

# Bulldog Pride

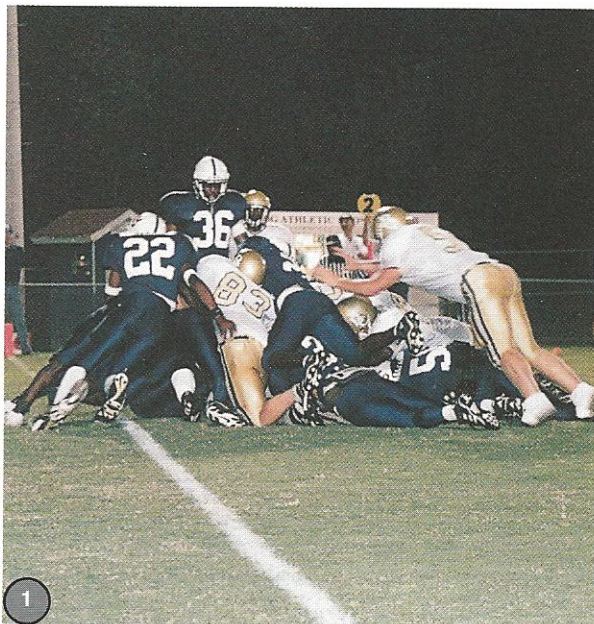
