


THE STUDY OF ENGLISH



English plays an important role in the studies of Bells High School students. Through our English department, students learn correct grammar, enlarge their vocabularies and increase their spelling and writing abilities.






Through the teaching of typing, shorthand, and bookkeeping, students are better prepared for careers in the business world. These subjects could play a major part in the selecting of an occupation.


