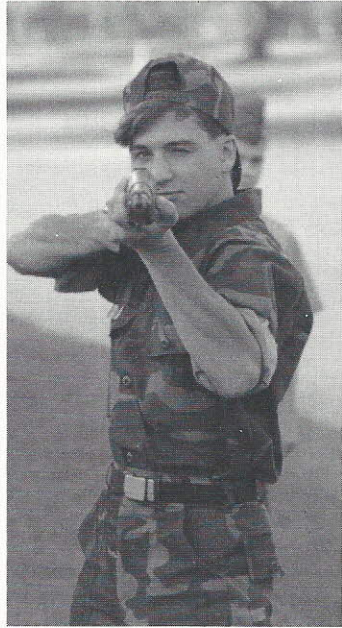

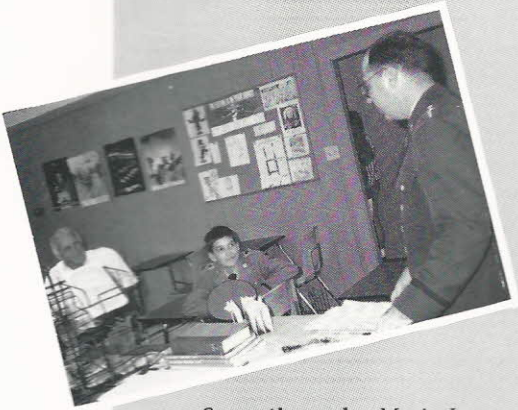

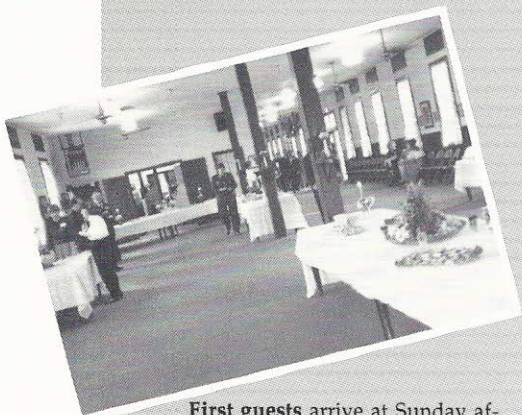

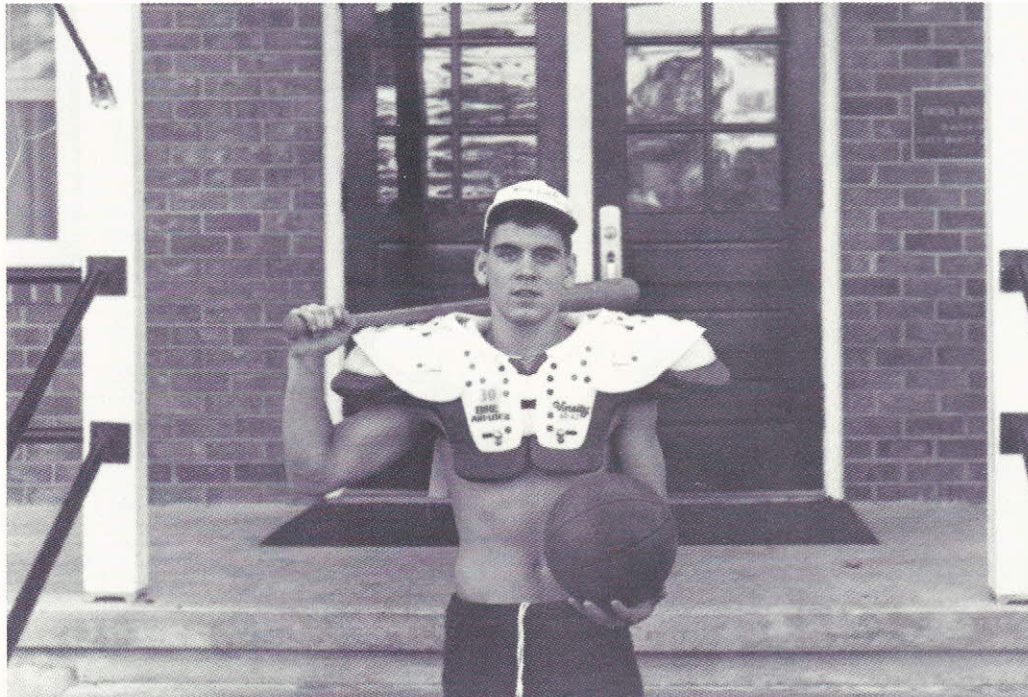

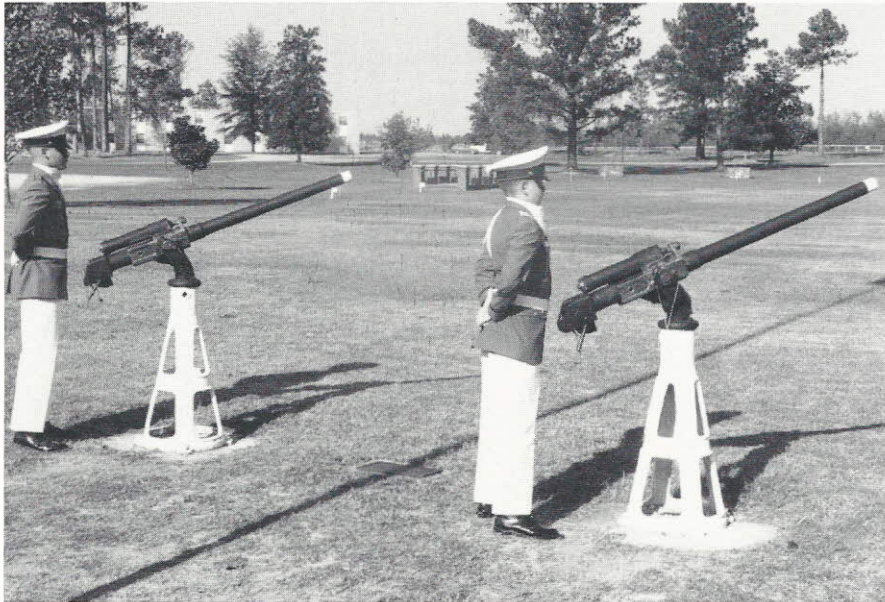

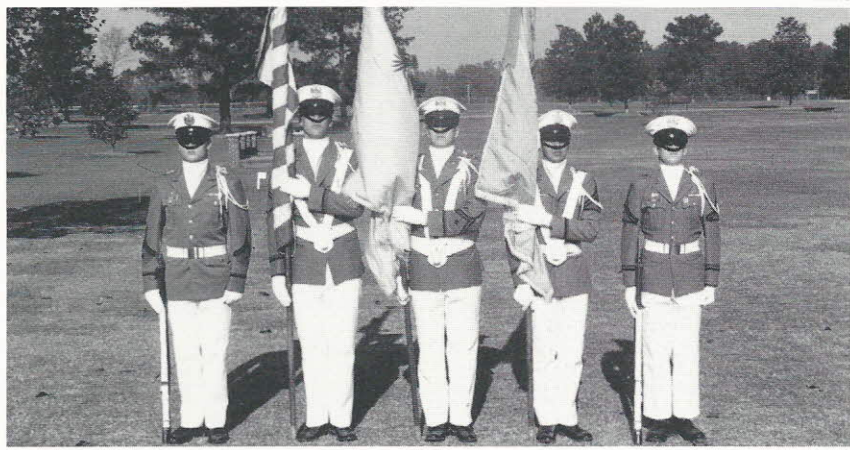
Looking Sharp

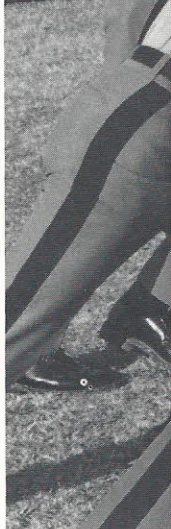

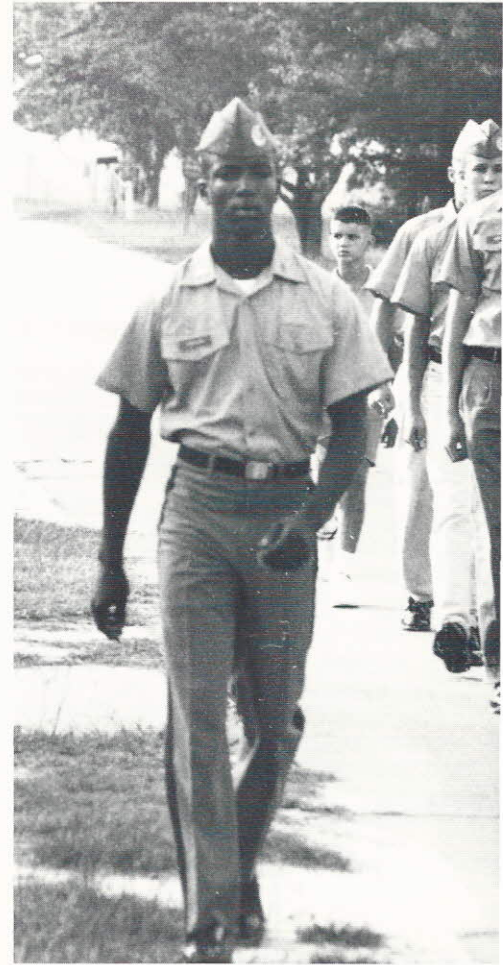

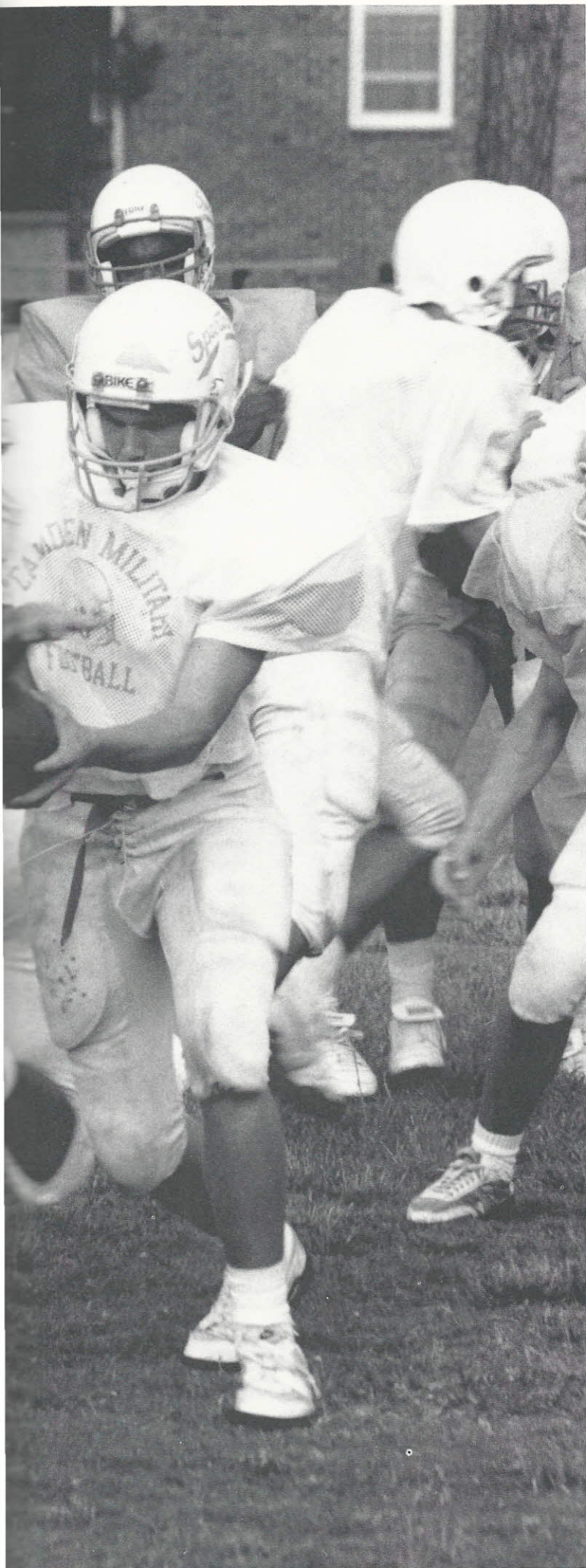

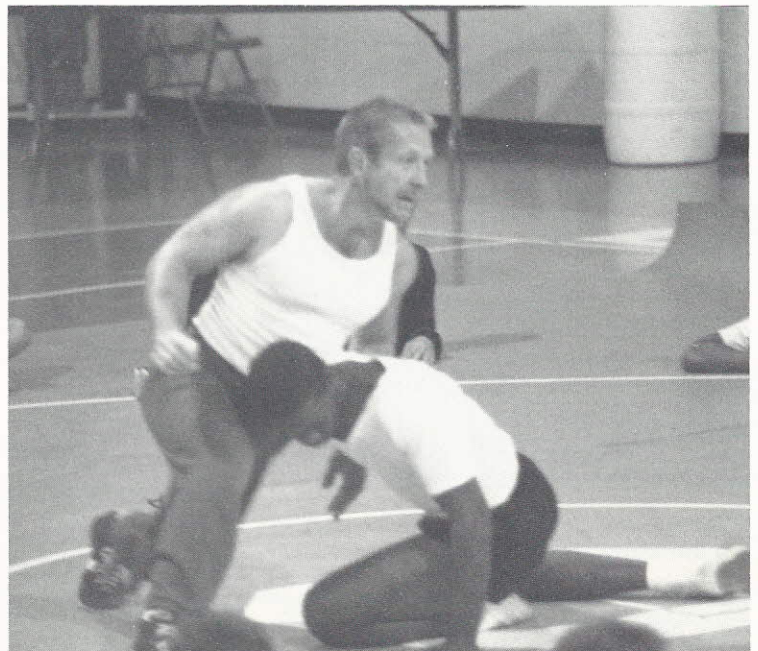

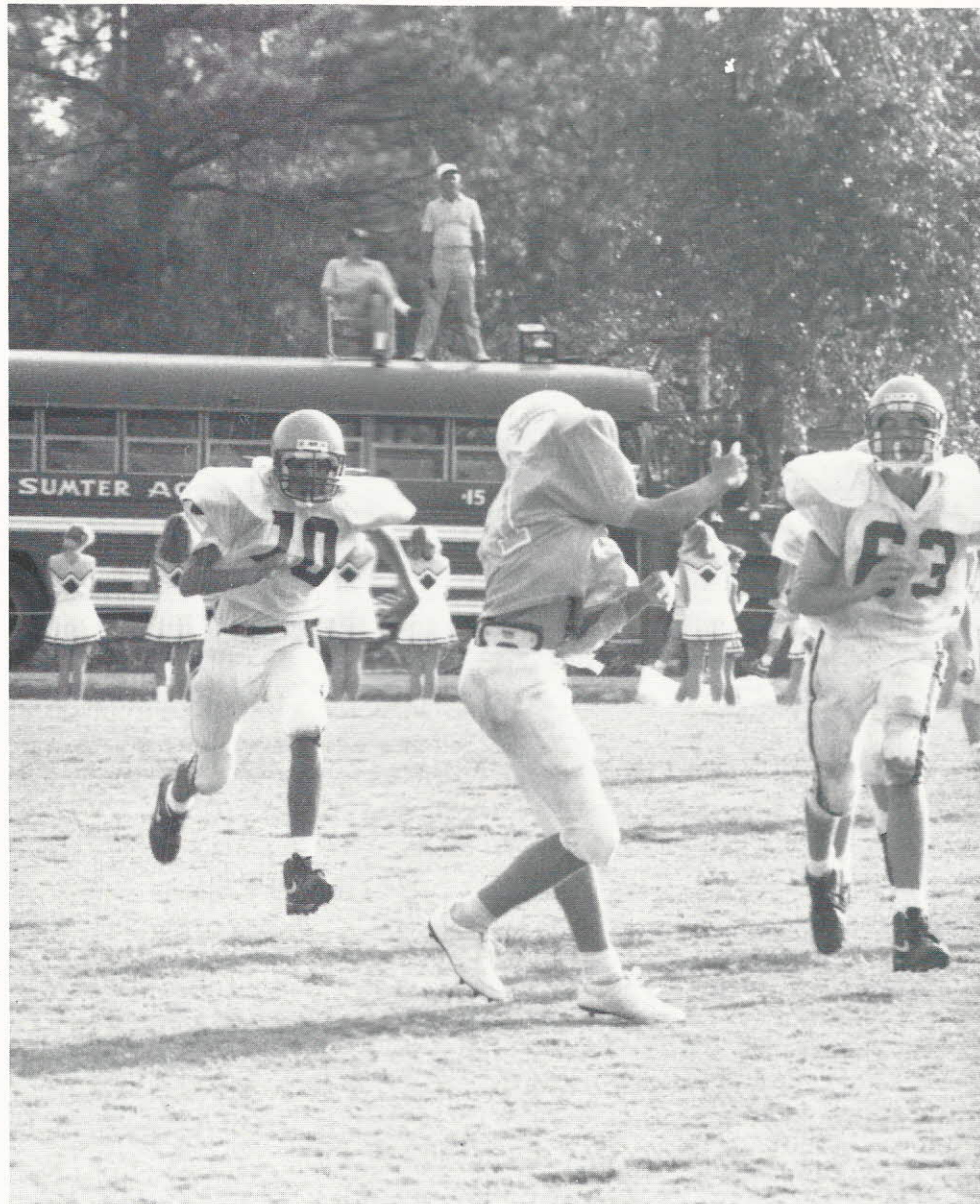

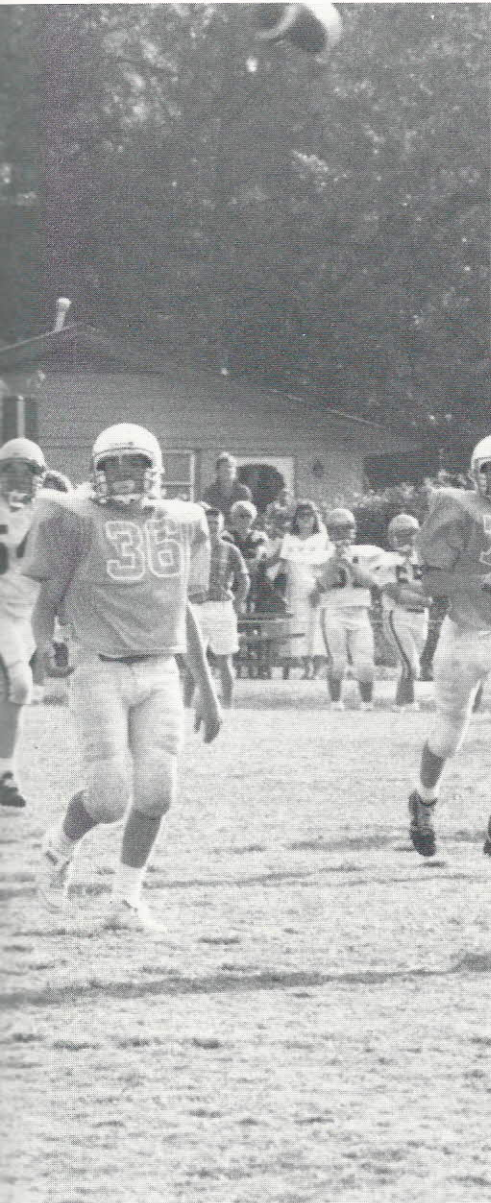

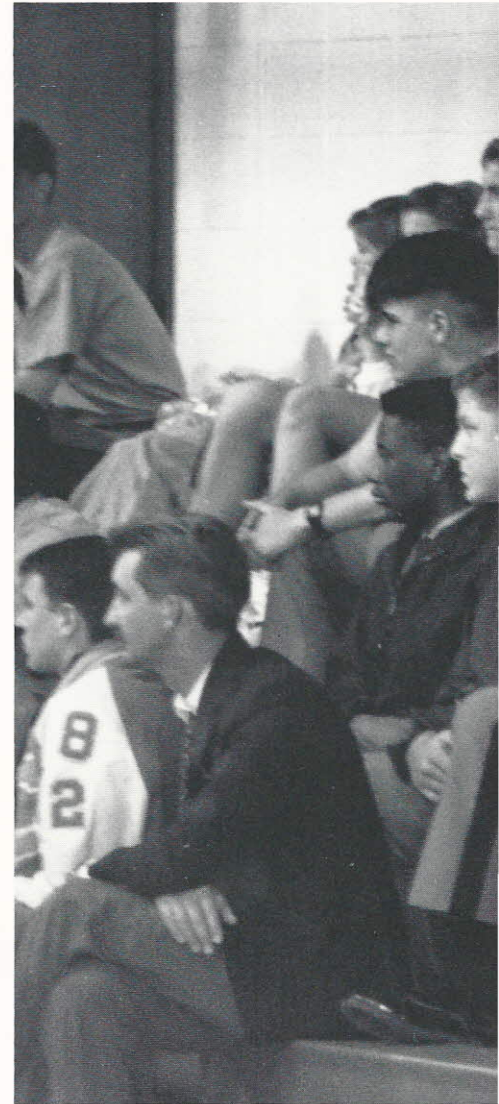
A tough season

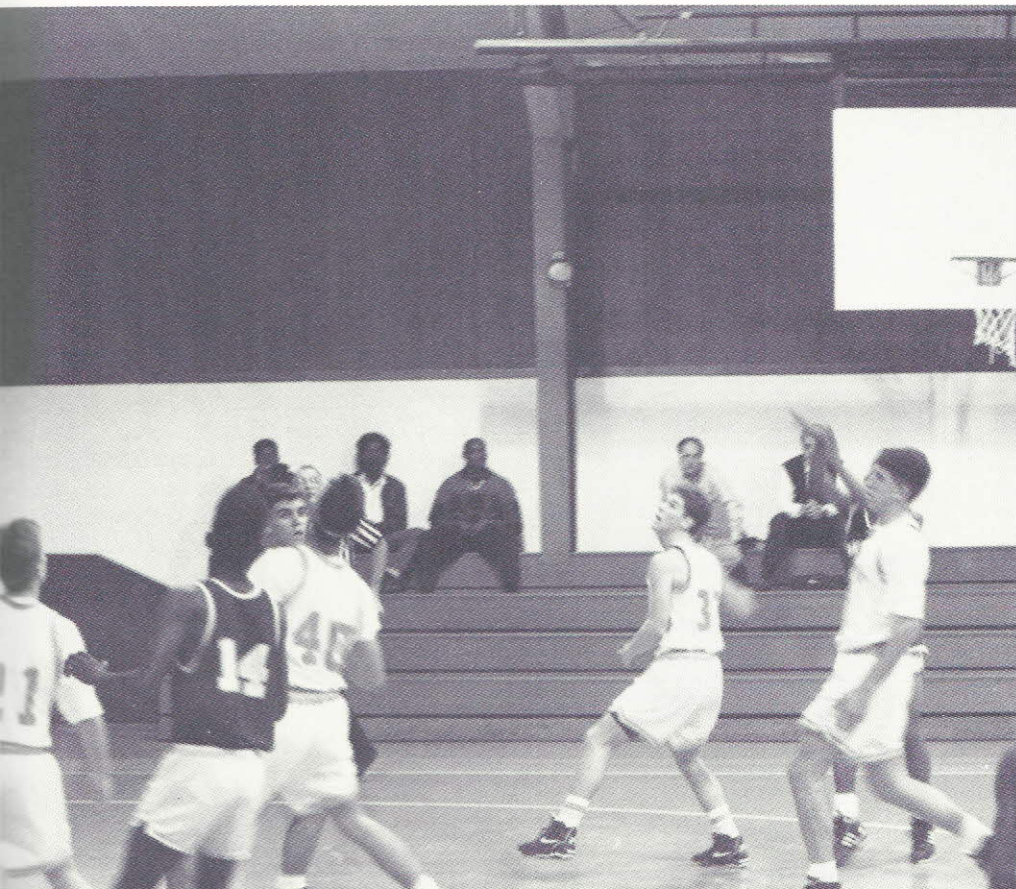

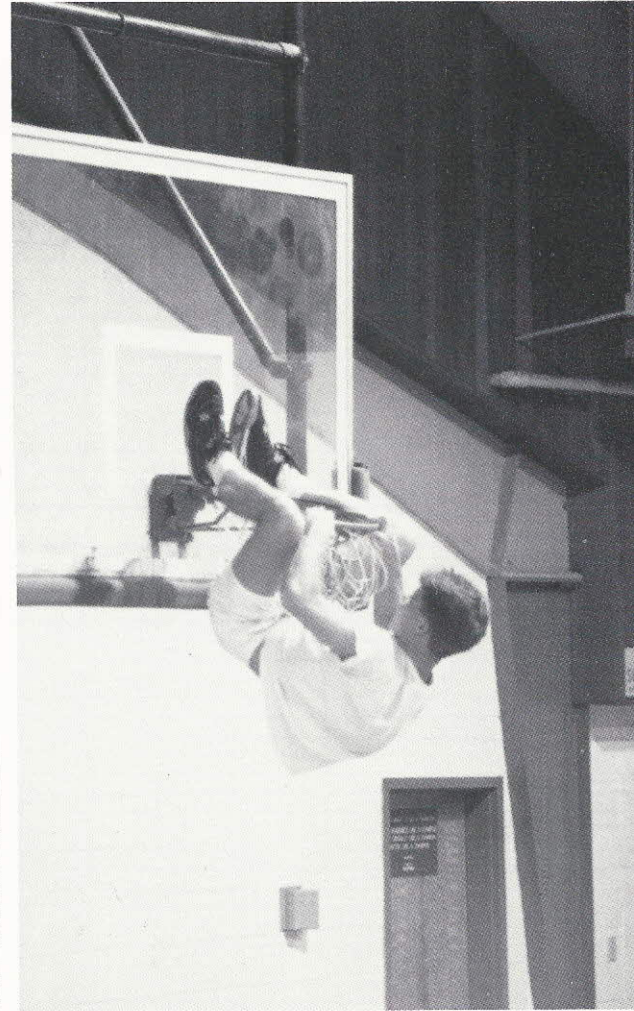

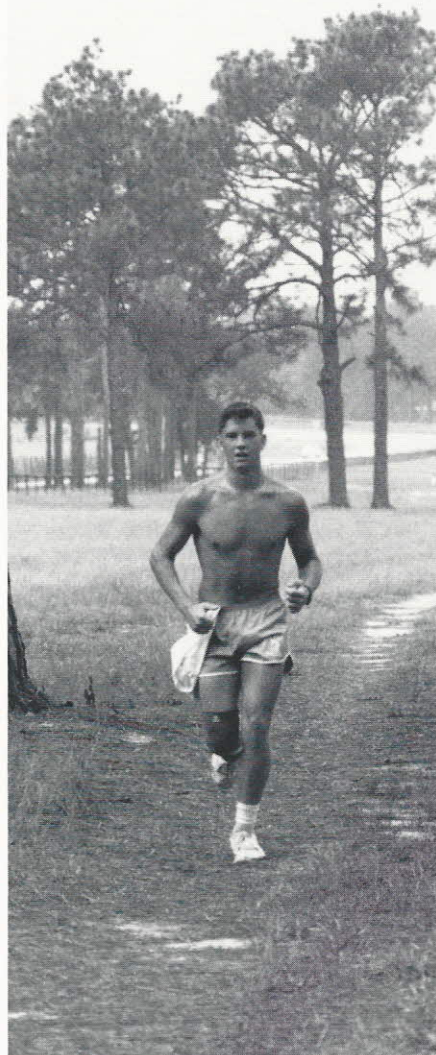

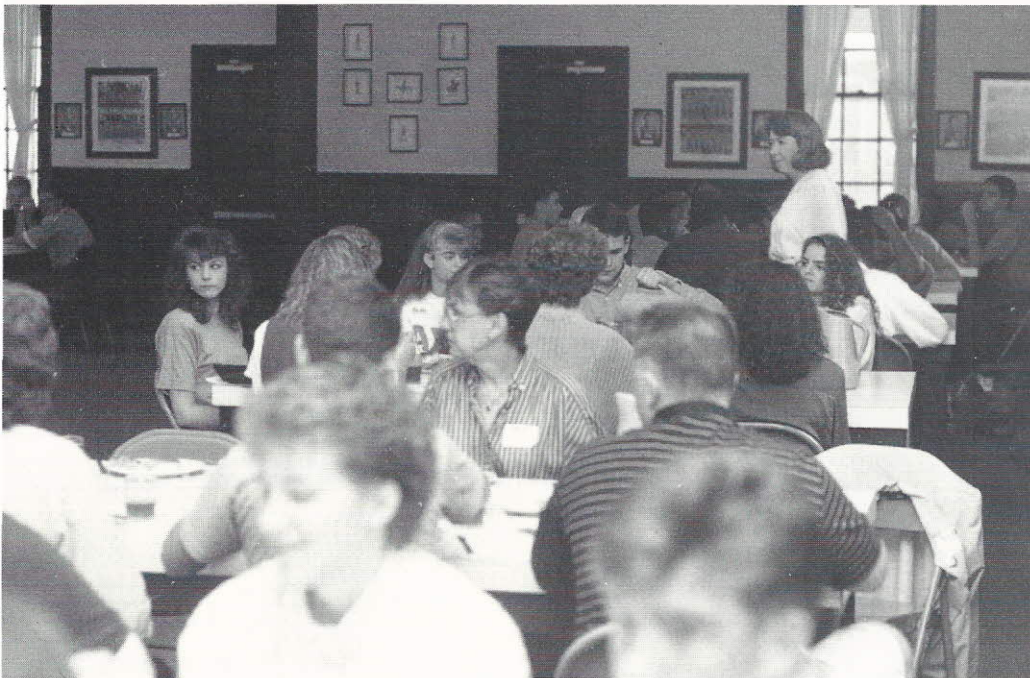

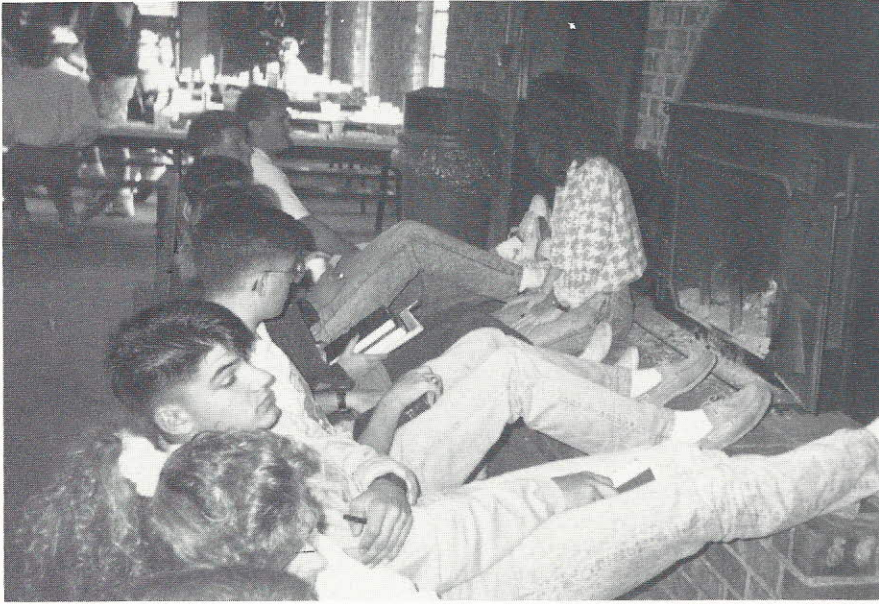
Who says we're nerds?

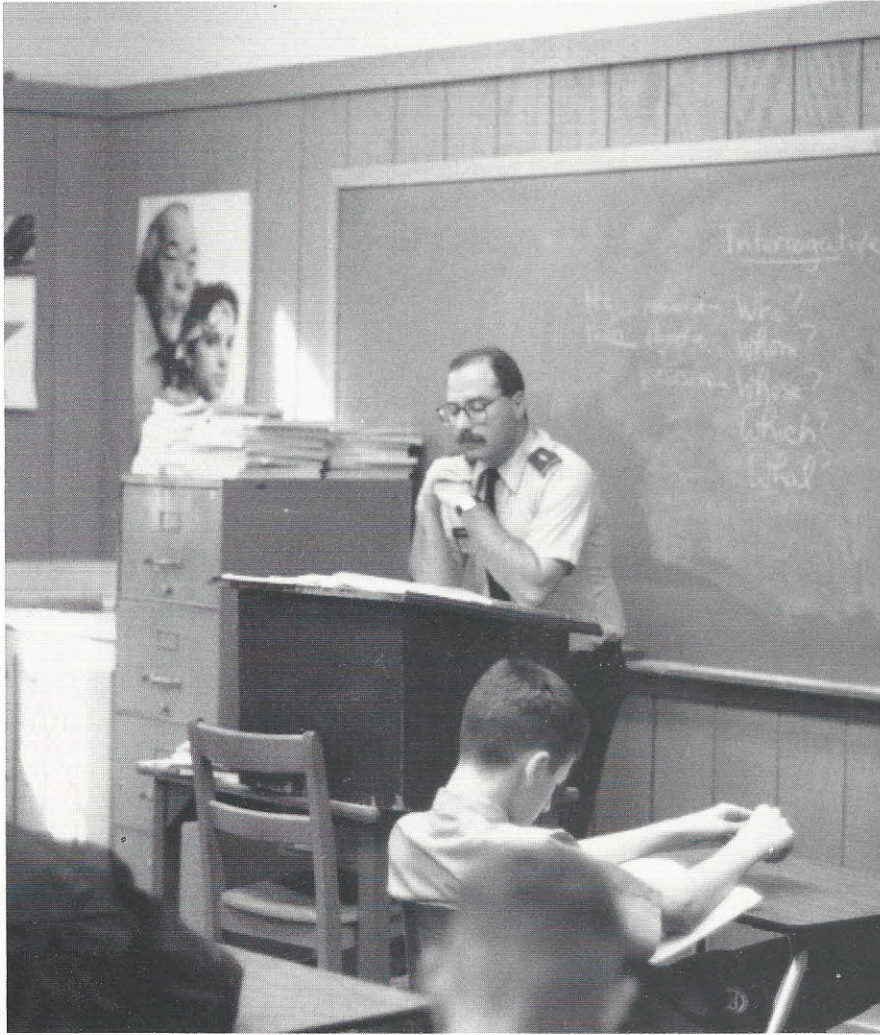

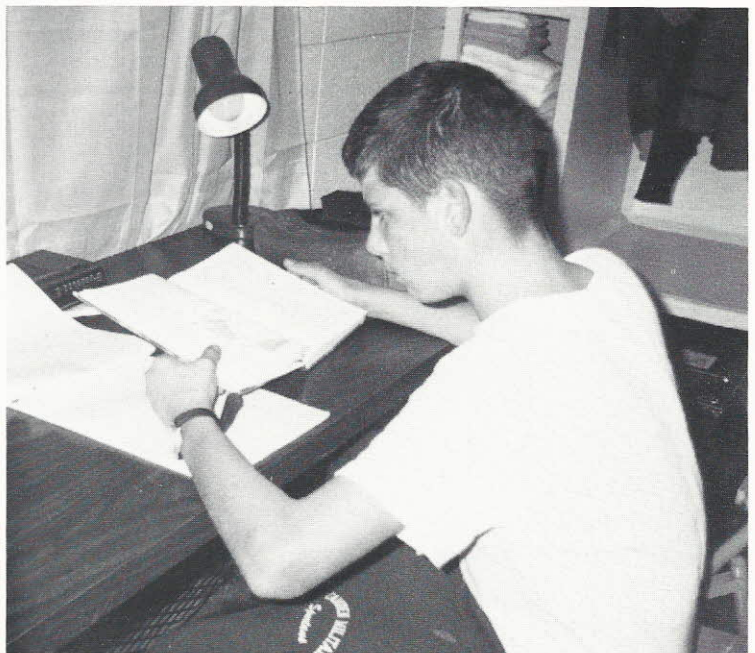

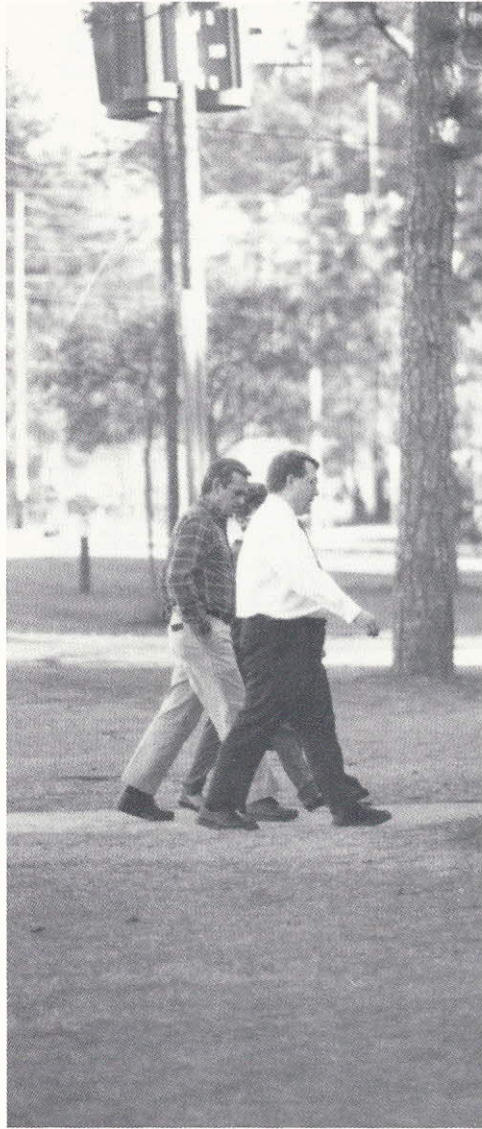
Year end brings thoughts of a new beginning

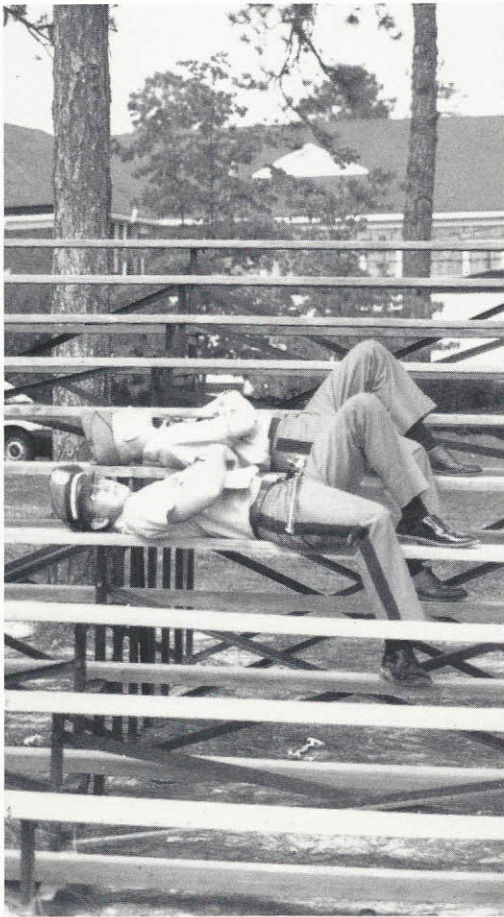

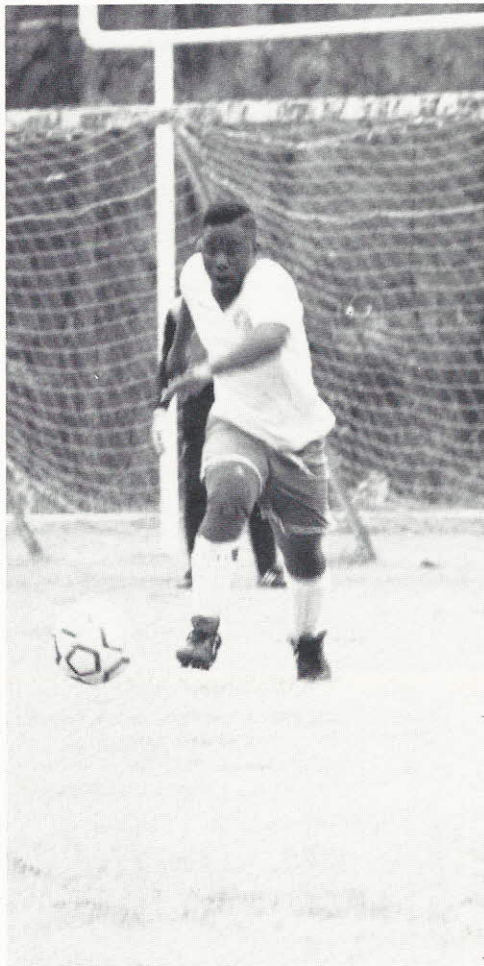

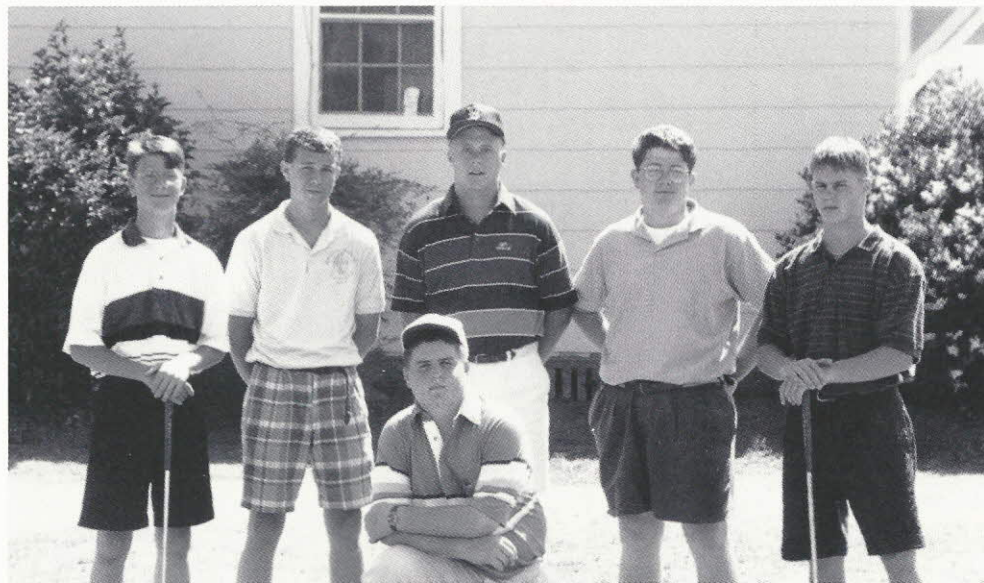


Spring sports bring out the best in us

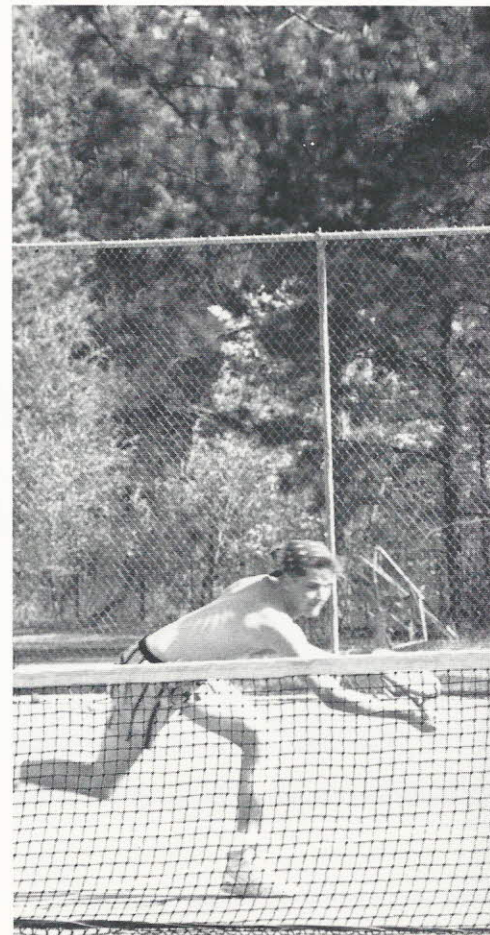

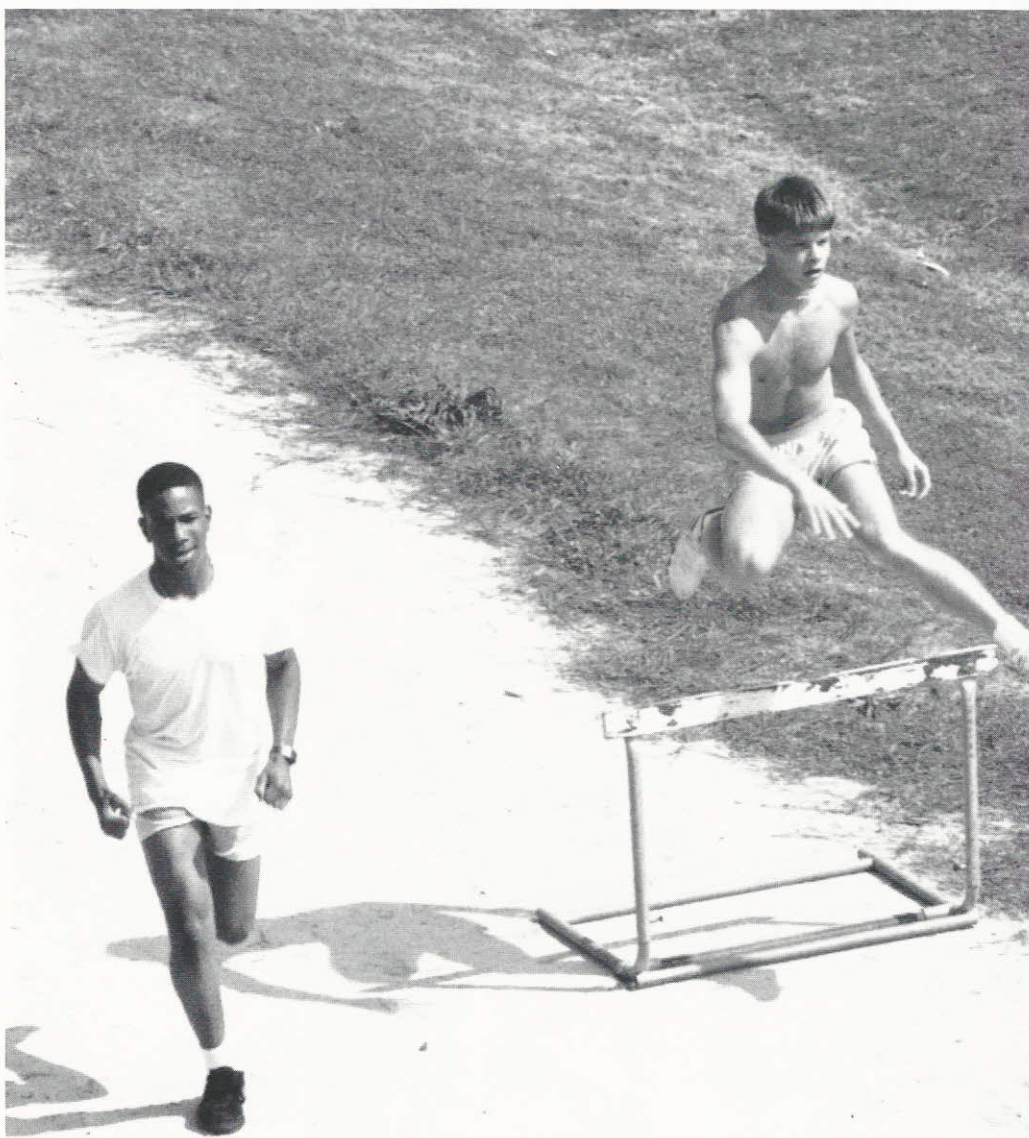

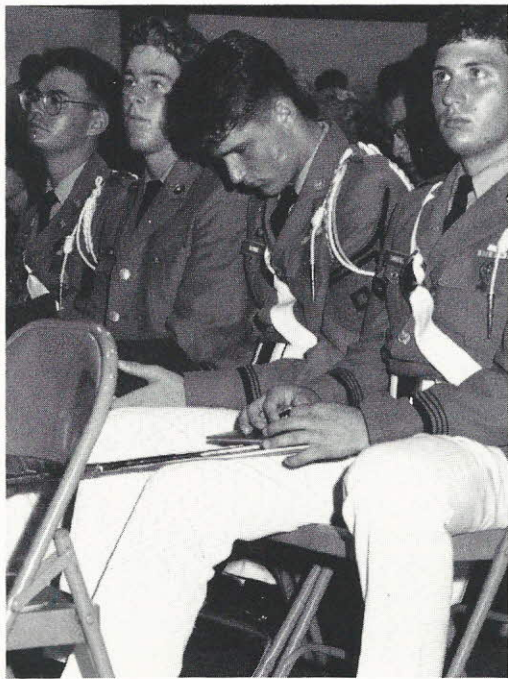
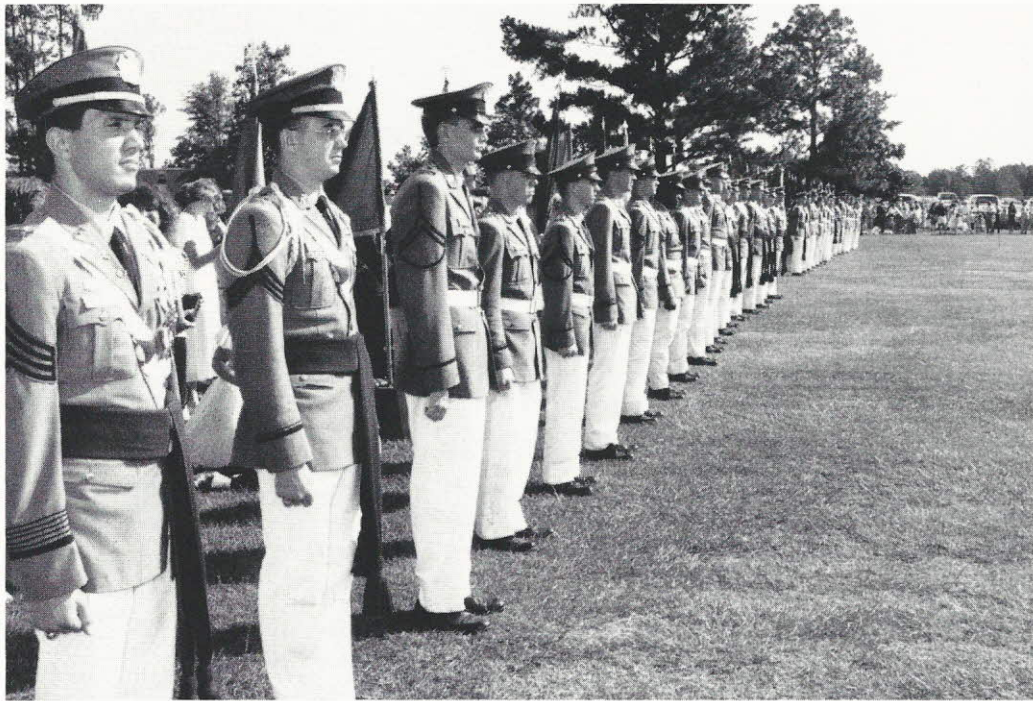
