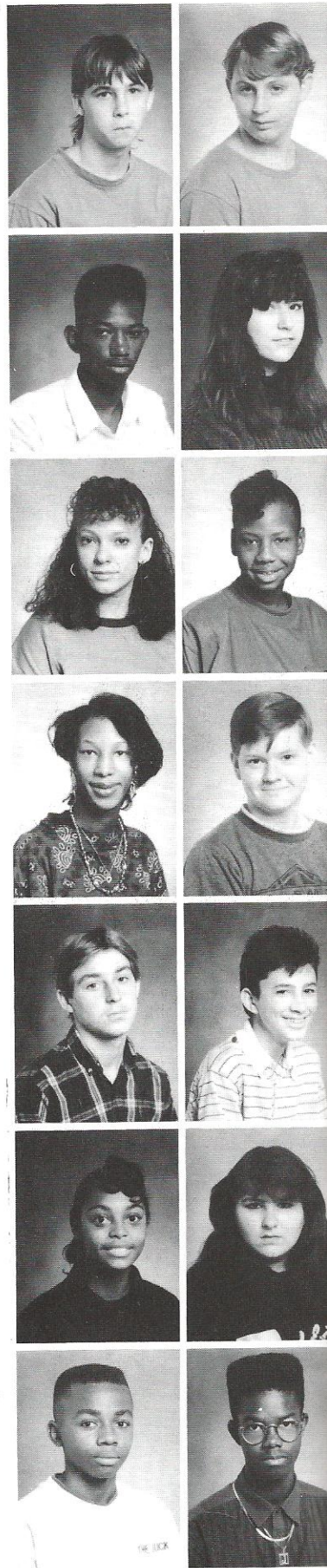


The Walls



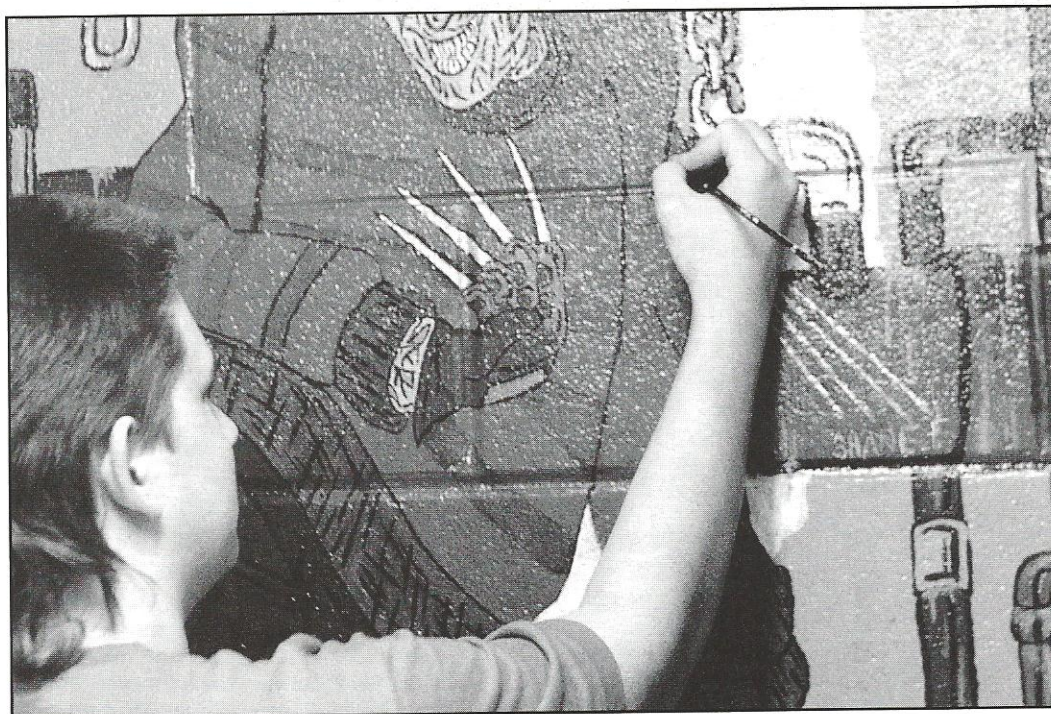
