Having Fun With History

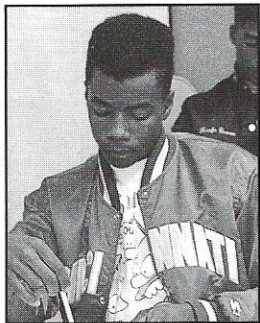
Thirsty for social studies? The history department could quench almost anyone’s thirst for a fresh taste of our country’s heritage.

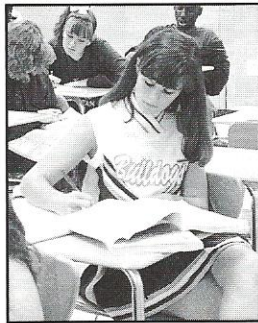
Social sciences have rapidly become a leading interest among students. Therefore, the department stressed thorough teaching in these areas in order to satisfy the needs of the students.
