AS GOOD AS IT GETS

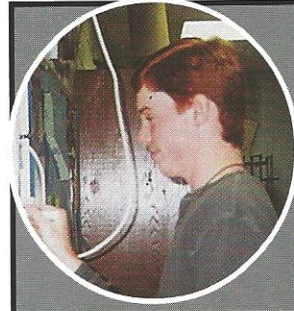

Regardless of the students' preference in cars, they all reflected the various personalities of the drivers.

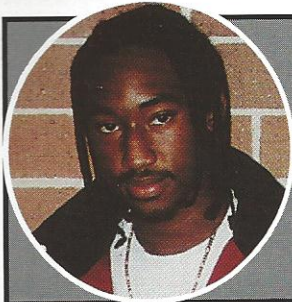
As the 3:07 dismissal bell rang, those who were able to drive made a mad dash to the student parking lot, some proud of their ride, and others not so proud.

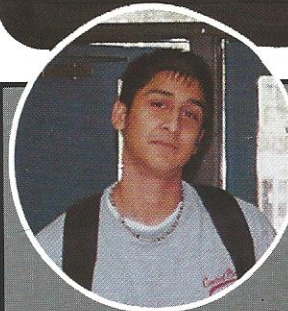


Most Likely To Make it Through The Swamp ...
