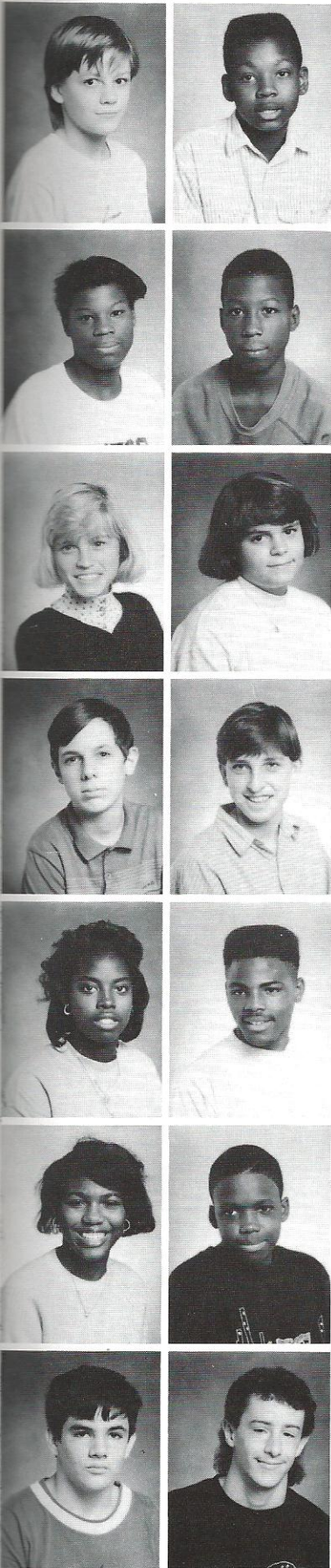


Just Started

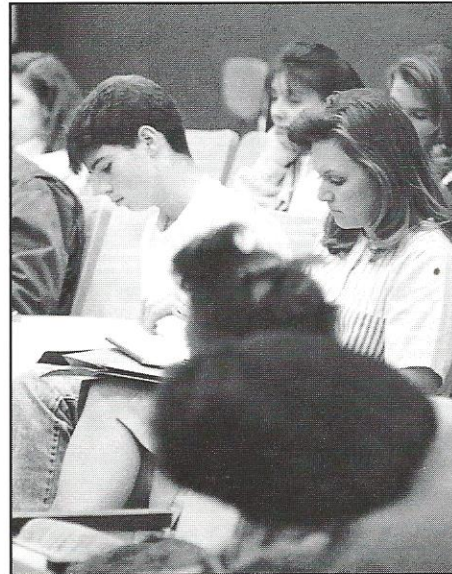
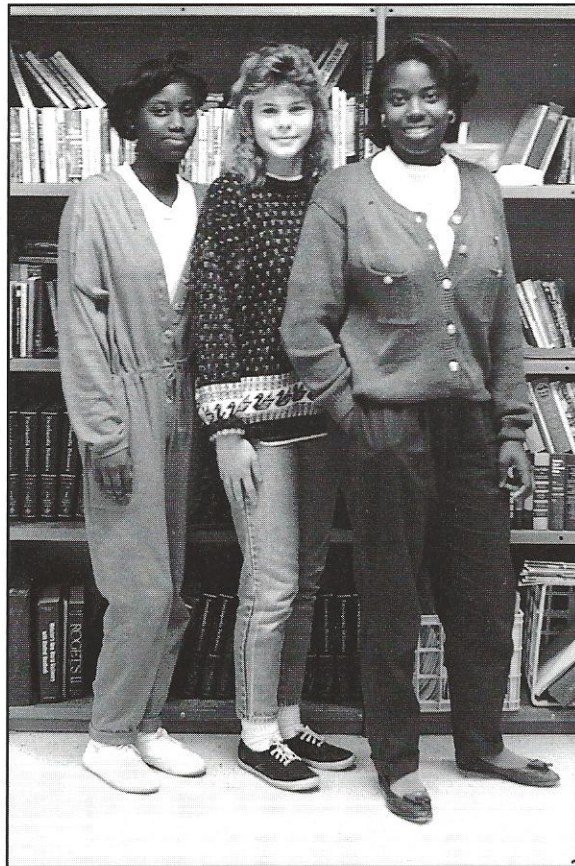
