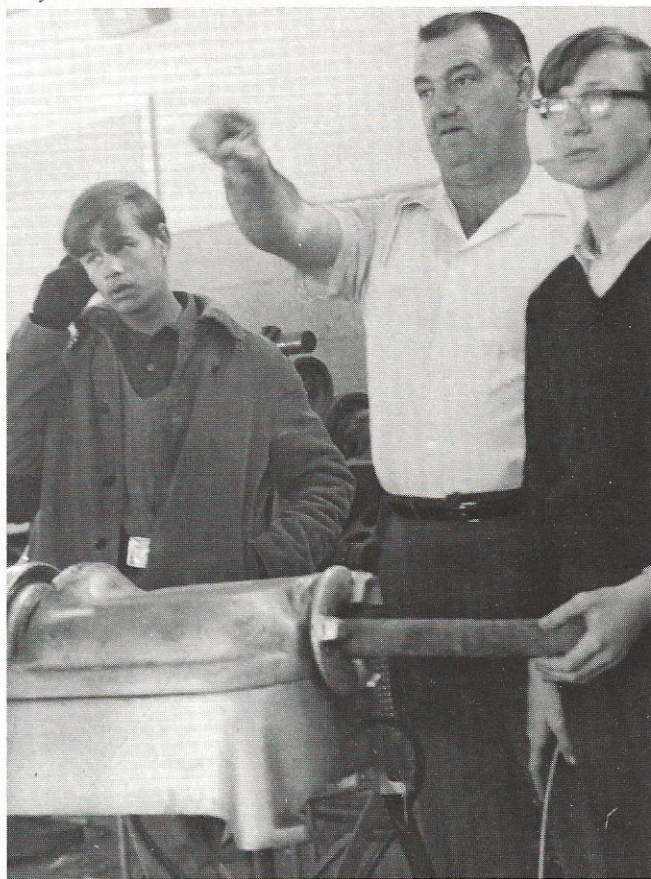

The T & I Club travels to vocational schools and to Charleston. The club also has a money-making and a civic project.

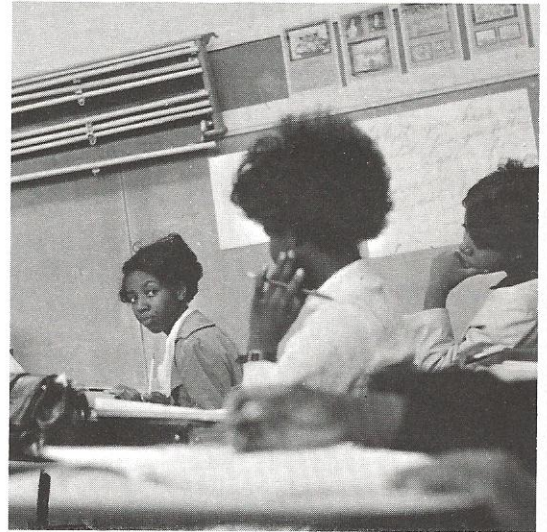
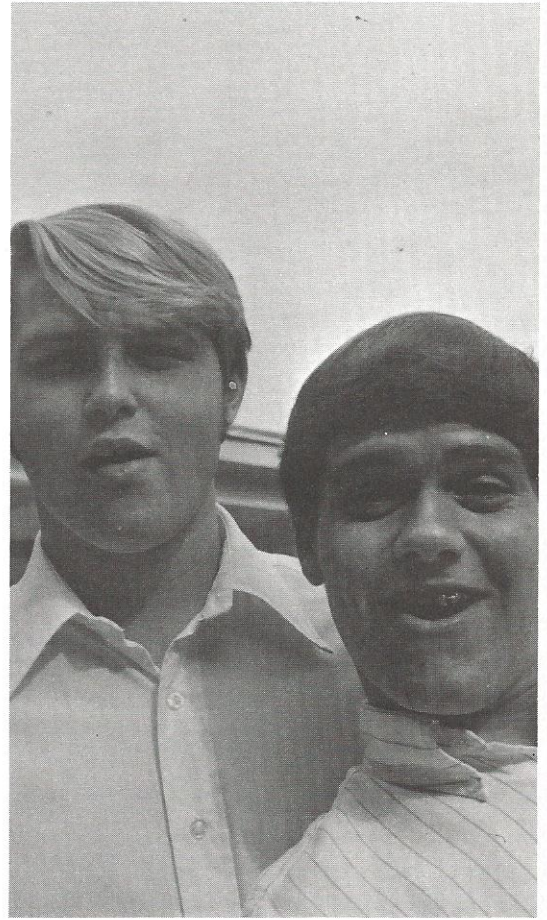


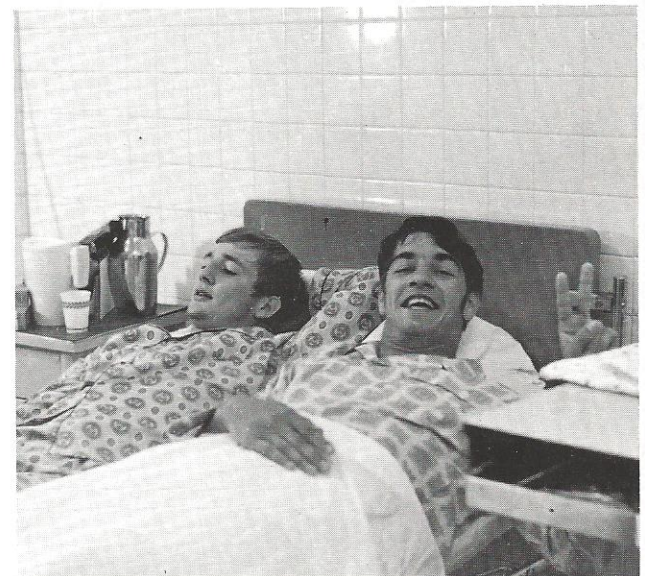
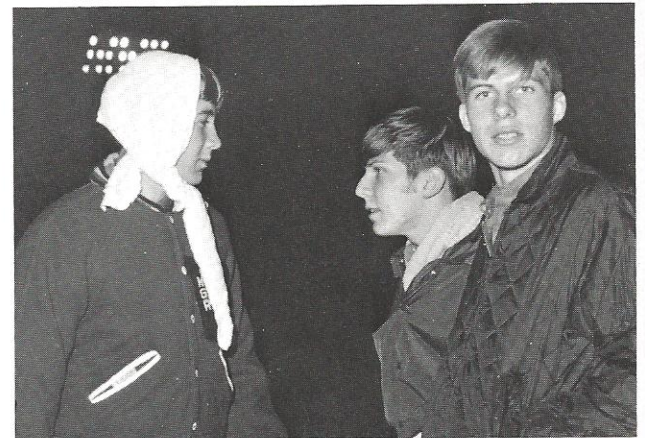
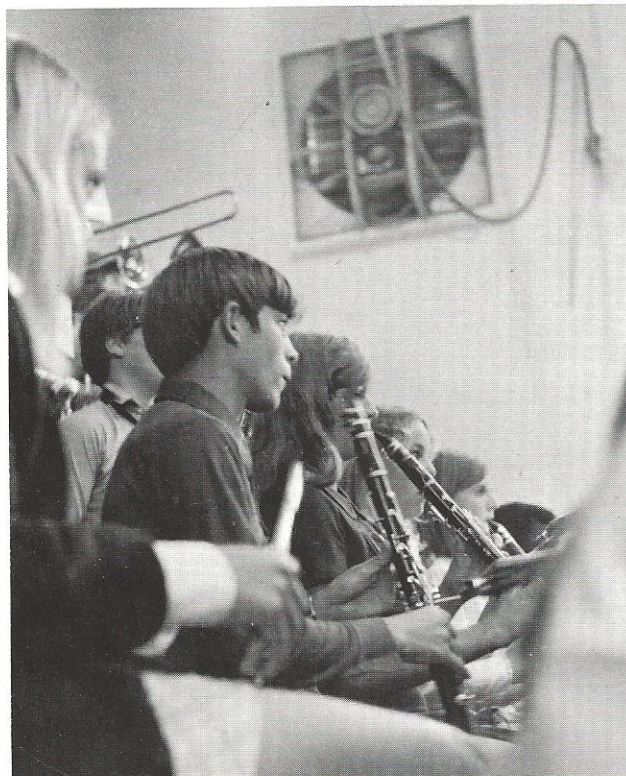
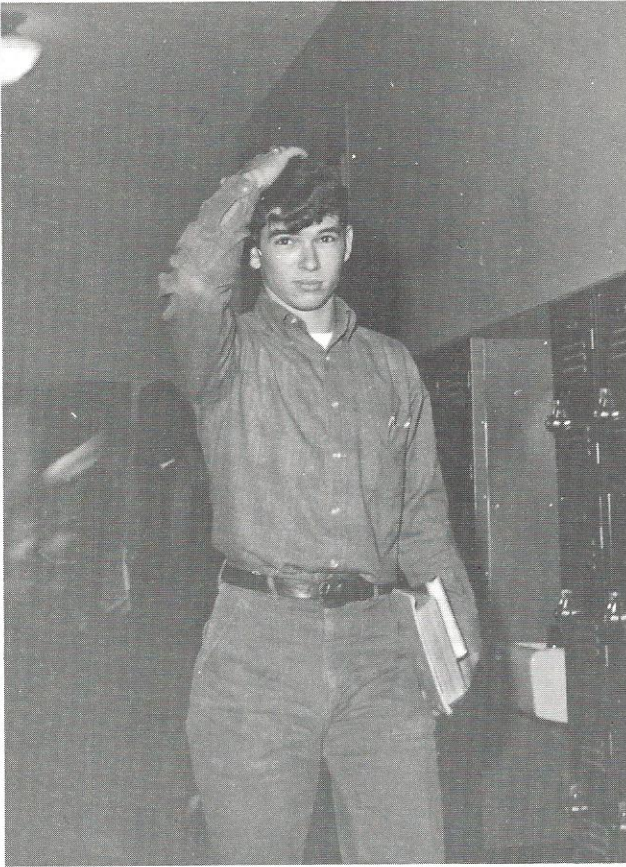

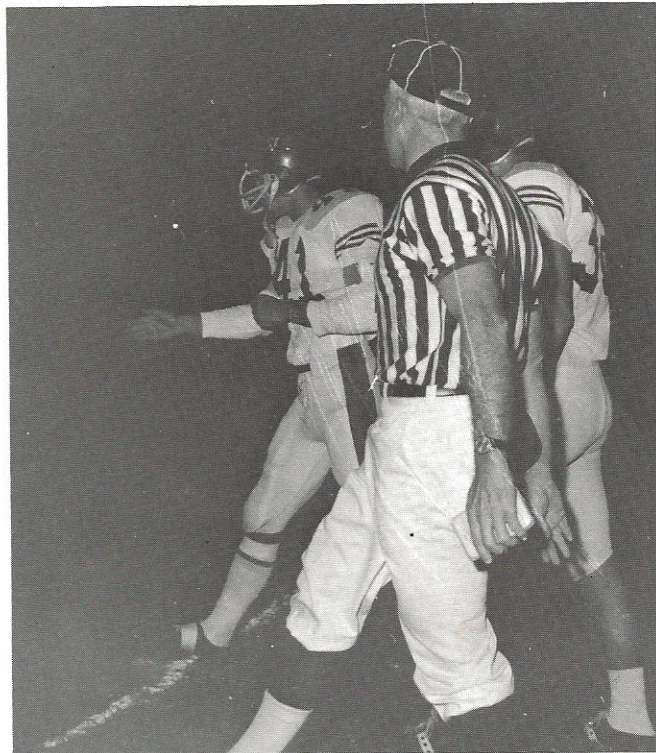


Football
