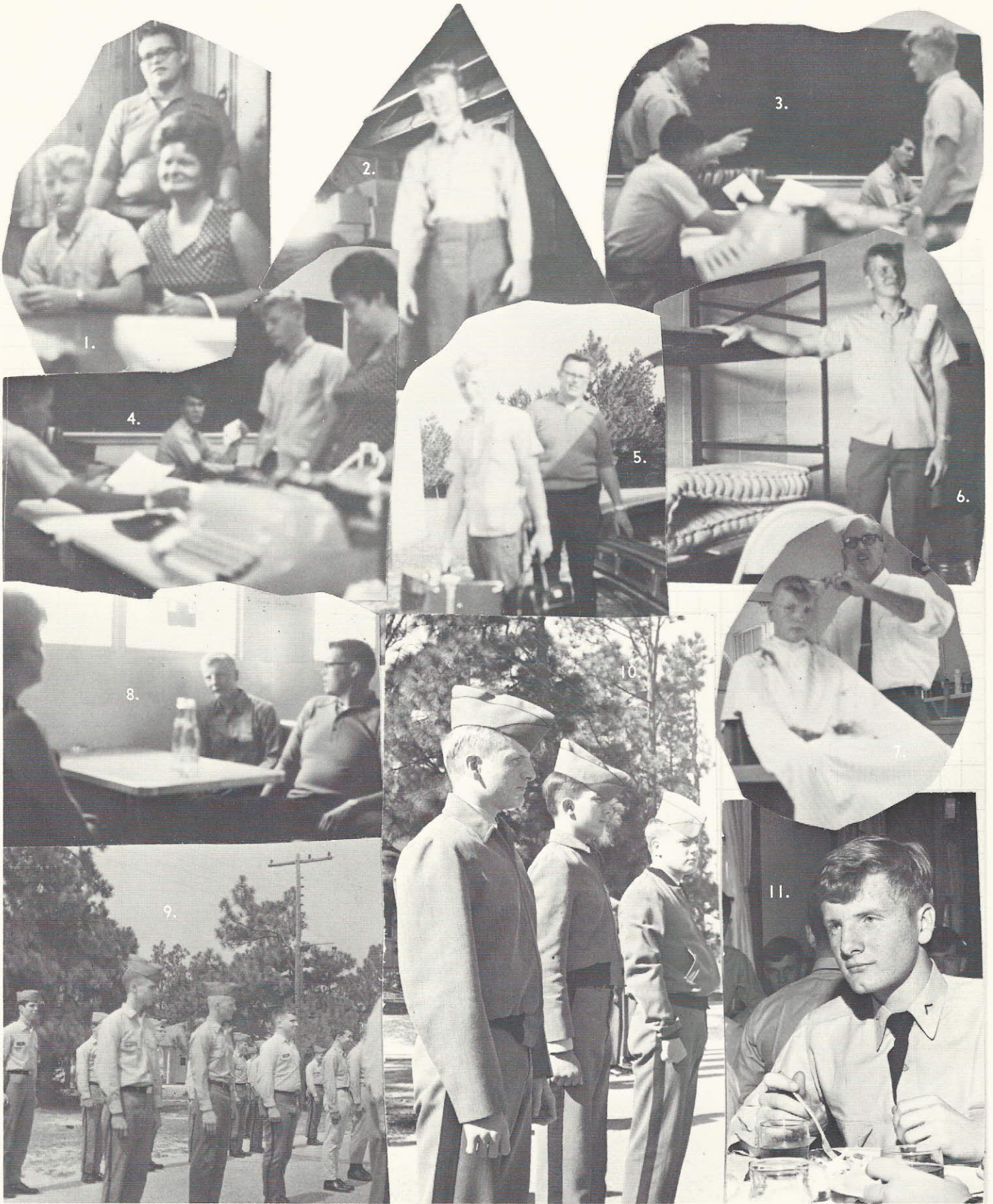
To many, it is confusion, excitement, sadness, joy, frustration, success. It is a time for ignoring anxieties, and working to fulfill our dreams.

The school was originally founded as Camden Academy in 1949 by a group of generous and foresighted Camden citizens who considered Camden to be an ideal site for a private school.

The present administration assumed control of the facilities in 1958 at which time the name was changed to Camden Military Academy.

The Academy is now a fully accredited member of the Southern Associations of Colleges and Schools, offering preparatory work in grades 8-12 and an honor R.O.T.C. unit. The Corps consists of 245 cadets from approximately 30 states and several foreign countries.

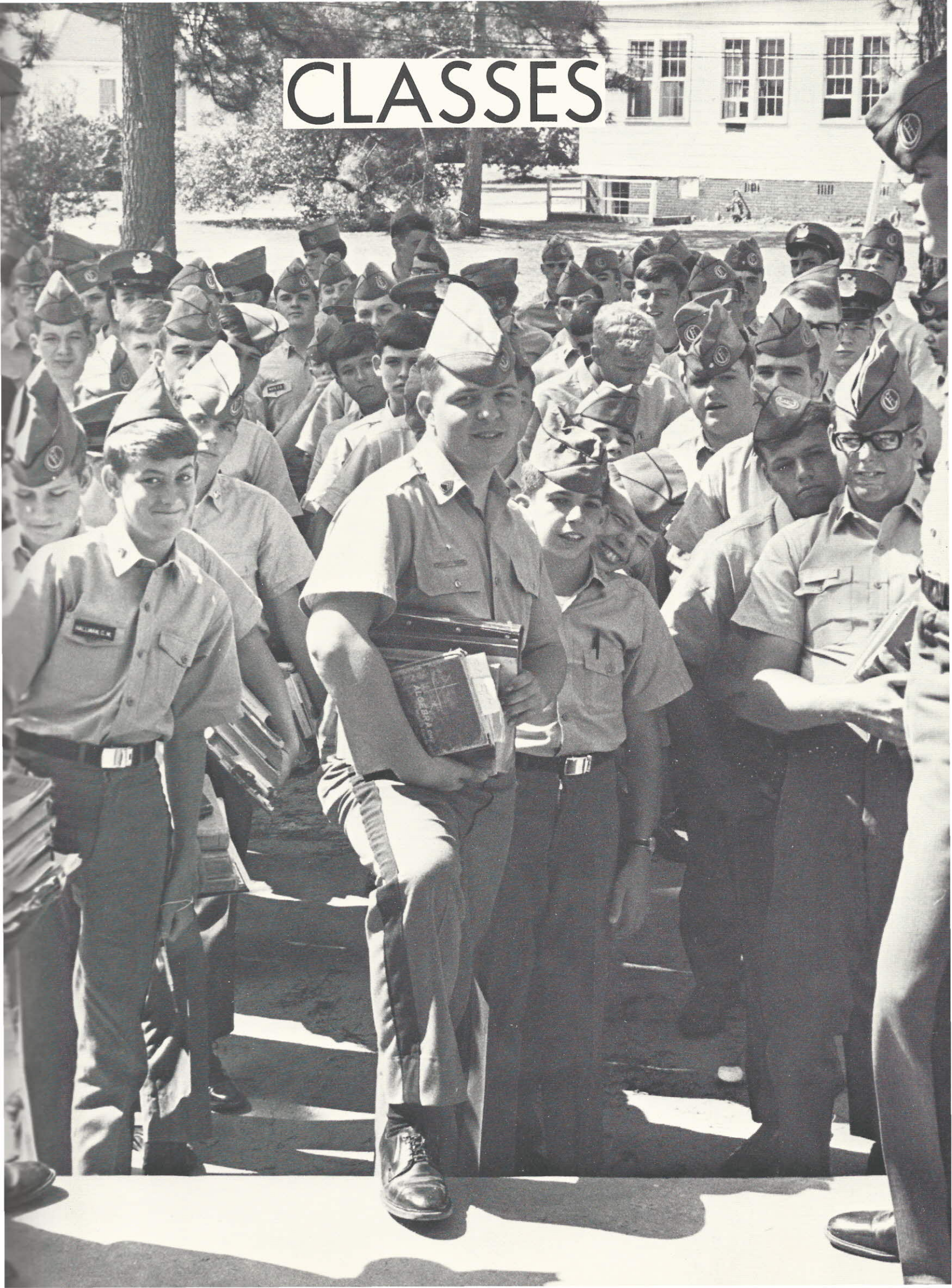

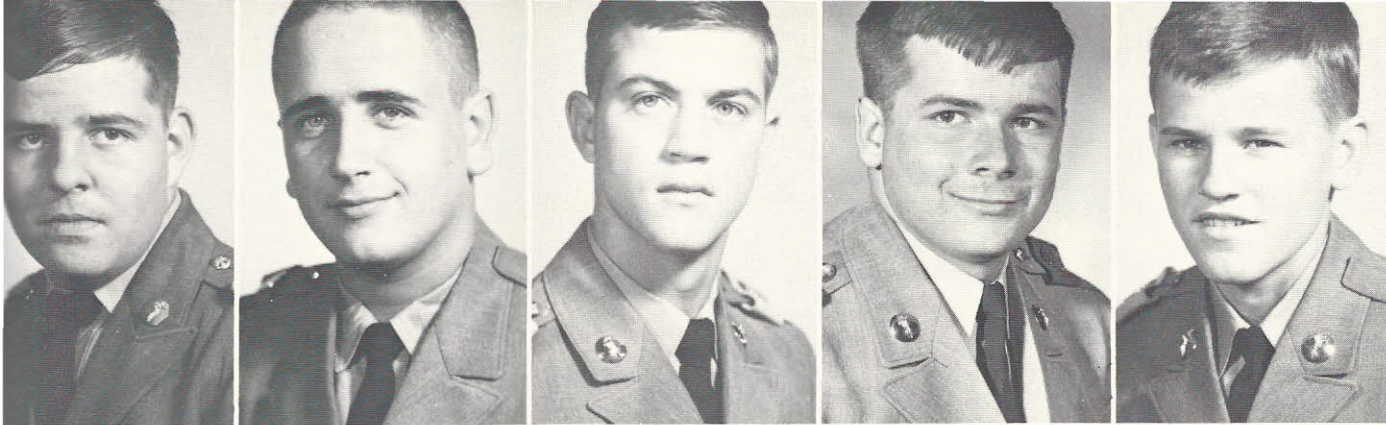
SOPHOMORE CLASS OFFICERS

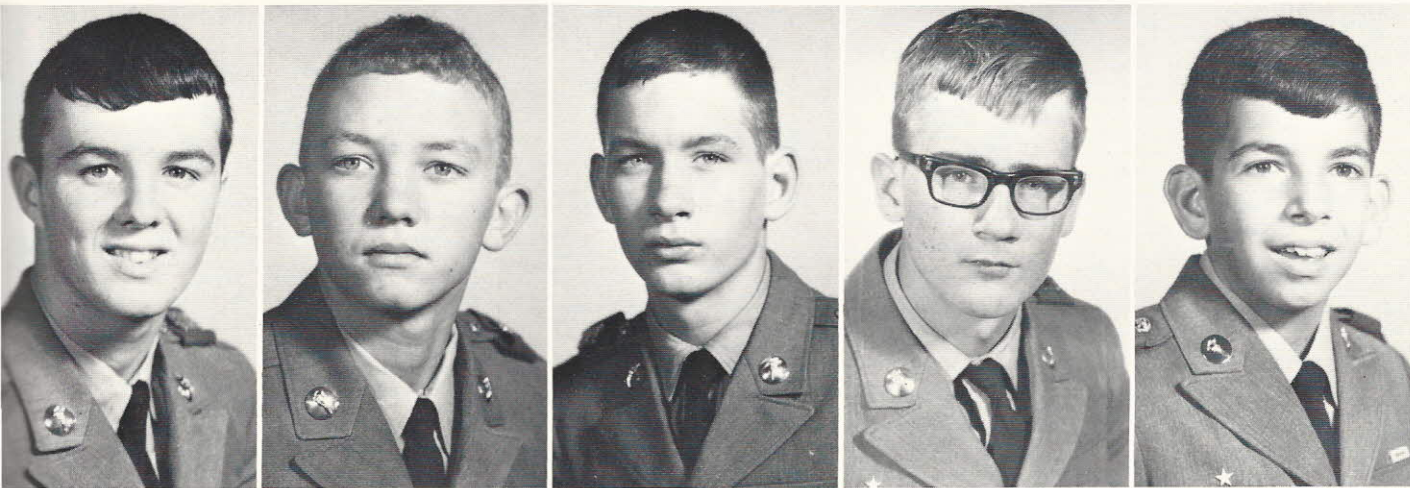
FRESHMEN

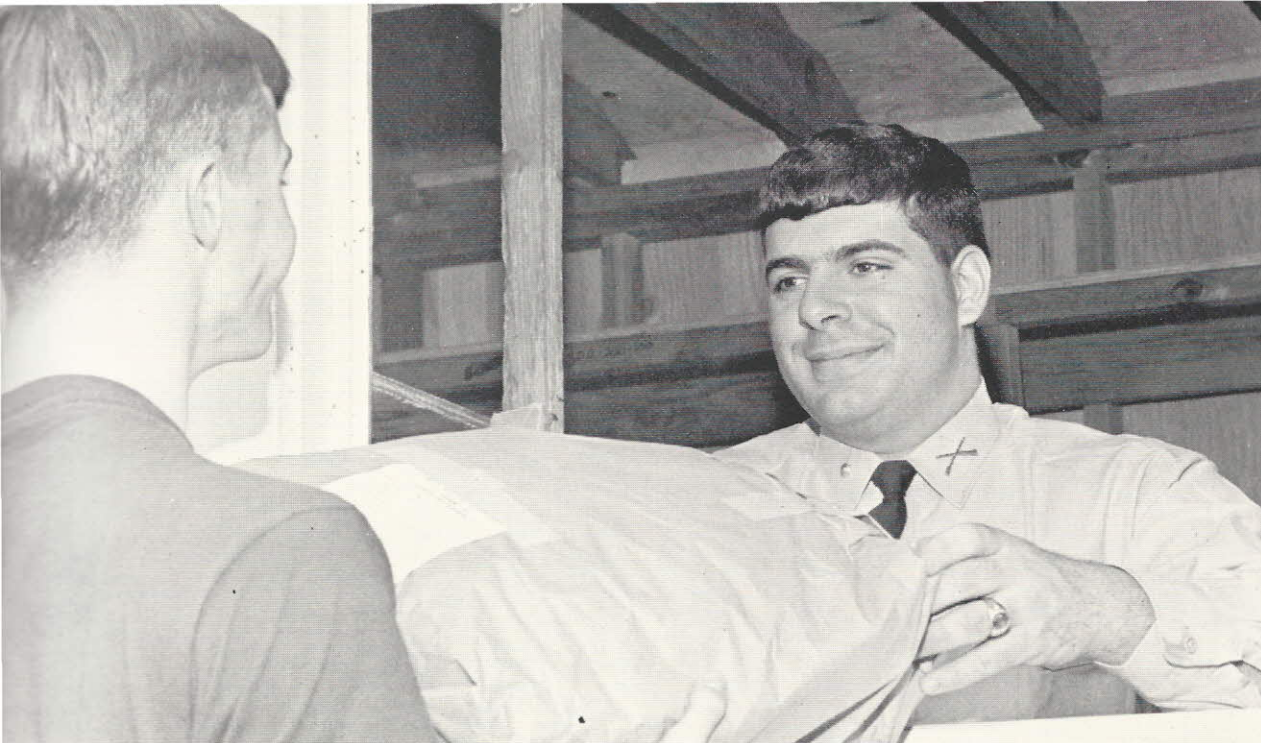
SWIMMING POOL STAFF

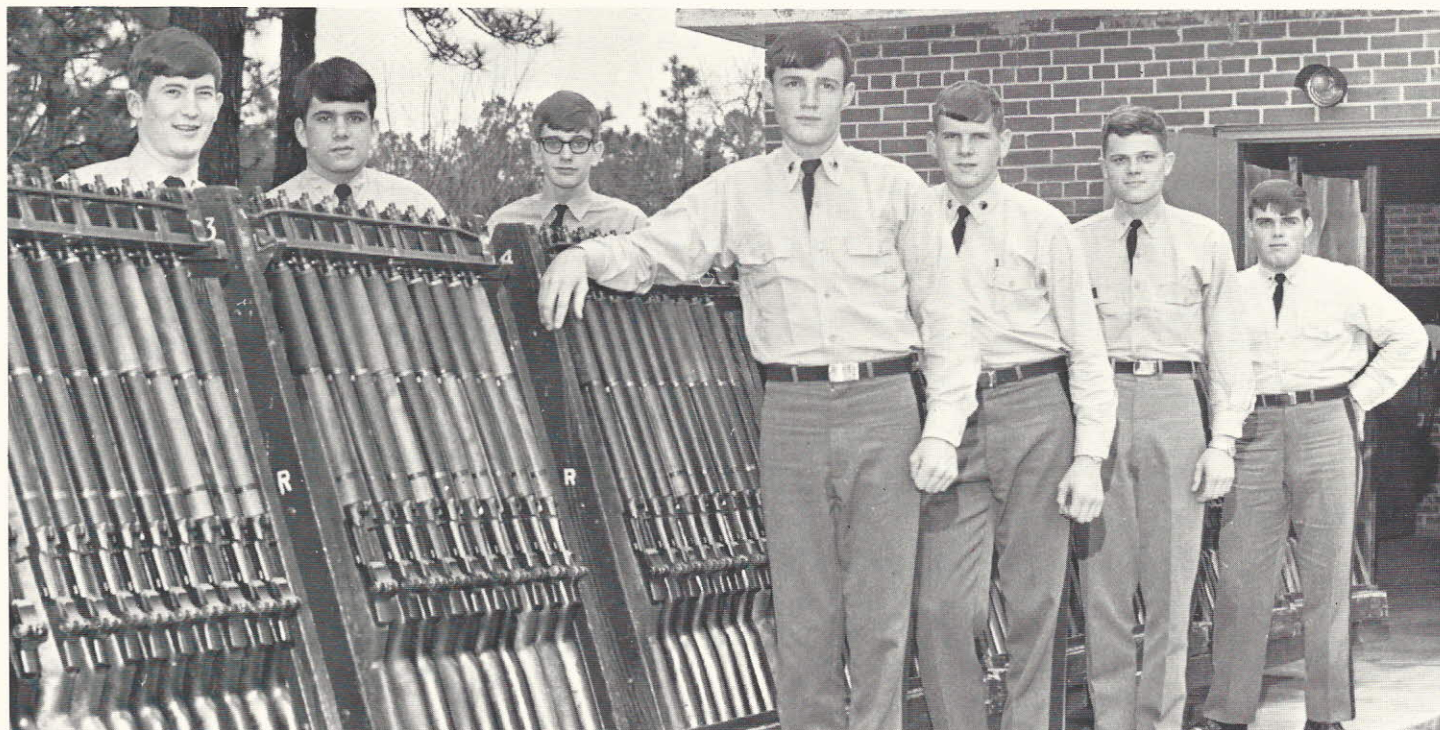

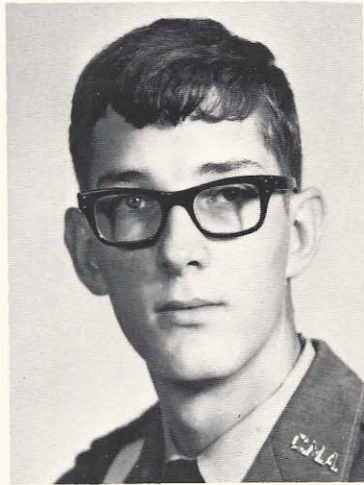
FINE ARTS

Assisting Capt. Vandegrift with this organization are Mrs. White and Mrs. Risher. Throughout the year, trips are taken to various museums and art exhibitions.

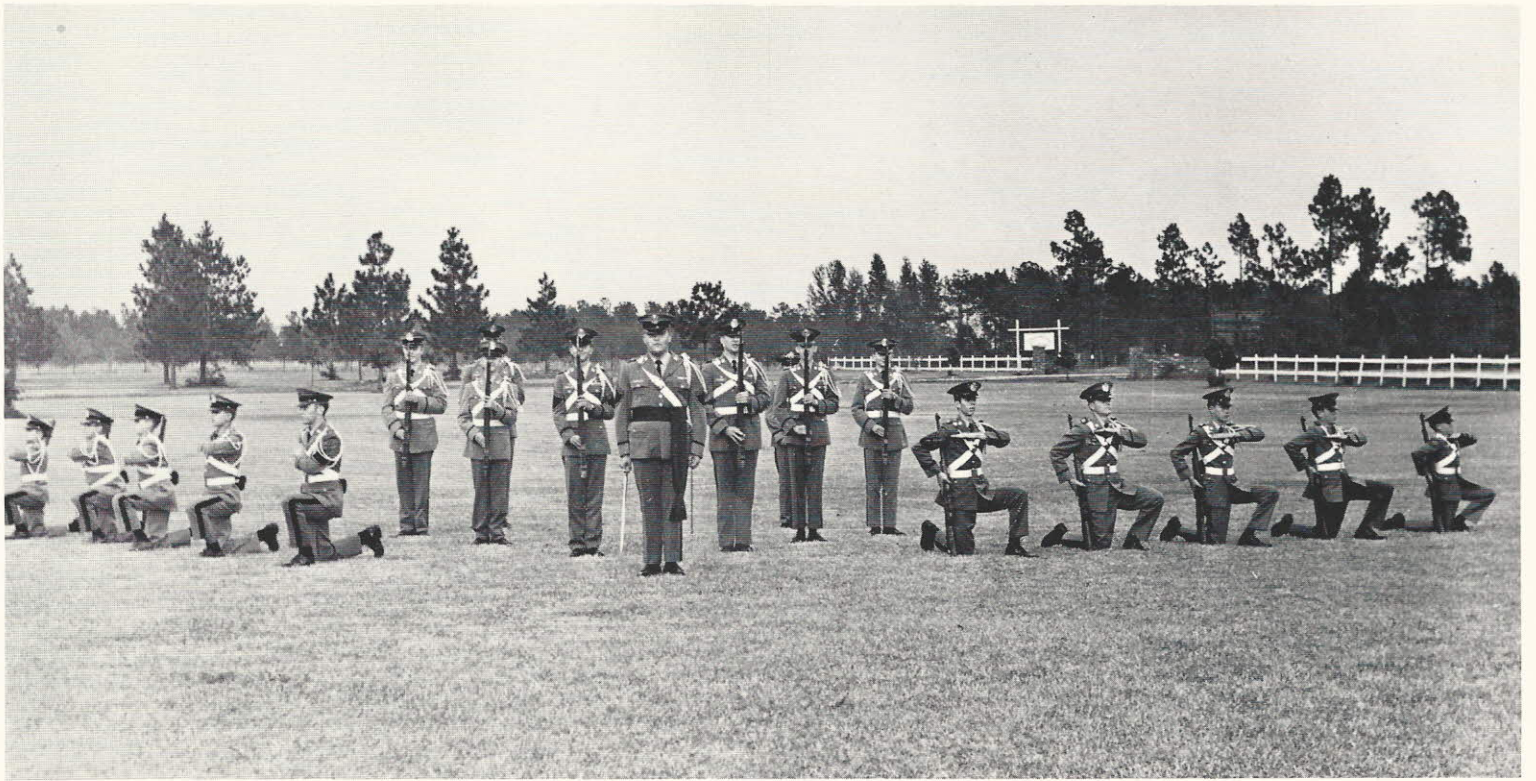

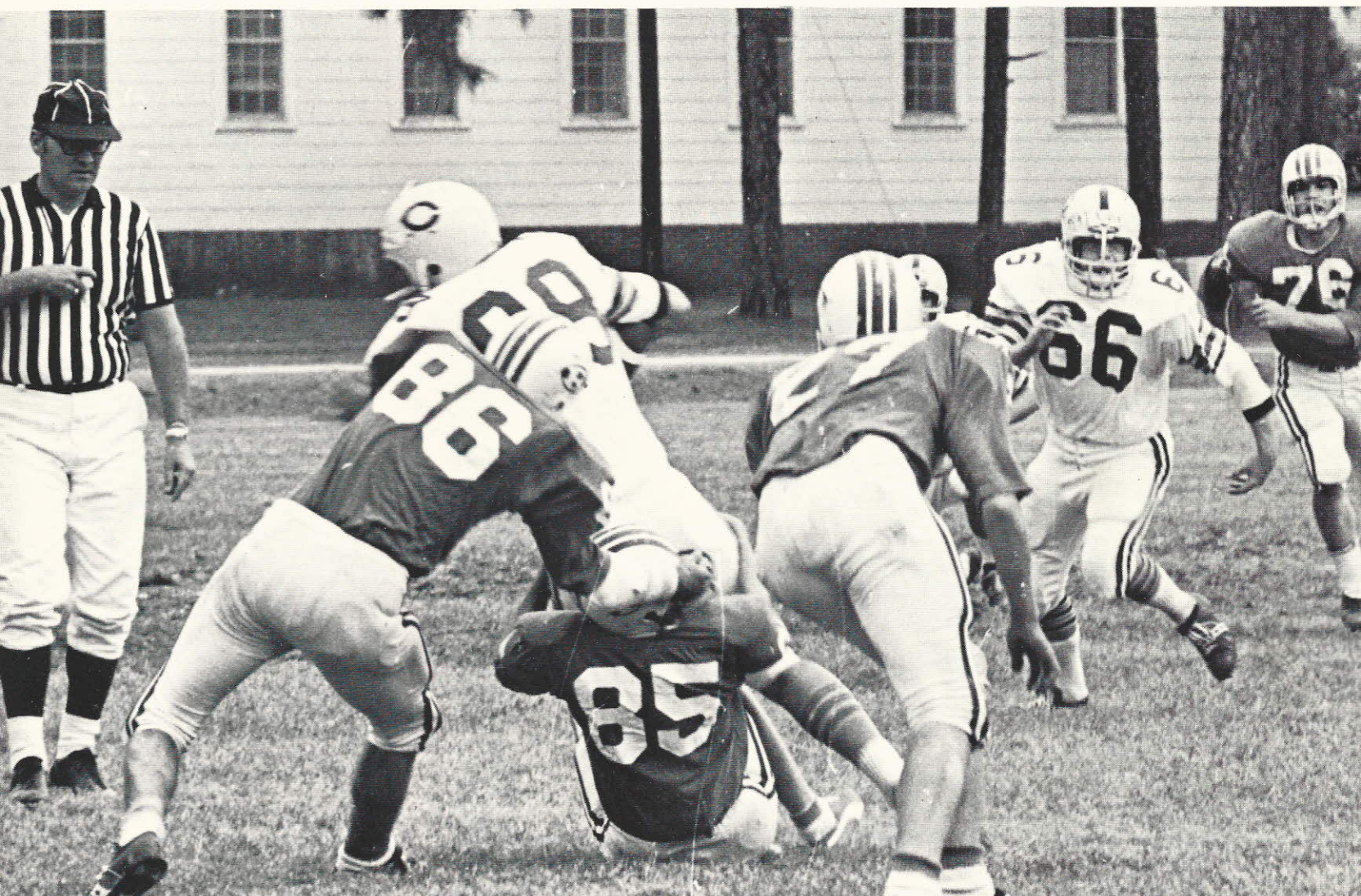
Asheville School for Boys—14 C.M.A.—0 (away)

Thou canst not then be false to any man."*

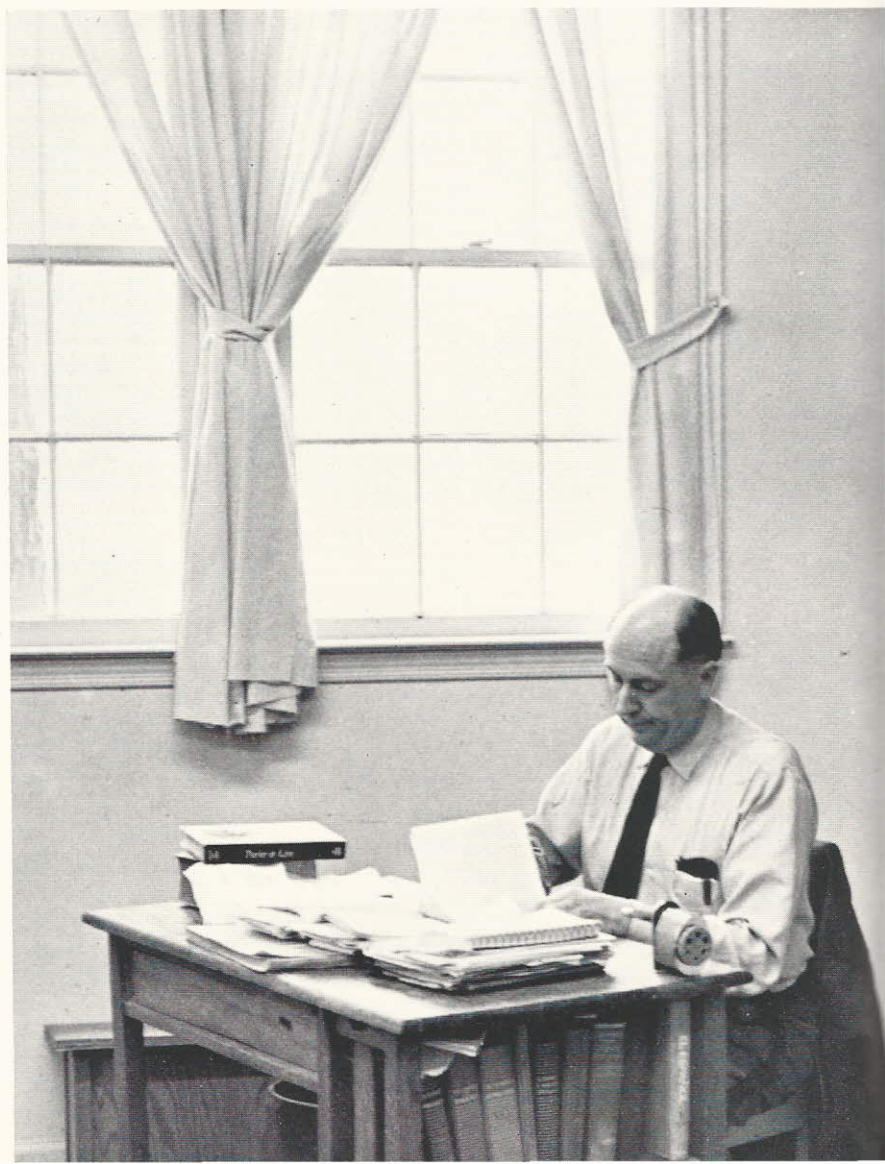
My advice then is: Be honest with yourself. Get busy. Do what your present occupation is—study!

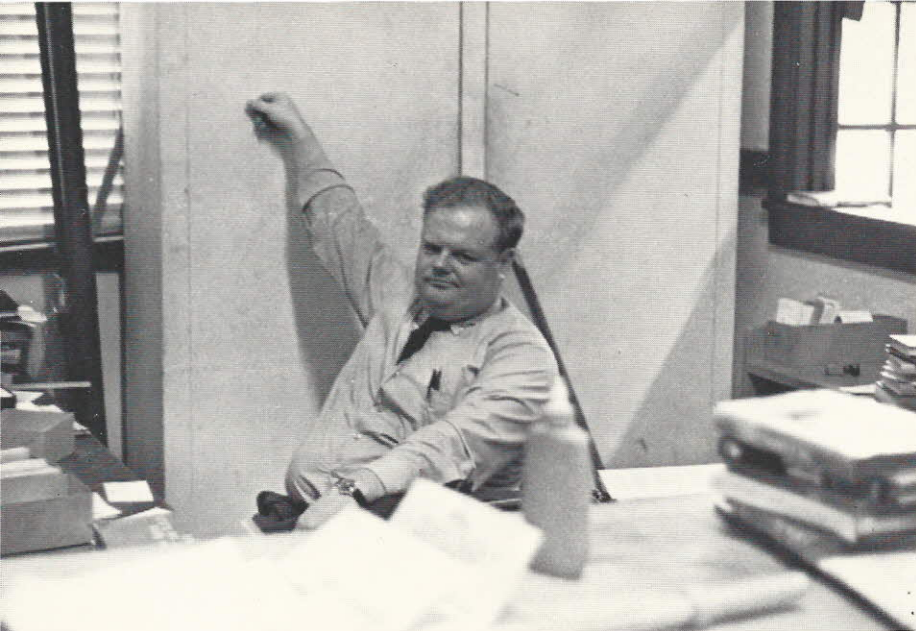
