
New Kids

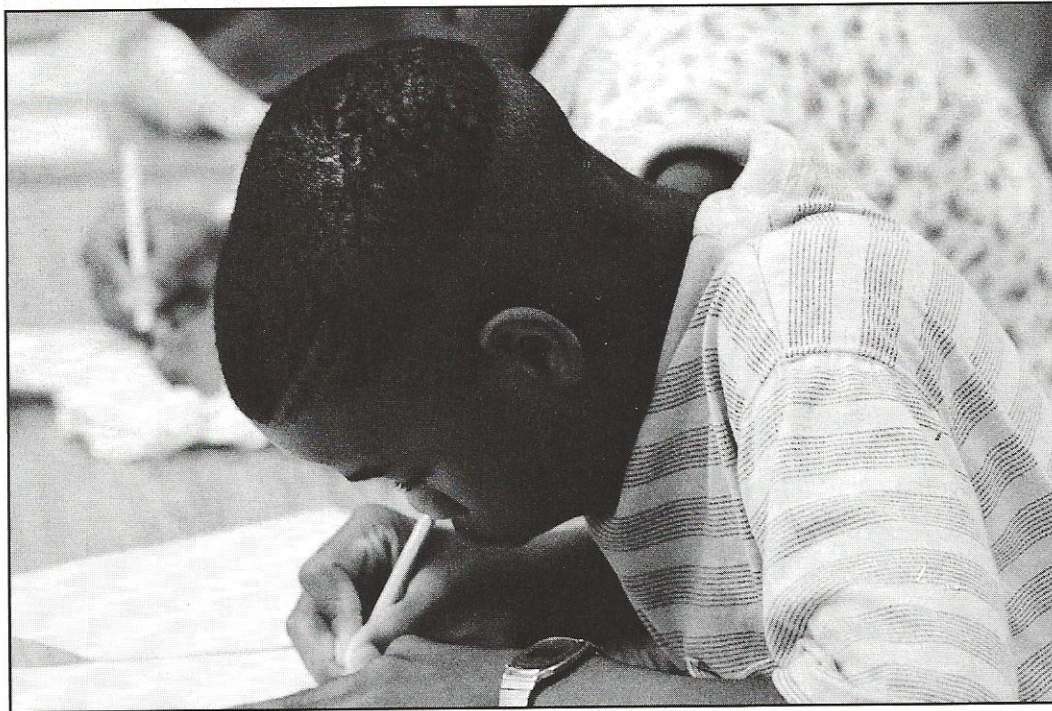
