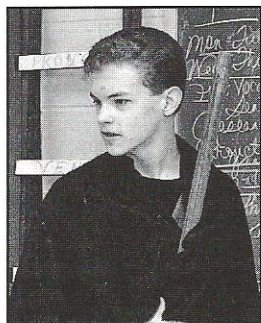

ALL BOOKED UP

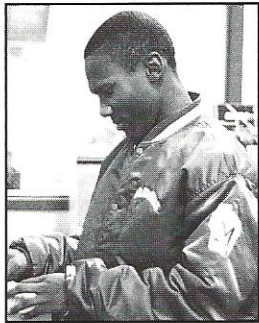
