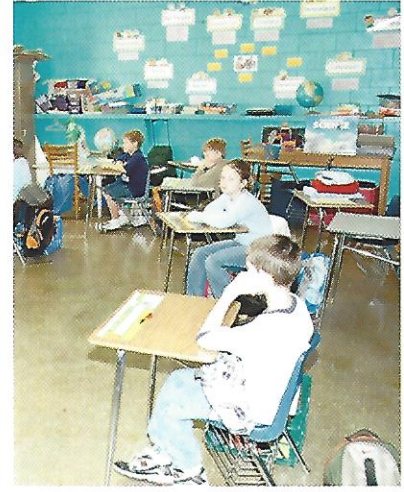




Justin, Kenneth, and Mari listening intently to Mrs. Horton.

"What a challenging class this is," says Mrs. Horton!

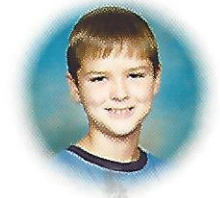
