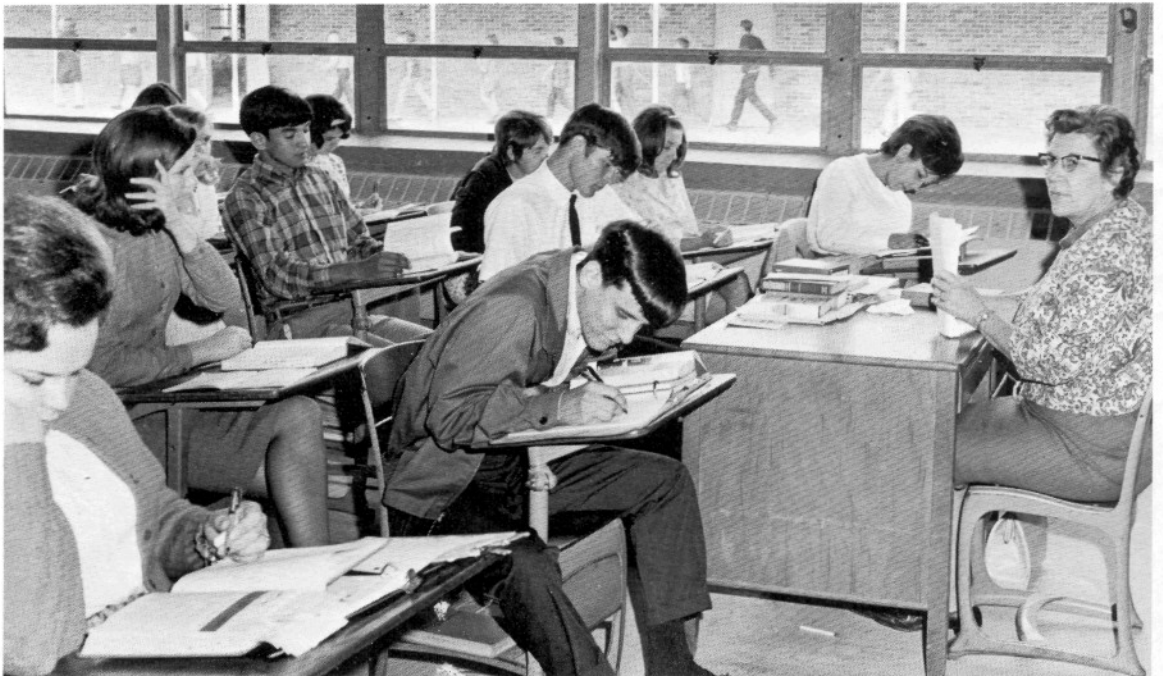
THE STUDY OF ENGLISH

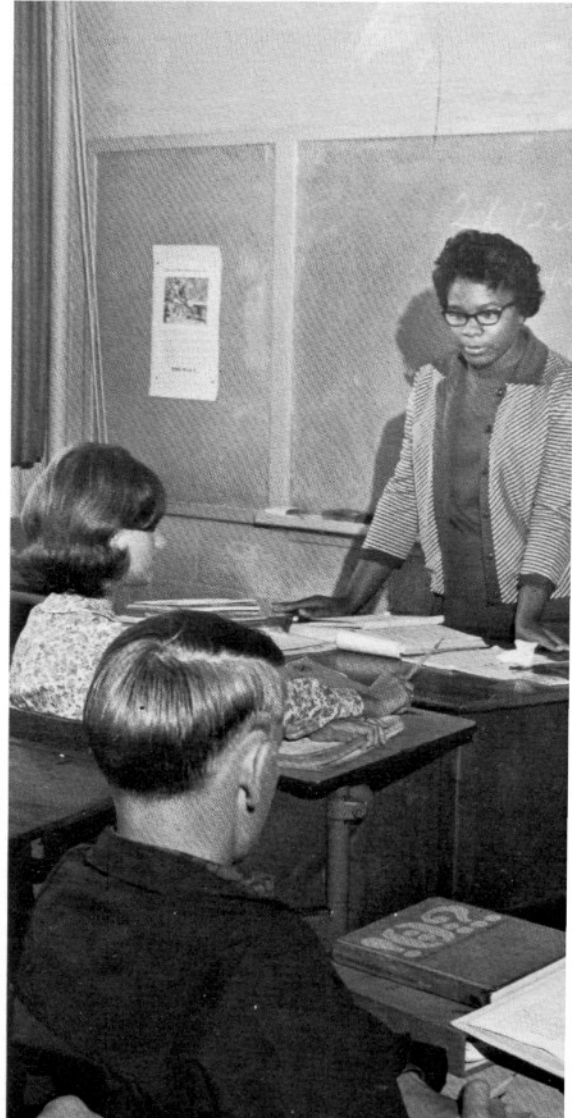

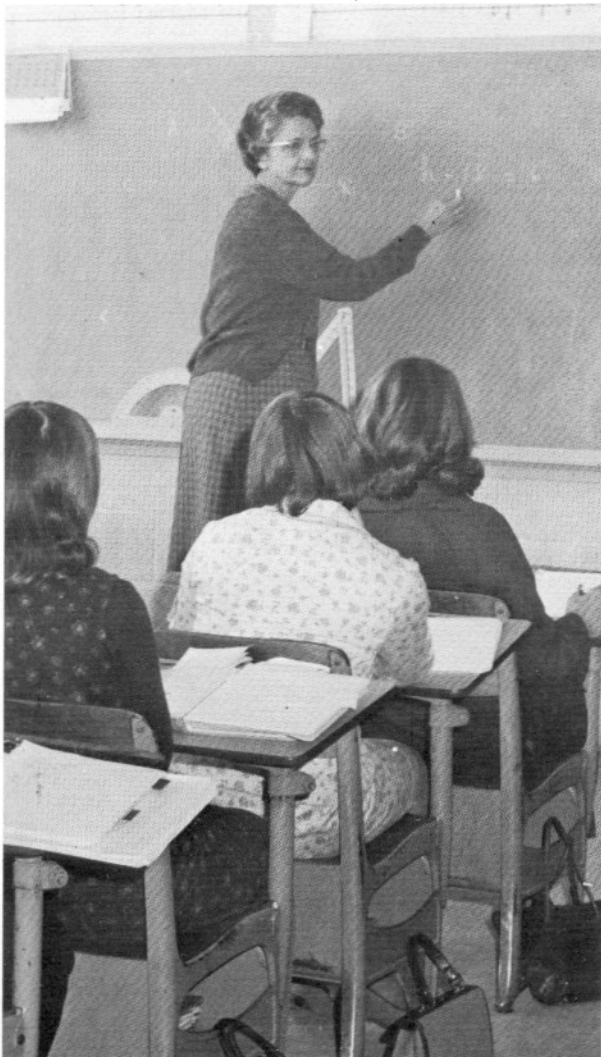

MATH - THE LANGUAGE OF FIGURES

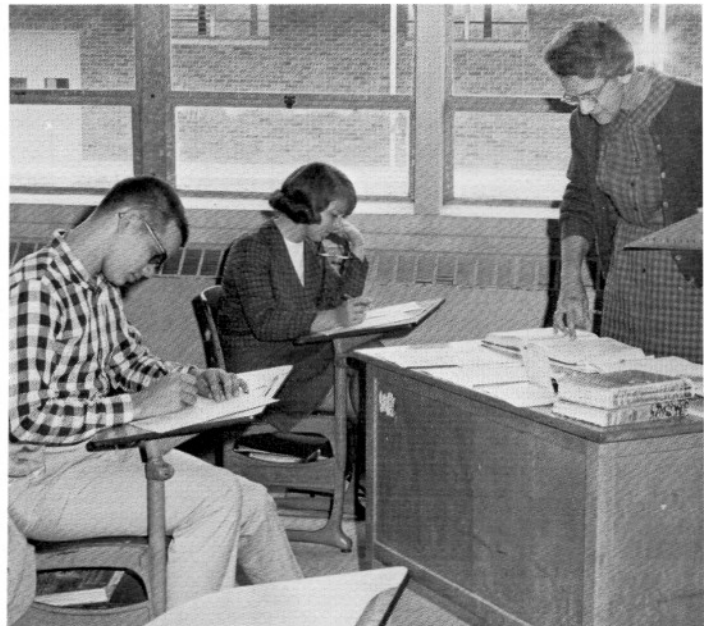

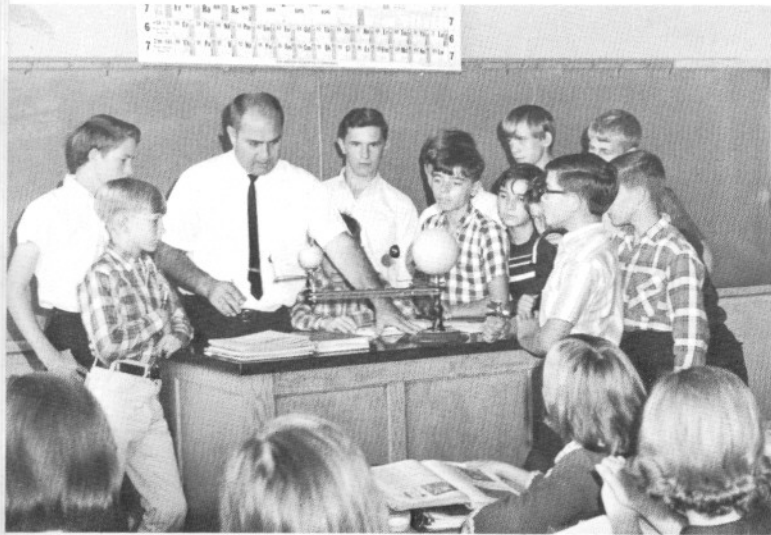

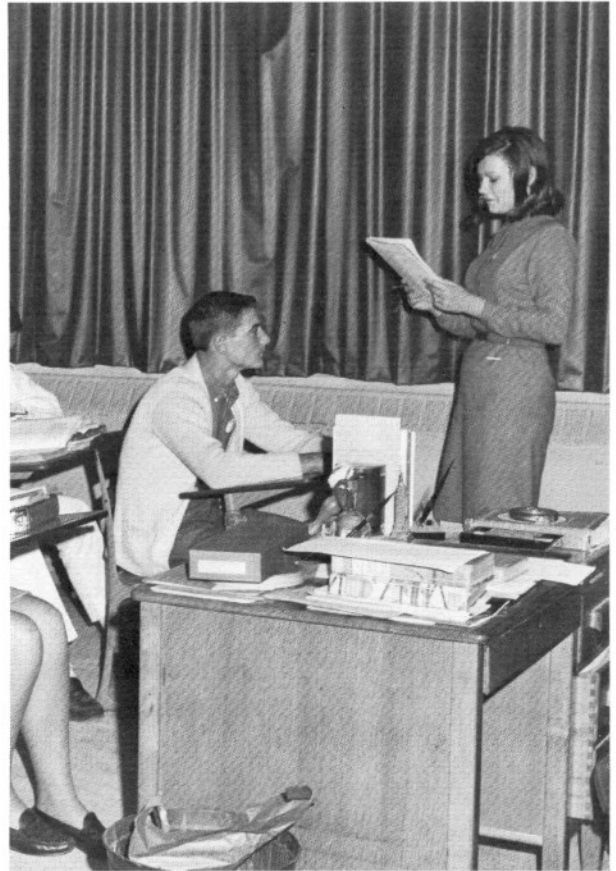
Science is important for offering assistance to those entering college or commercial schools and learning about our environment. At Bells General Science, Advanced Science, Biology, and Physics are taught.

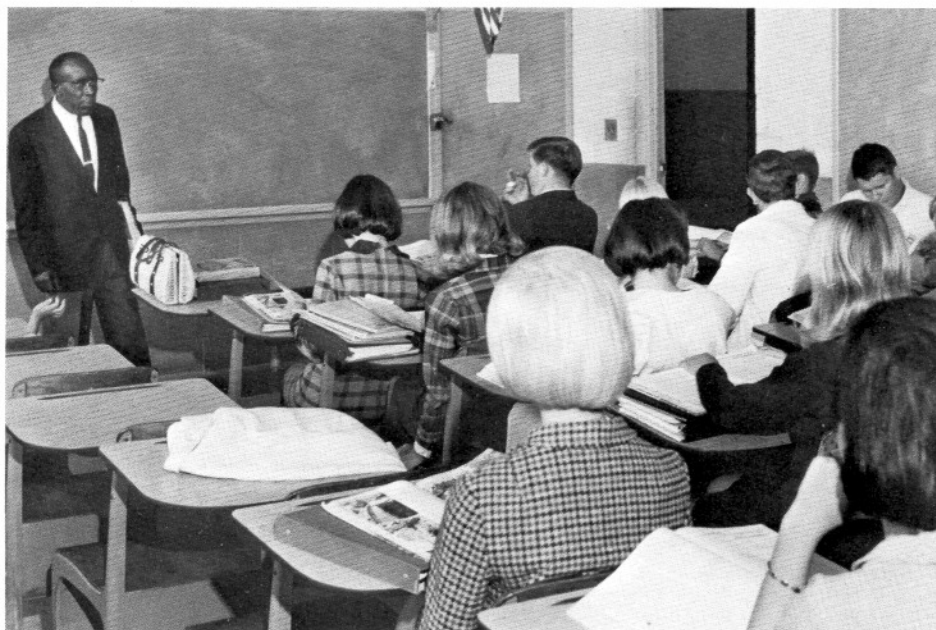

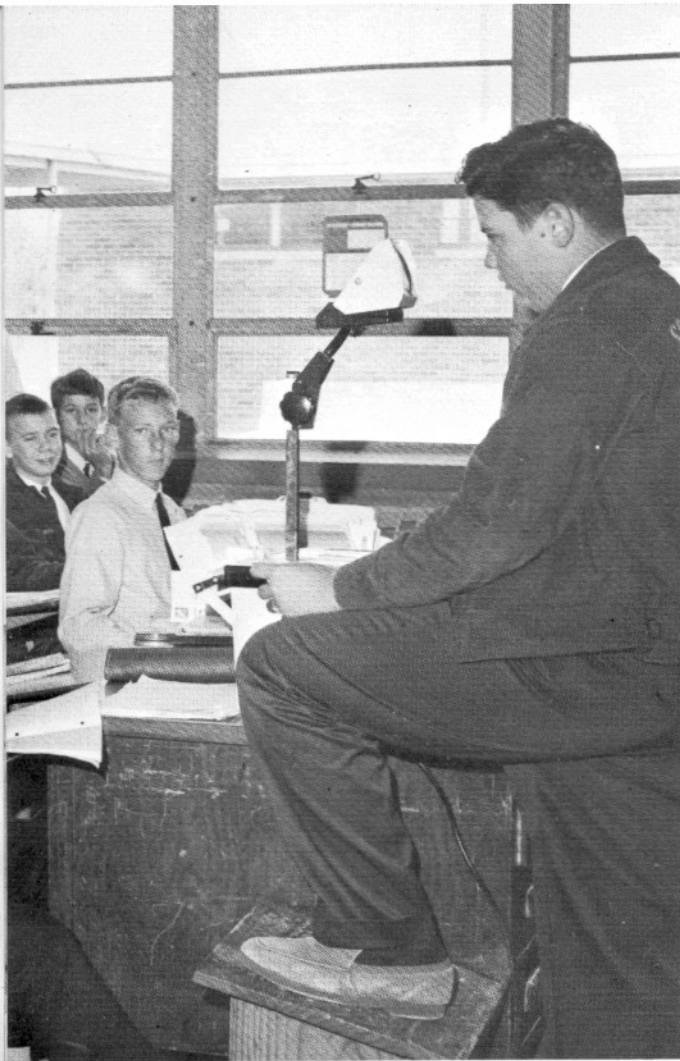

COMMERCE

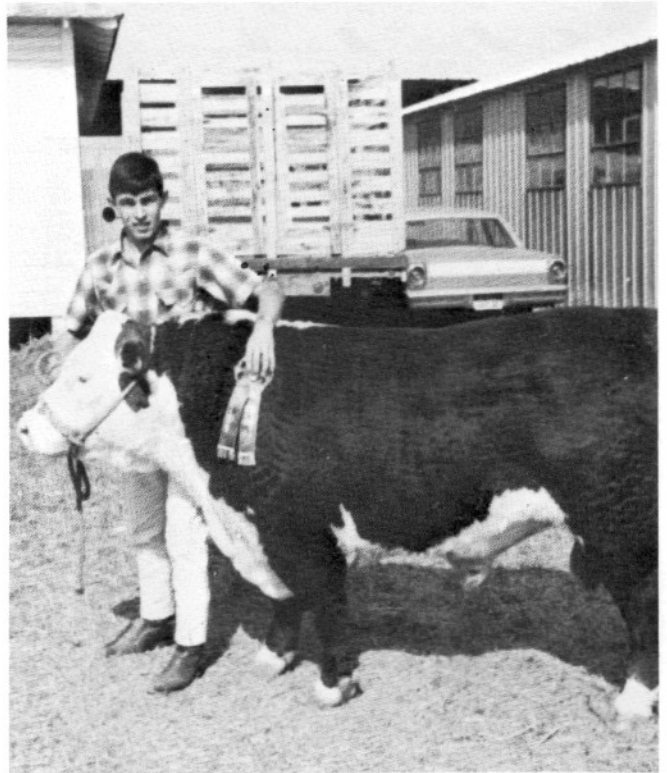
Through the teaching of typing, shorthand, and bookkeeping, students are better prepared for careers in the business world. These subjects could play a major part in the selecting of an occupation.

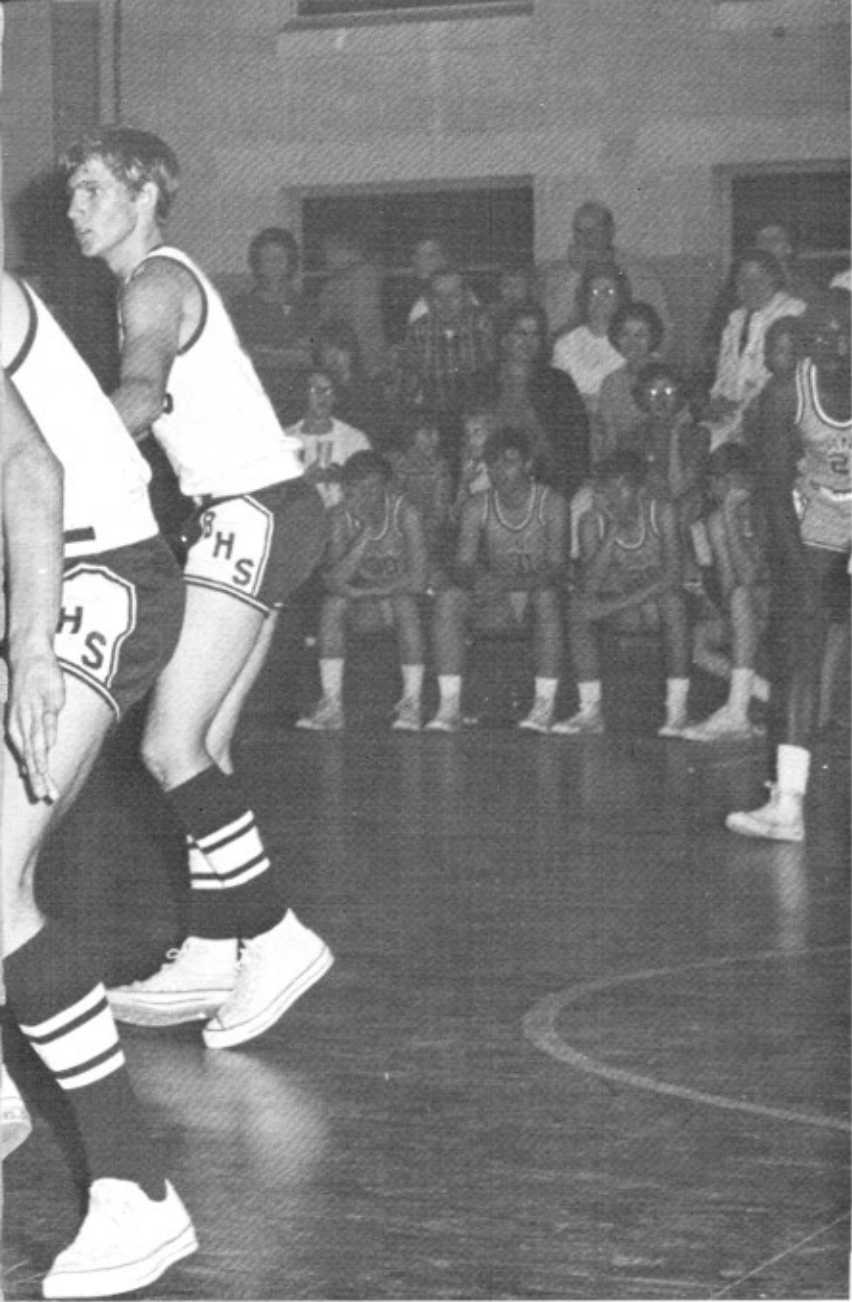

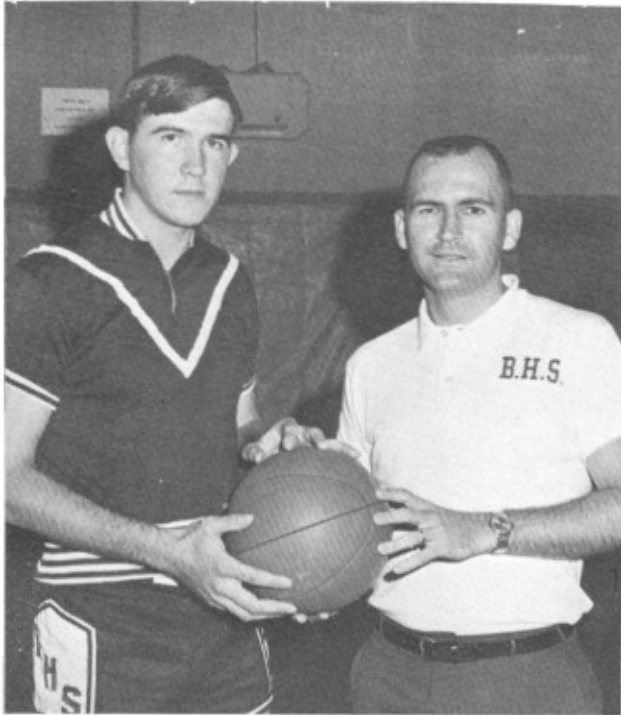

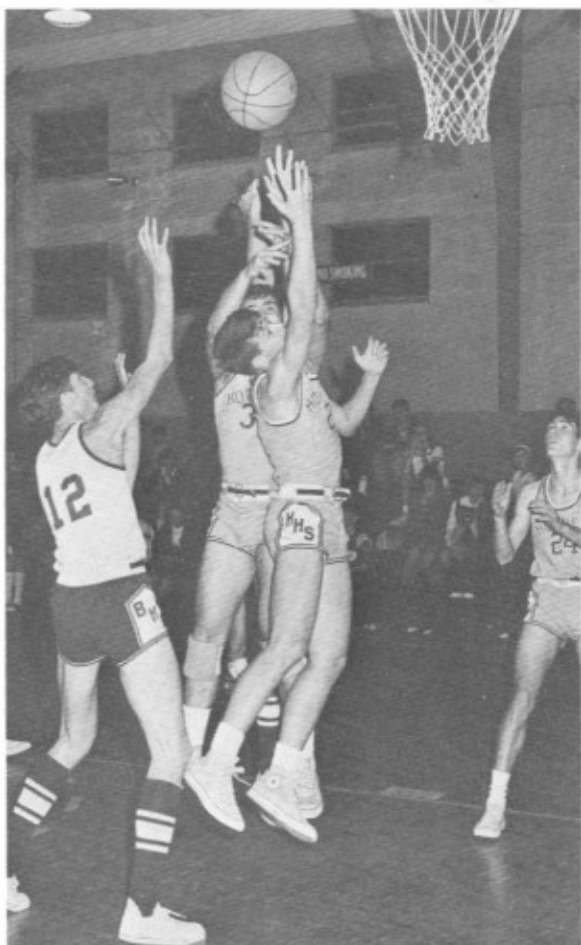

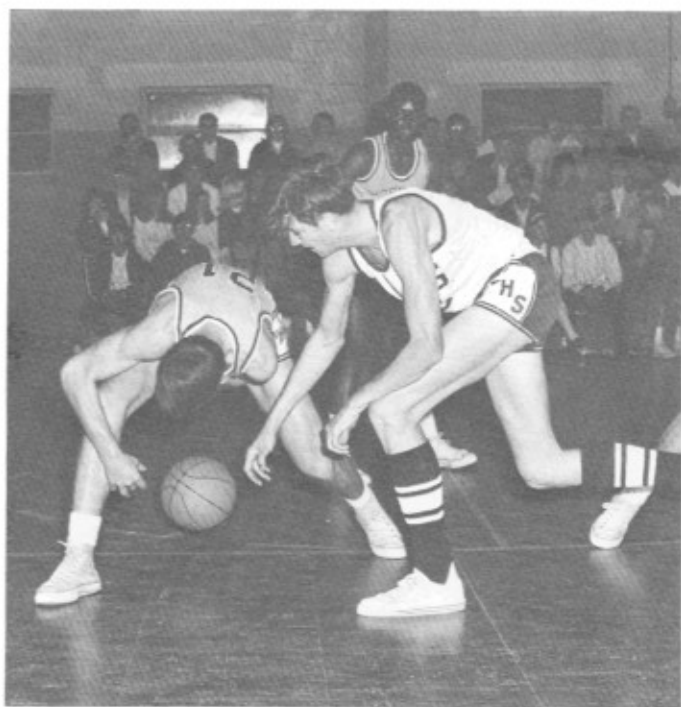

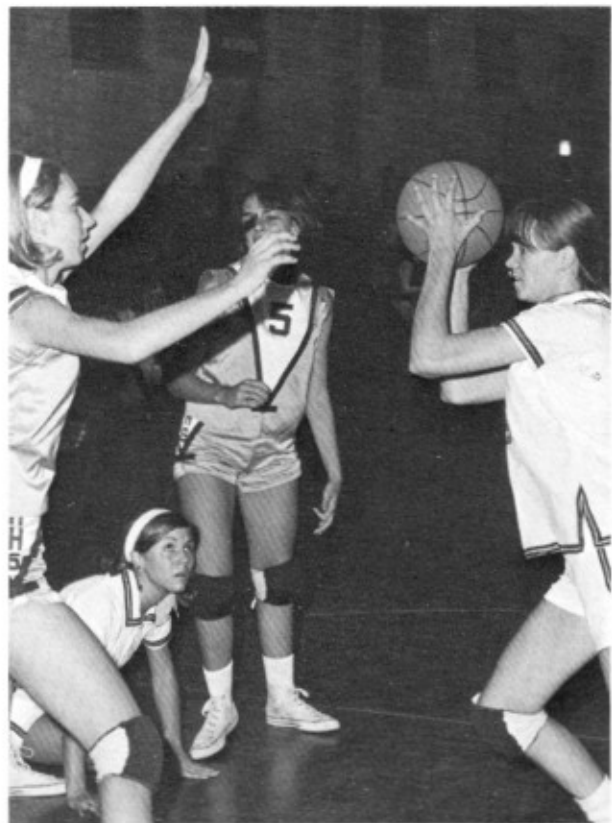

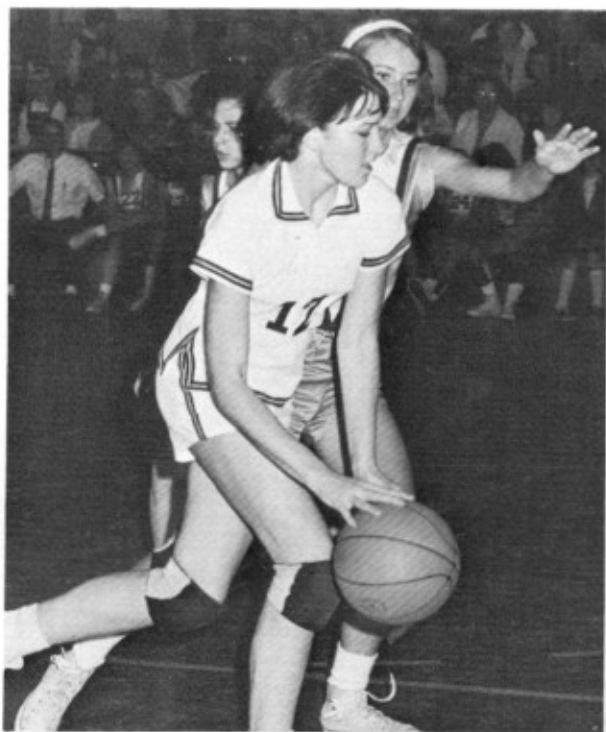
