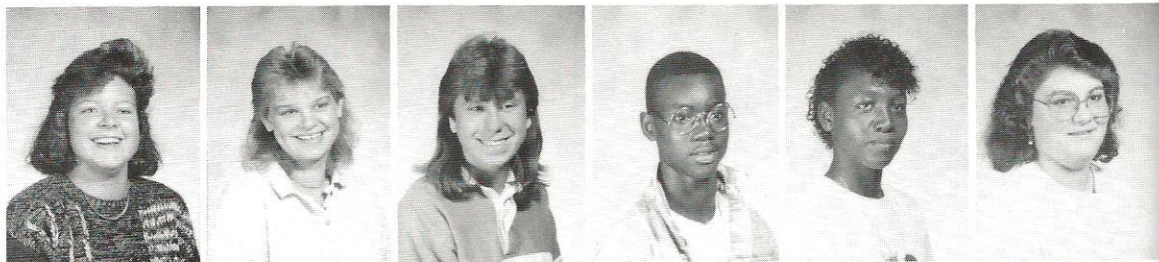


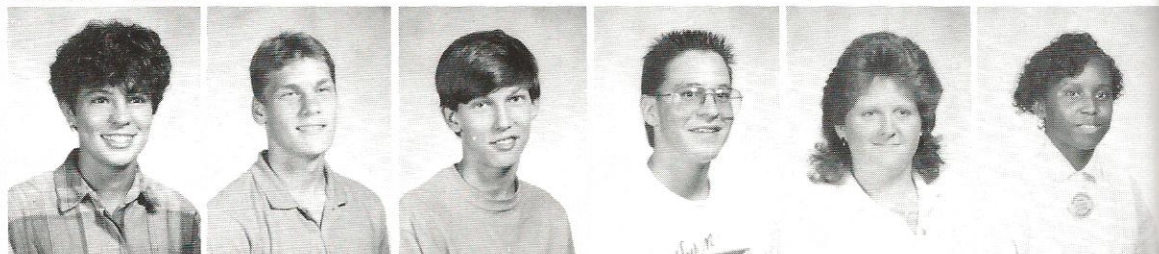

Two of a Kind — Not Always the Same

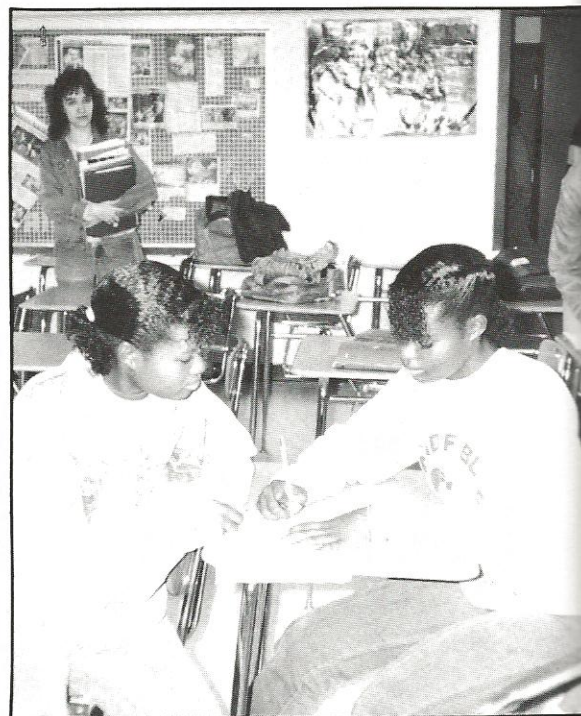
