





faith by the act of baptism (immersion in water) setting forth the Lord's death, burial and resurrection.


9. We believe that the church is a body of baptized believers whose only mission is not to "reform the World," but to preach and teach the Gospel of salvation to the individual soul.

John Register was one of those graduating from the 1968-69 Primer Class. He is the first to complete school here at Calvary Christian from primer through twelfth grade.













Primer Graduation Pays Tribute To Our Country















1981 Seniors Face The Challenge Of A New Beginning















Senior Class Trip
