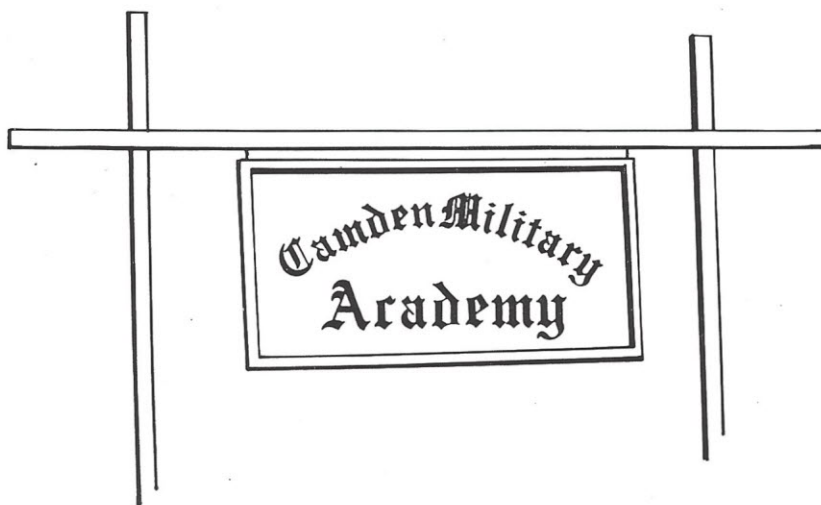

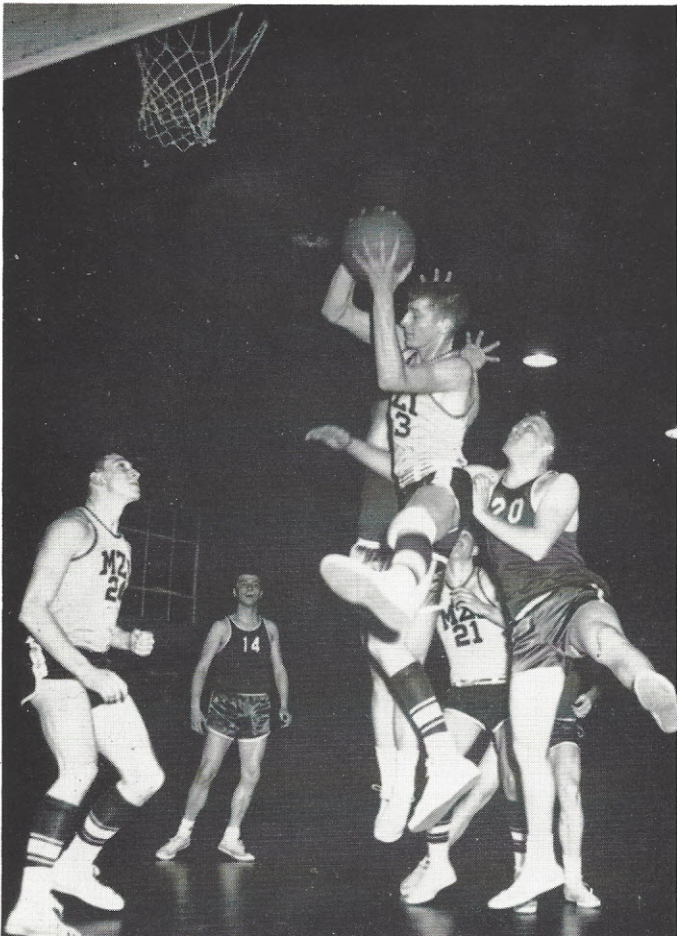

COL. JAMES F. RISHER

Col. Risher was born in Hampton County, S. C., on November 26, 1889. He attended the public schools of South Carolina, The Citadel, and the Atlanta School of Law where he graduated in 1910. Col. Risher taught in South Carolina schools from 1911 to 1922. In 1922, he took a teaching job at Carlisle Military School. He continued to teach at Carlisle until 1928, at which time he became Headmaster of Carlisle.

In 1958, Col. Risher bought Camden Military Academy. In two short years he has turned it into a top rate school.

We of the EXCALIBUR staff and of the cadet corps are truly proud to have known such a diligent and hardworking man.

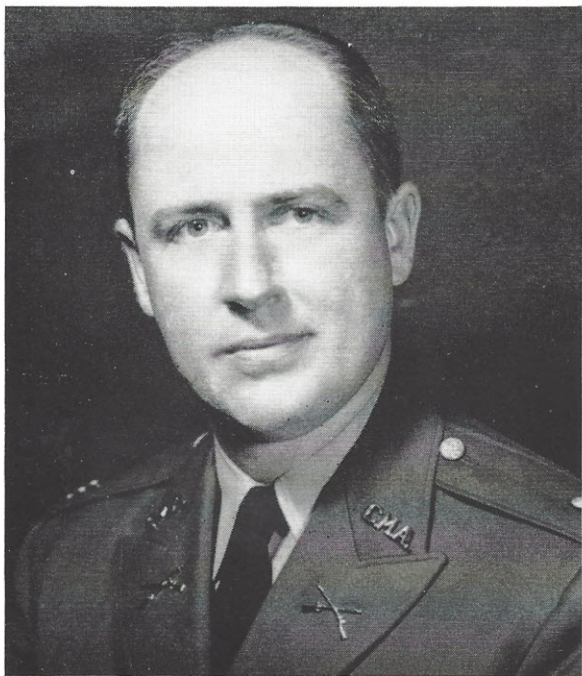
HEADMASTER

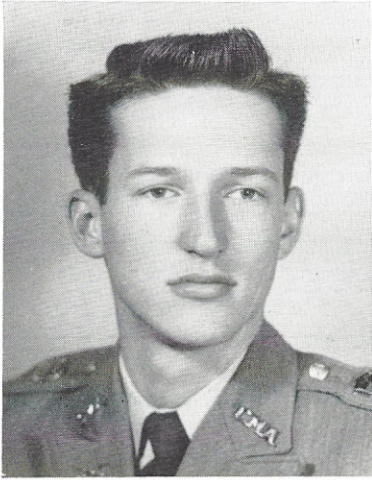
DANCE COMMITTEE

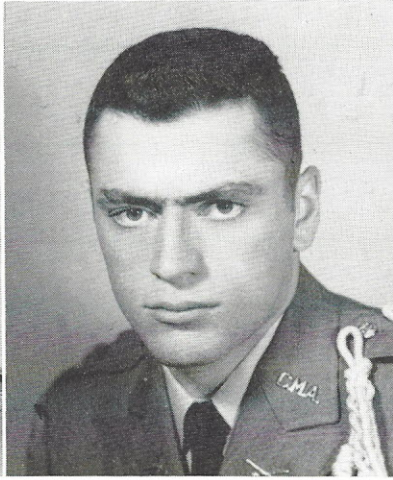

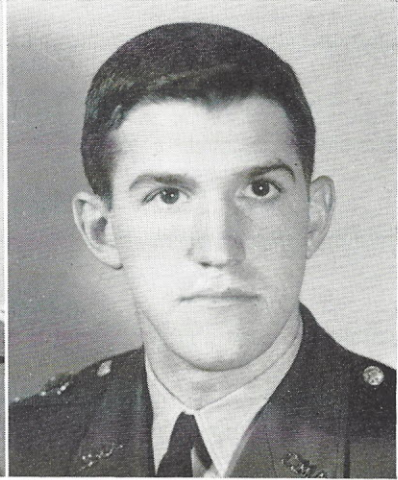

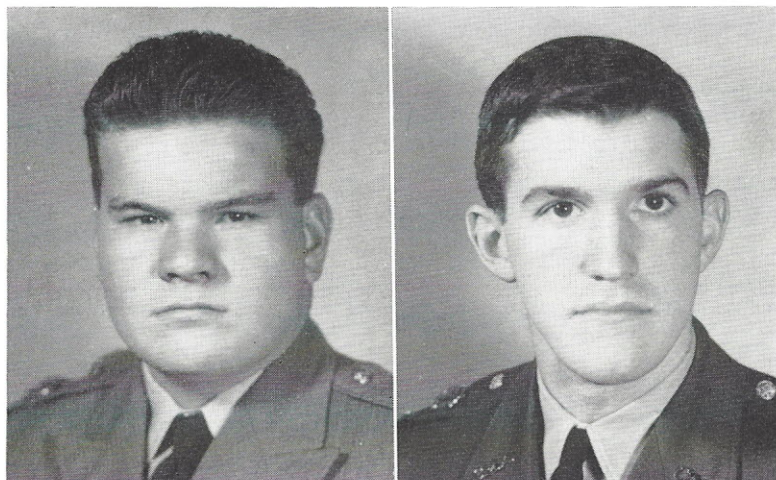

We wish to thank Lt. Zemp, who has done very much this year to broaden the sources of information and knowledge of how to use the library.

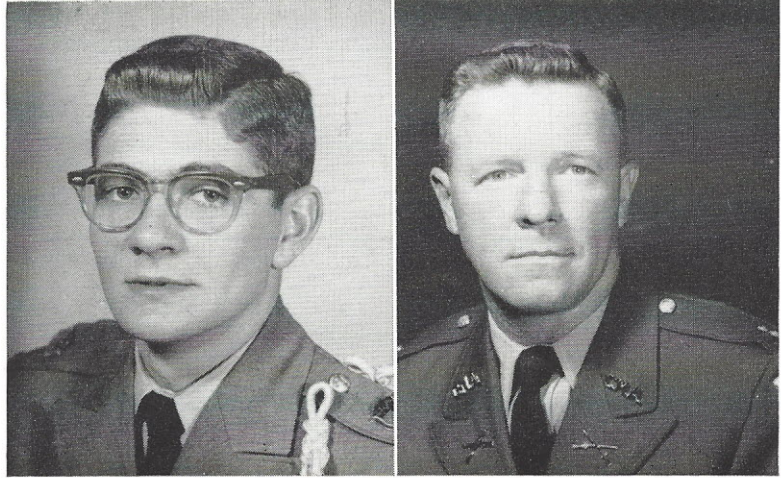

FOOTBALL

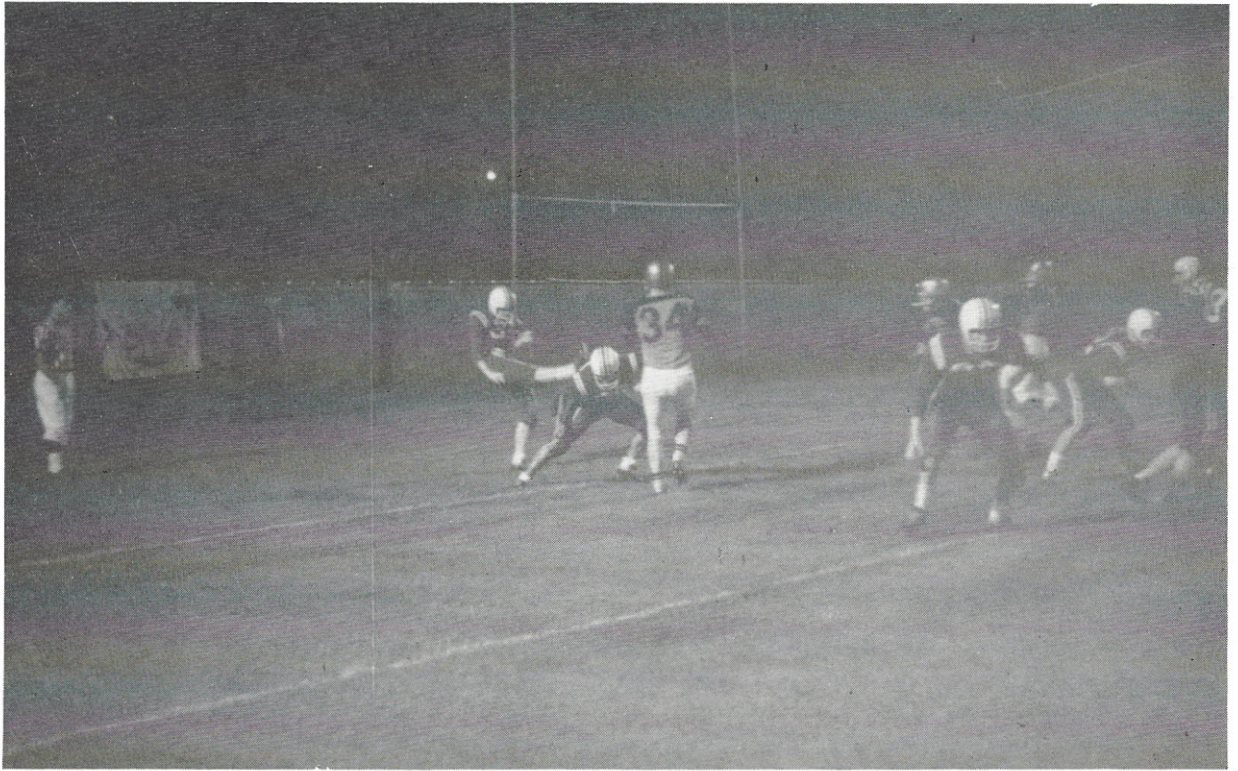

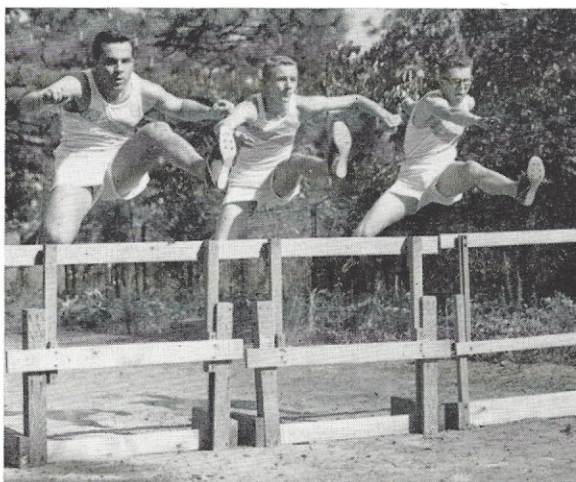
TRACK
