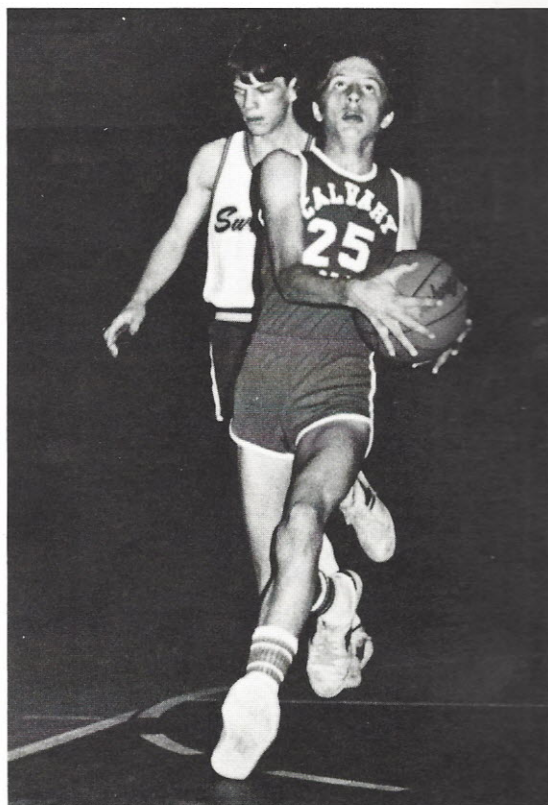






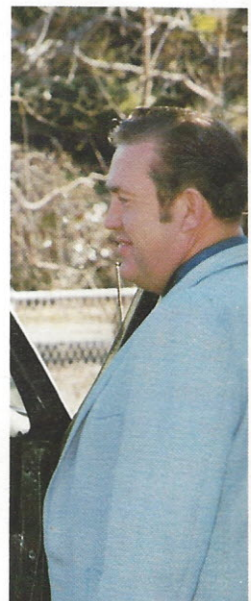

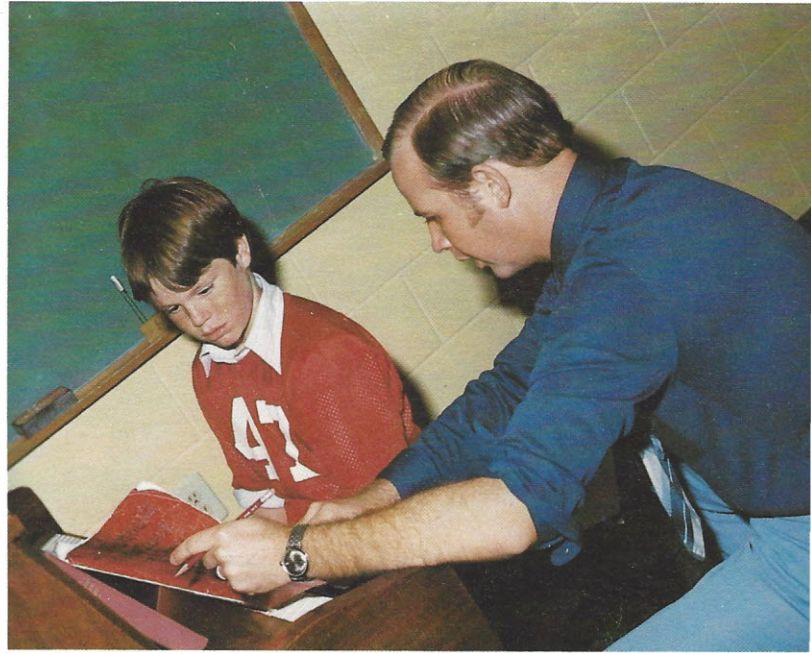

faith by the act of baptism (immersion in water) setting forth the Lord's death, burial and resurrection.

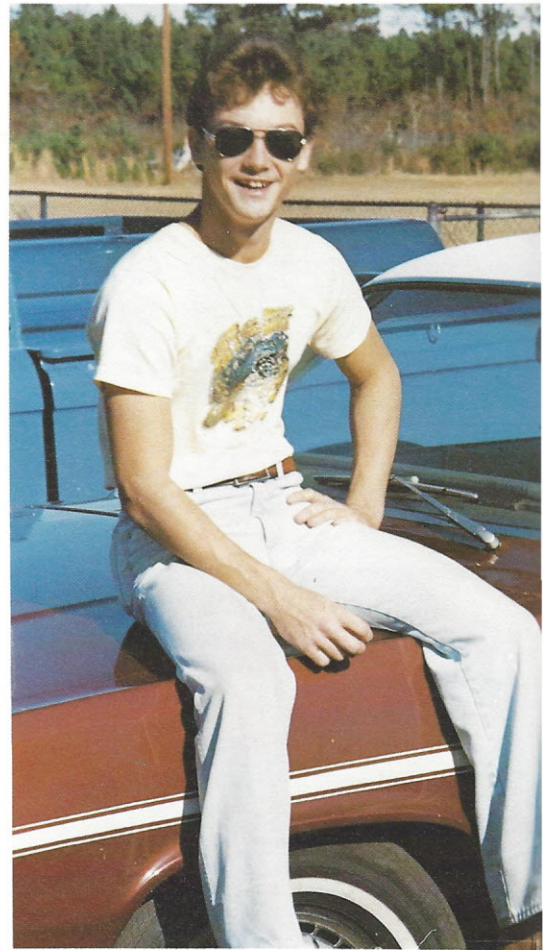
9. We believe that the church is a body of baptized believers whose only mission is not to "reform the World," but to preach and teach the Gospel of salvation to the individual soul.

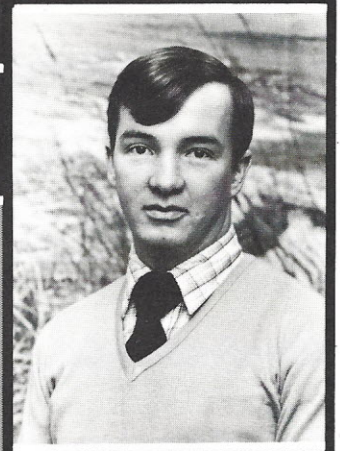

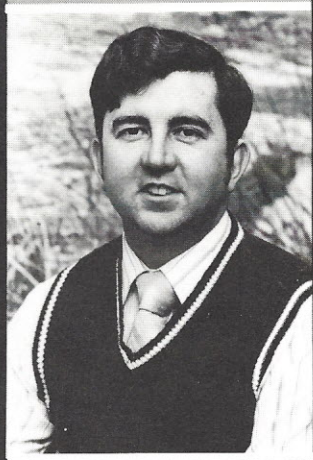

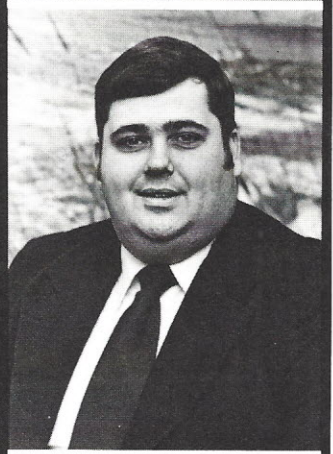

## Principal's Message

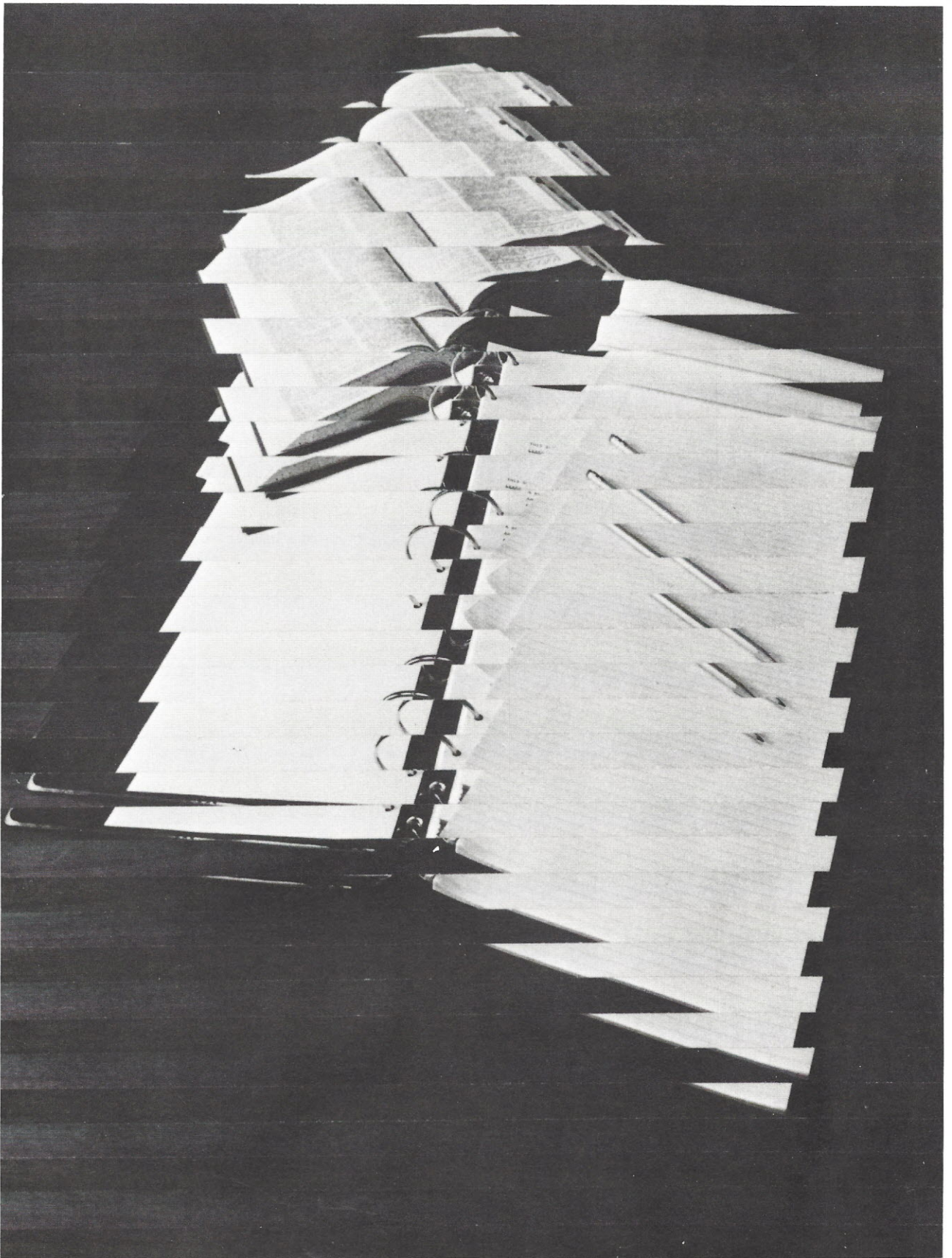

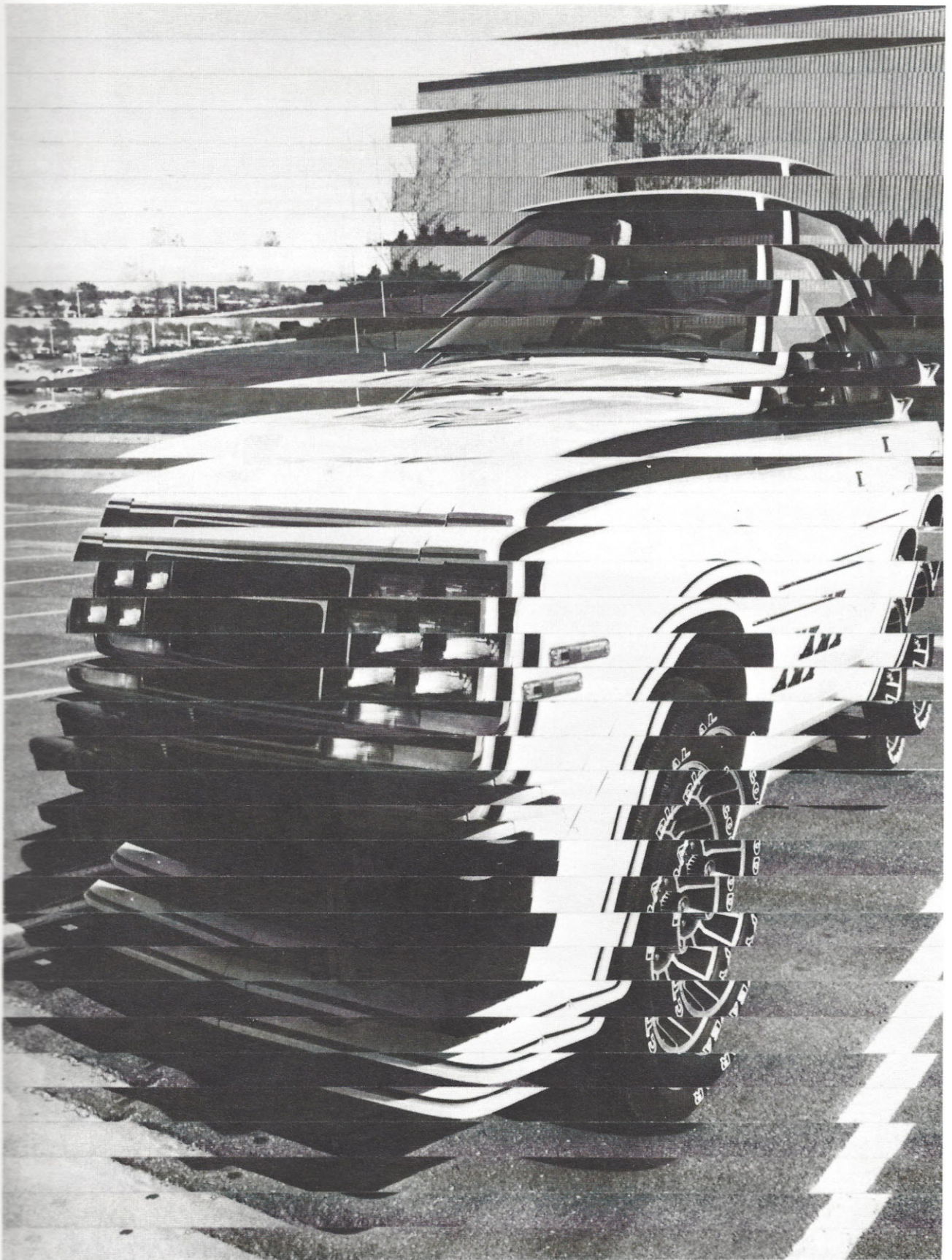
# History . . .

*John Register was one of those graduating from the 1968-69 Primer Class. He is the first to complete school here at Calvary Christian from primer through twelfth grade.*



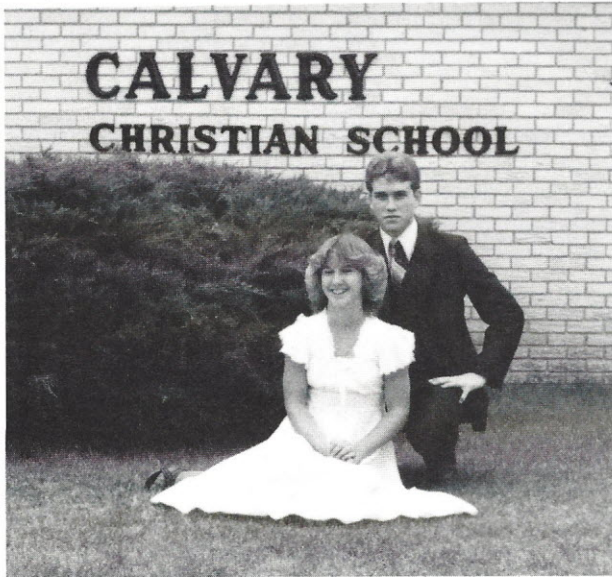
