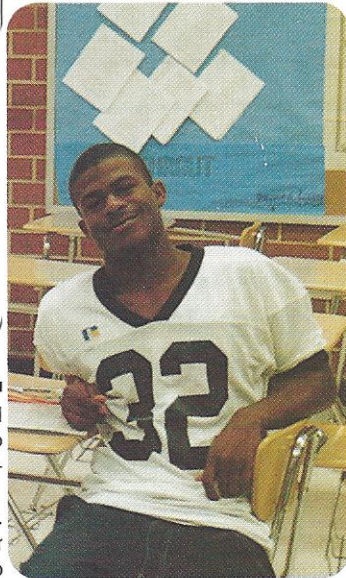


Trendy Styles, Friendly Smiles

The year's fashions extended from Capri pants and tube tops, to dark jeans and sweaters with three-quarter length sleeves for the girls.

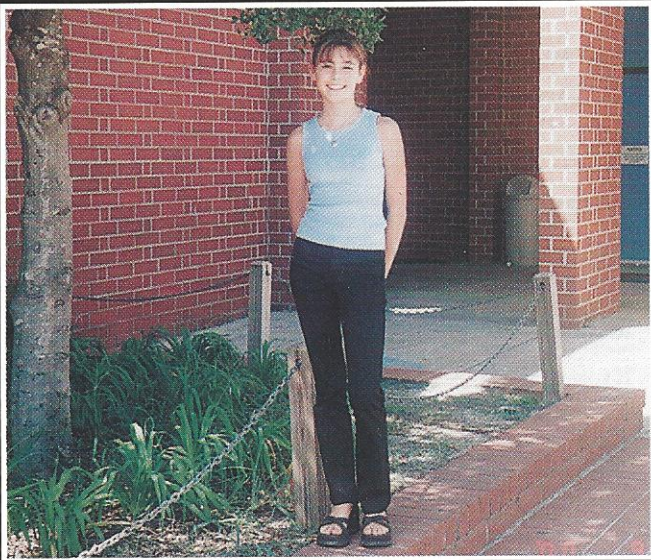
It seemed that tattoos and piercings started to appear
