CMA offers an excellent academic program for grades 7 through 12. Primarily a college preparatory program, general courses are offered to those students not qualified or motivated for college preparatory work. The high-caliber faculty and small classes help promote good study habits among students. Grades are posted every two weeks and report cards sent home at six-week intervals.

Courses fall basically into two categories: Science and Math, and the Humanities. In the former, courses of instruction include: General Math, Algebra, Geometry, Trigonometry, Life Science, Earth Science, Physical Science, Biology, Chemistry, and Physics. The Humanities area is larger and includes seventh through twelfth grade English, World and U. S. History, Geography, French, Spanish, Business Law, Economics, Civics, Psychology, Sociology, and Typing. Finally, Music Appreciation, Band, Physical Education and Health, as well as Developmental Reading, may be taken.
