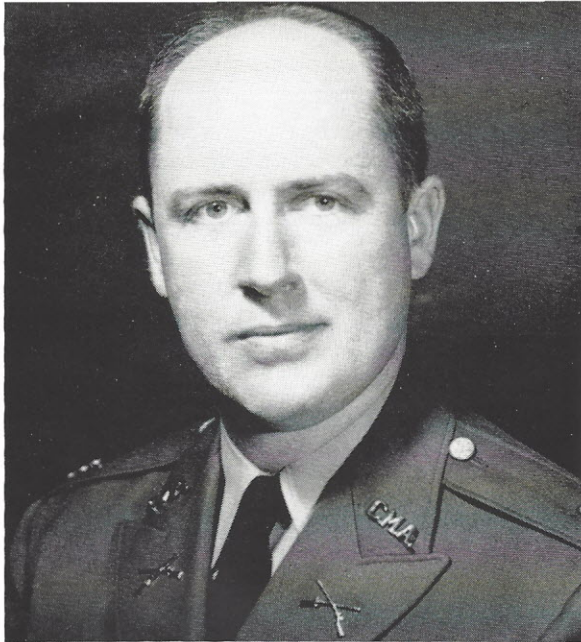
## DEDICATION
