

HISTORY

CALVARY CHRISTIAN SCHOOL WAS FOUNDED SEPTEMBER, 1968, IN WALTERBORO, SOUTH CAROLINA. THE INSTITUTION WAS ORIGINATED FROM THE FOUNDER'S BELIEF THAT THERE WAS CONSIDERABLE NEED FOR A SCHOOL DESIGNED TO PREPARE OUR YOUTH WITH CHRISTIAN LEADERSHIP. THE CURRICULUM WAS BASED UPON THE BEST IN ACADEMIC INSTRUCTION WITH A STRONG CHRISTIAN EMPHASIS. DISCIPLINE, SELF-CONTROL AND INDIVIDUAL RESPONSIBILITY ARE WOVEN INTO EVERY PHASE OF THE PROGRAM.

THE FIRST CLASS, CONSISTING OF A FOUR AND FIVE YEAR OLD KINDERGARTEN, WAS HELD IN THE EDUCATIONAL BUILDING OF CALVARY BAPTIST CHURCH. FROM THIS CLASS WERE GRADUATED TEN STUDENTS.

IN 1969-1970 CLASSES WERE MOVED INTO THE FORMER PARSONAGE, WHICH INCLUDED THE TINY THINKERS, FOUR YEAR OLD KINDERGARTEN, AND FIVE YEAR OLD PRIMER.

GROUND BREAKING CEREMONIES WERE HELD MARCH 29, 1969, FOR THE FUTURE HOME OF CALVARY CHRISTIAN SCHOOL. THIS BUILDING WAS COMPLETED AND ITS FACILITIES BECAME SERVICEABLE IN 1970.

CALVARY CHRISTIAN SCHOOL RECEIVED ITS FIRST ACCREDITATION JUNE, 1972, BY THE SOUTH CAROLINA ASSOCIATION OF CHRISTIAN SCHOOLS. THE SECOND ACCREDITATION WAS RECEIVED JUNE, 1975, BY THE AMERICAN ASSOCIATION OF CHRISTIAN SCHOOLS.
