### THE CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION




After the convocation, everyone enjoyed a delicious barbeque luncheon.




# CMA TACTICAL MISSION




# B Company








The JV Football Team won two games and lost three in 1992. The defense again turned in a strong performance, as each of the Spartan losses was by six or fewer points.

The Spartans split victories with Hammond Academy, lost in two close games with Heathwood Hall, and won a single game face-off with Victory Christian of Augusta, Georgia.



Heading up the offense effort in 1992 was AA Hundley, leading rusher. Outstanding on defense were Al Gittens and JS Russell.













# BASEBALL






Voted Best Midfielder in 1993, Wyatt Durrette comes down hard on this goalie.












