The Tradition and Culture Live On

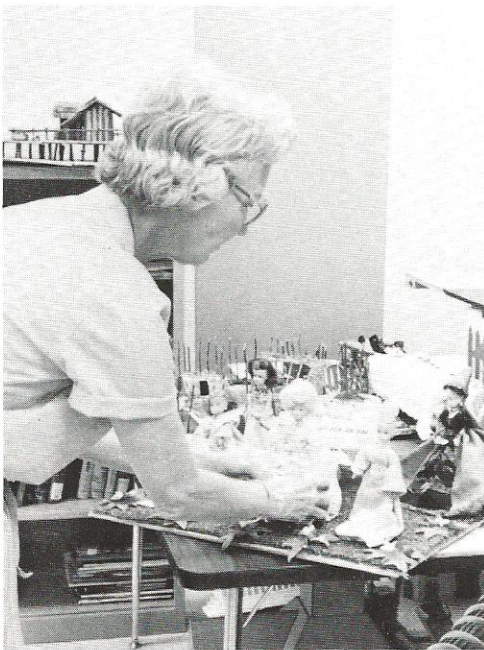
