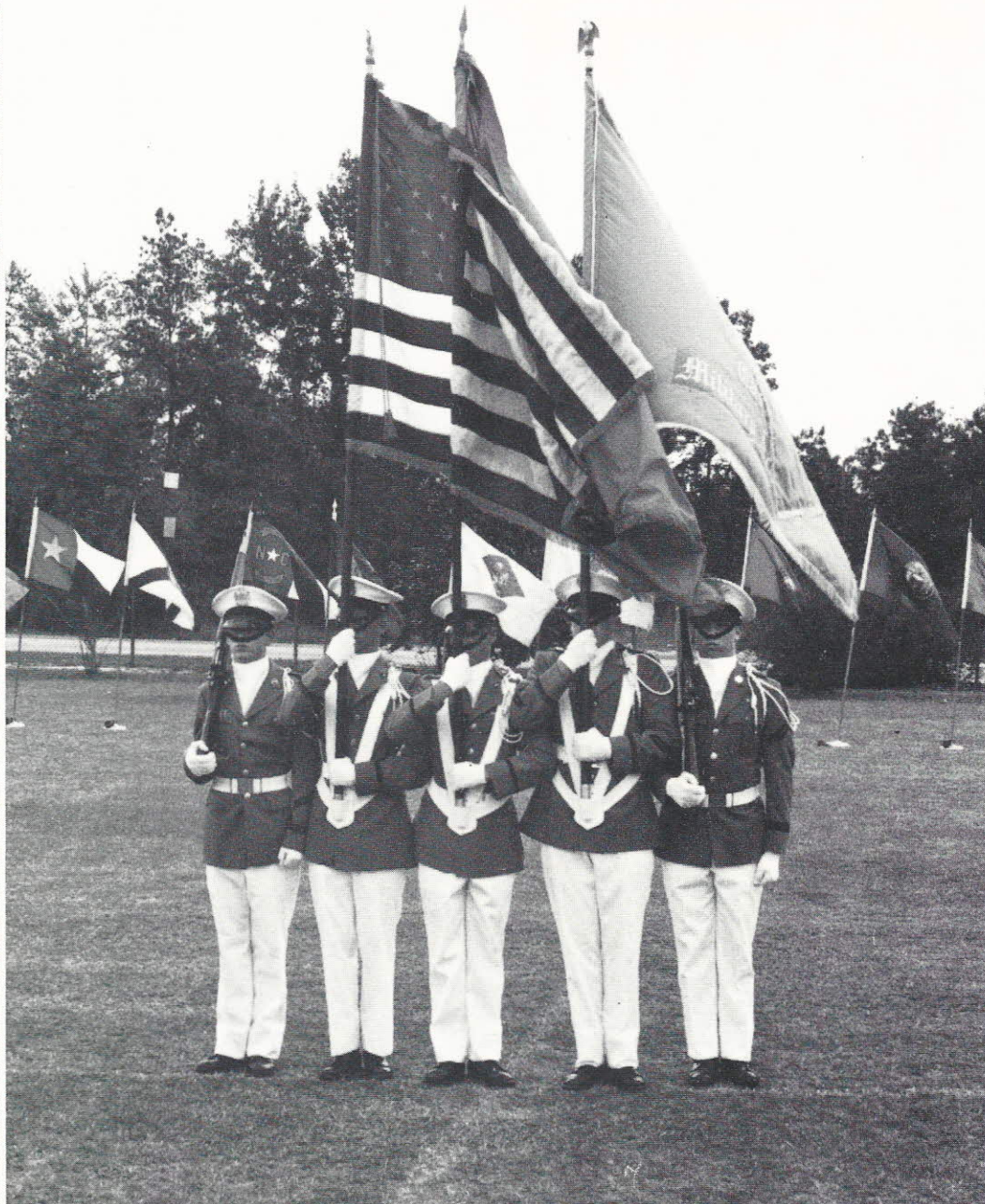

The splendor of beauty.*

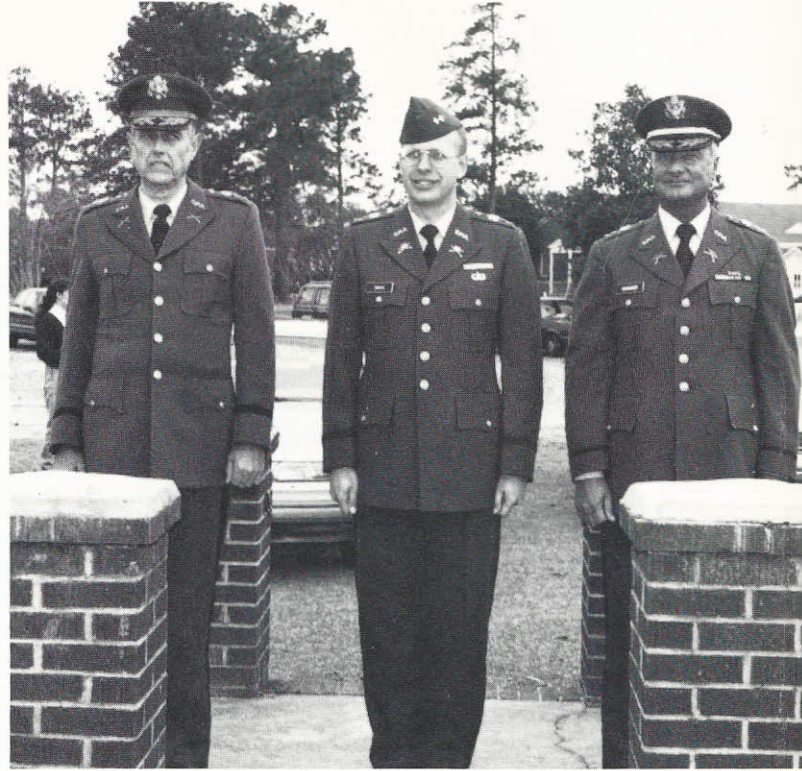
*For yesterday is but a dream,

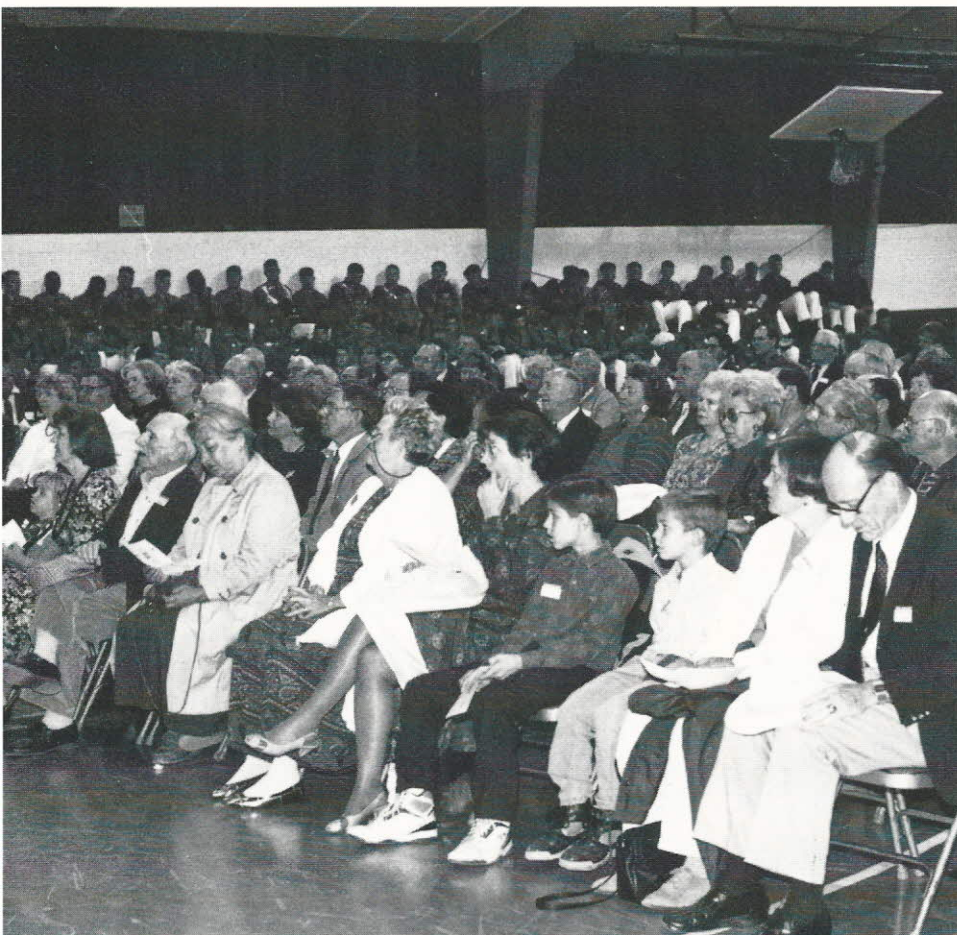
THE CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION

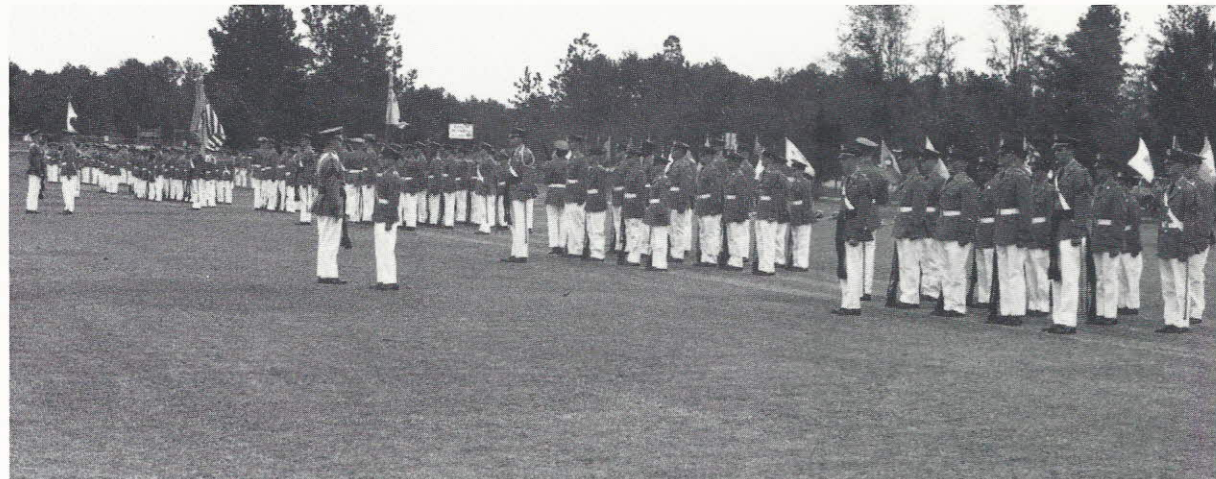

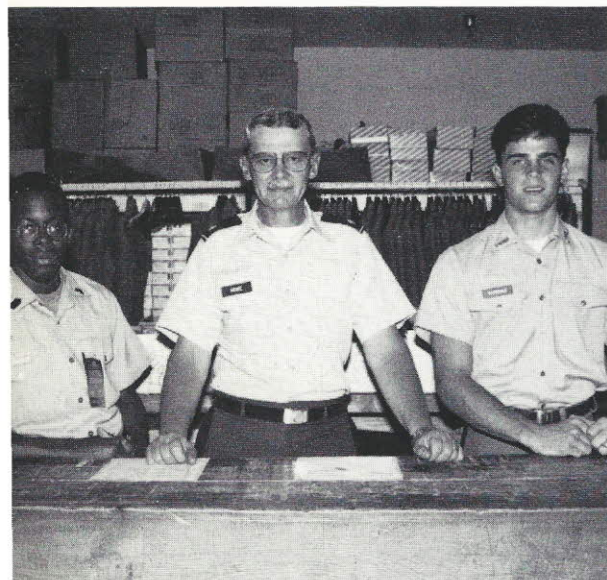
CMA TACTICAL MISSION

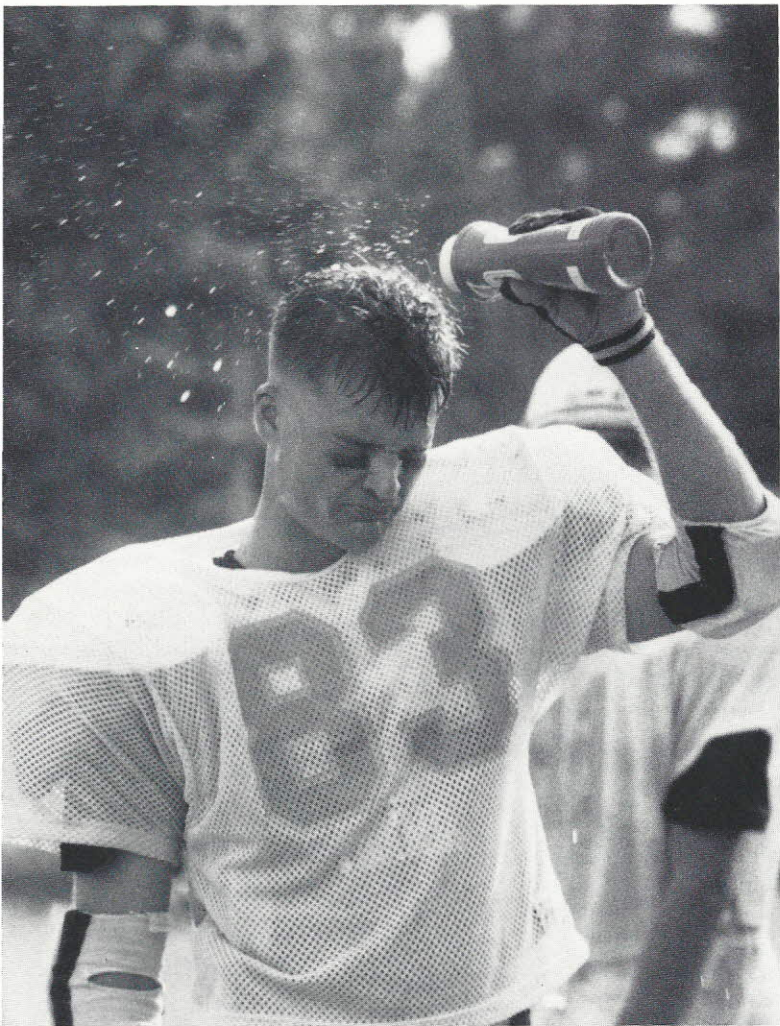

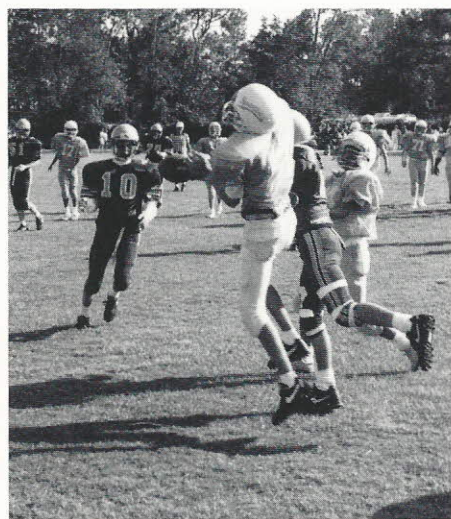
The JV Football Team won two games and lost three in 1992. The defense again turned in a strong performance, as each of the Spartan losses was by six or fewer points.

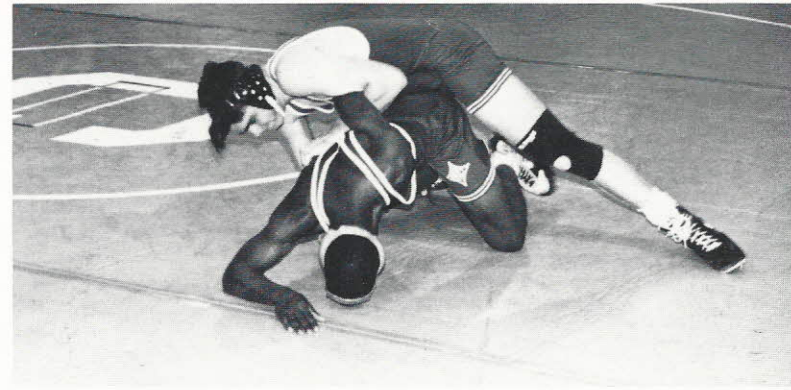
WRESTLING

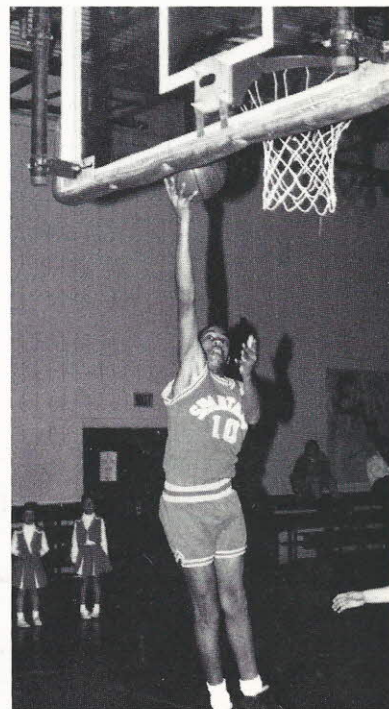

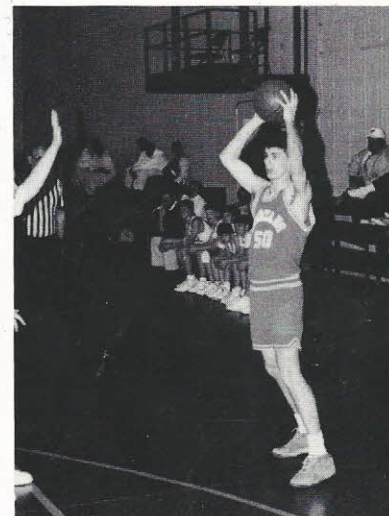

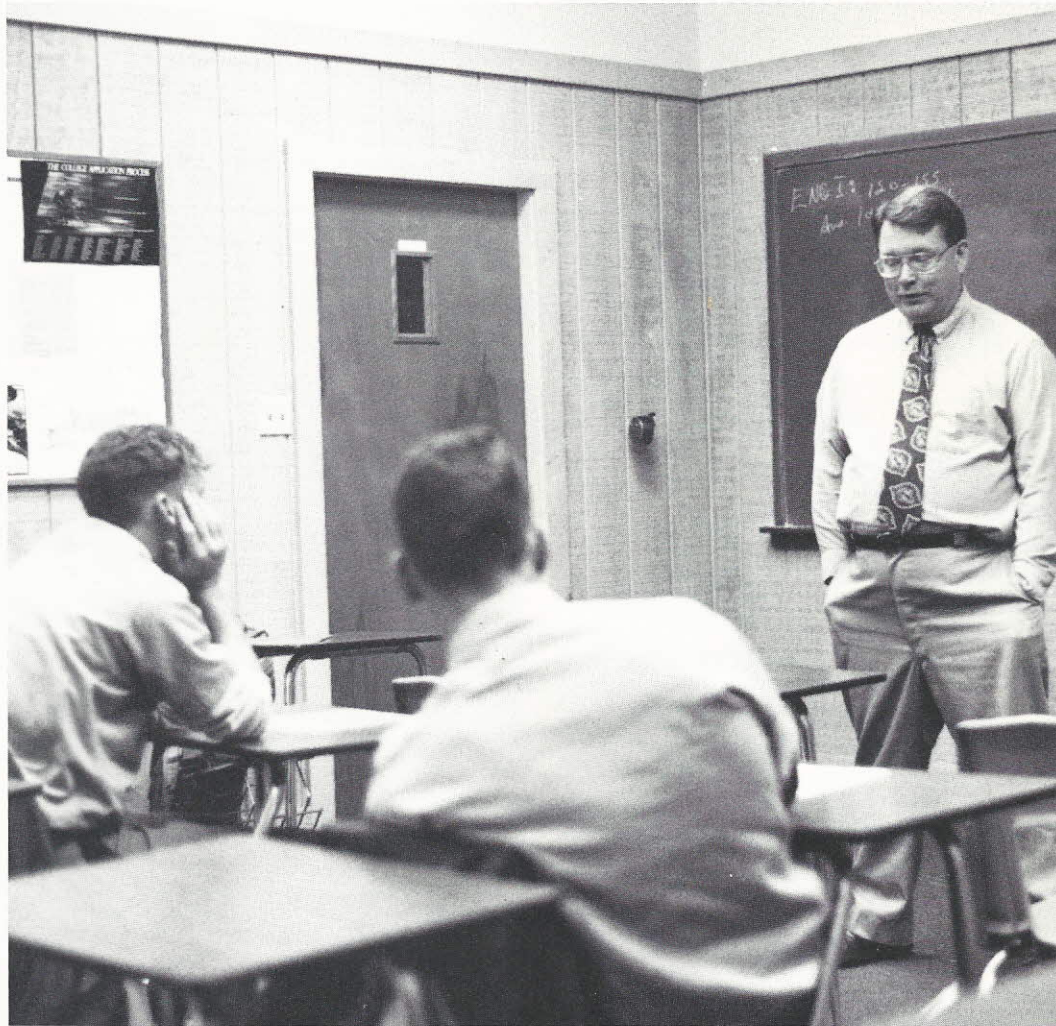

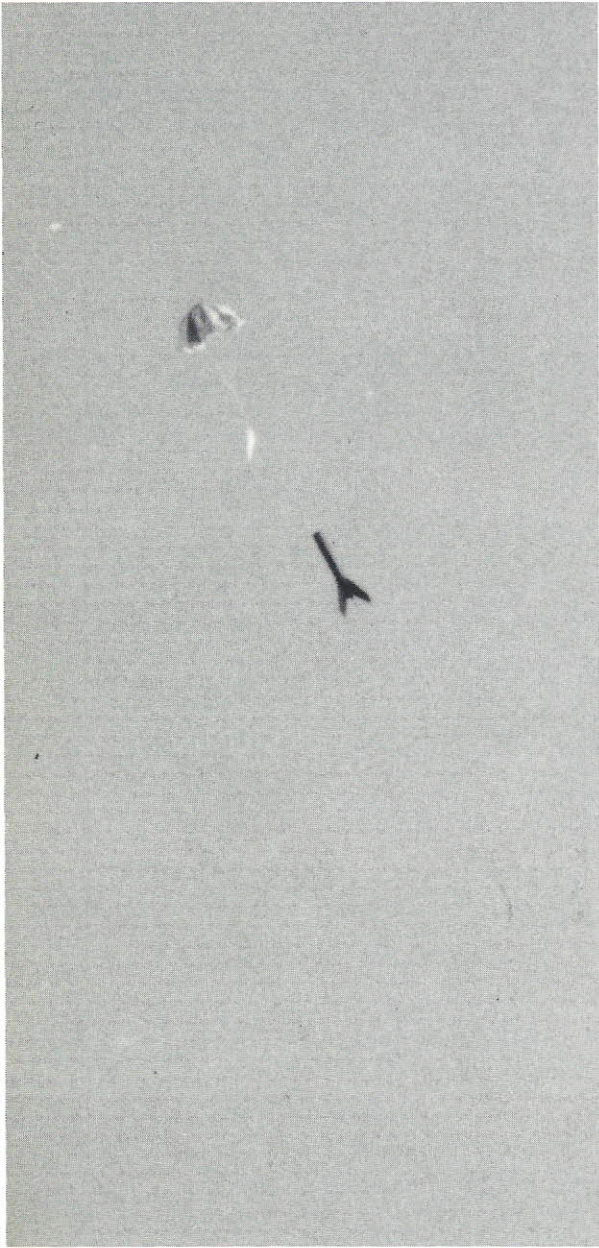

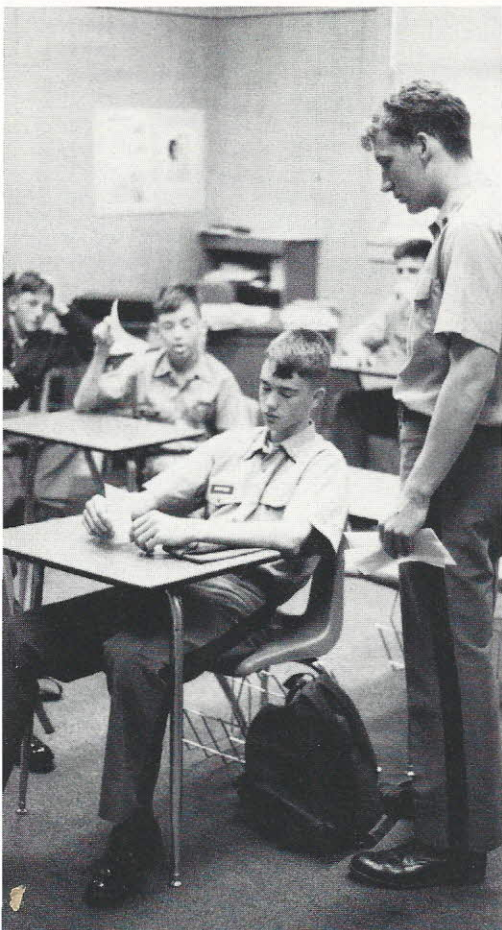

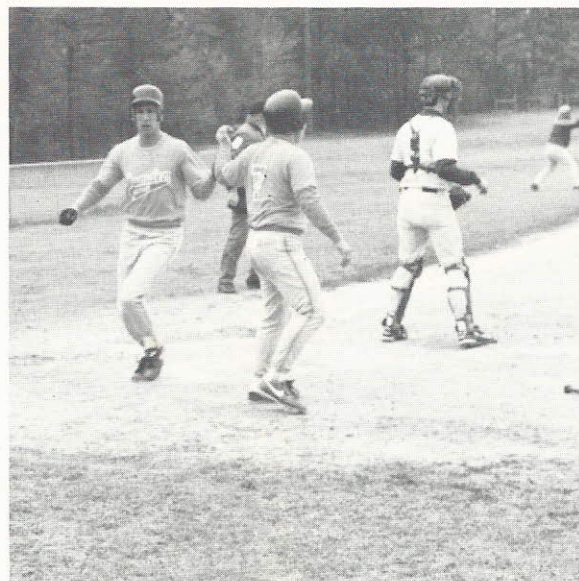

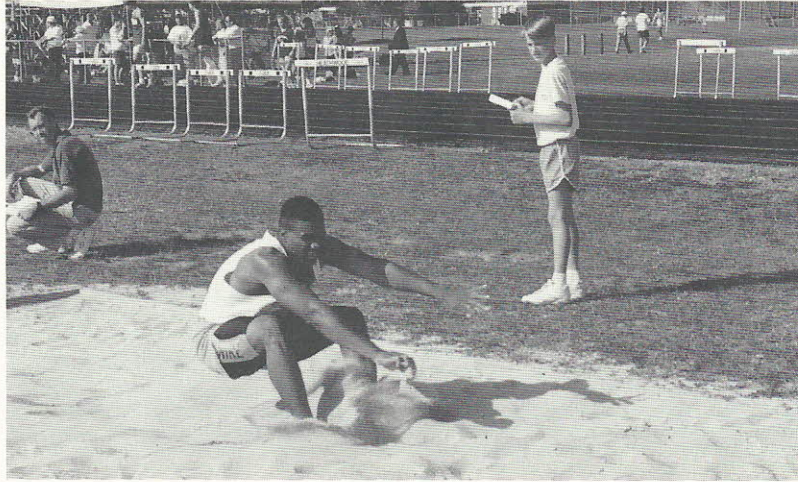

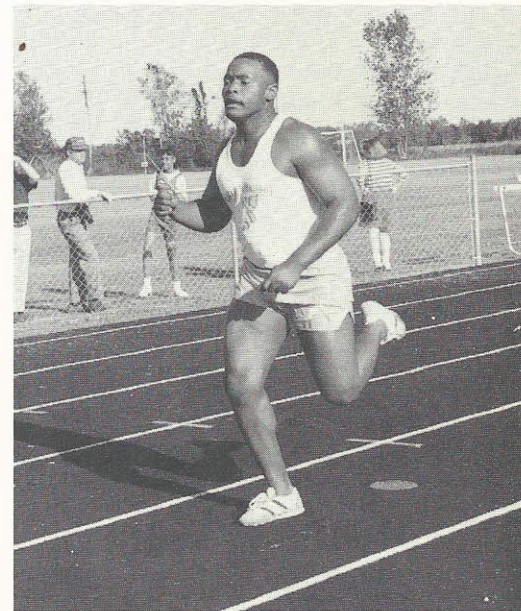

Billy Caldwell spreads his wings as he negotiates the high hurdles.



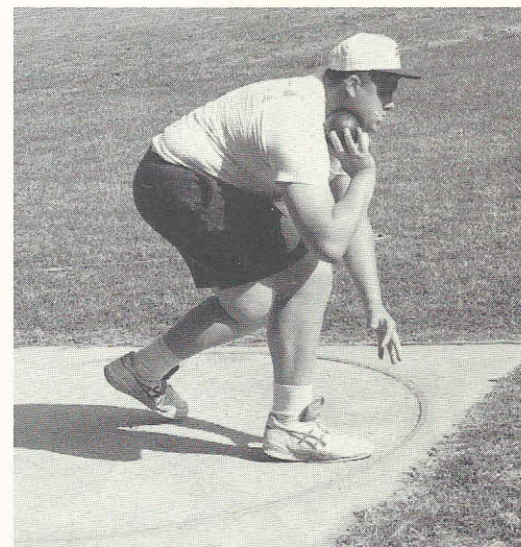

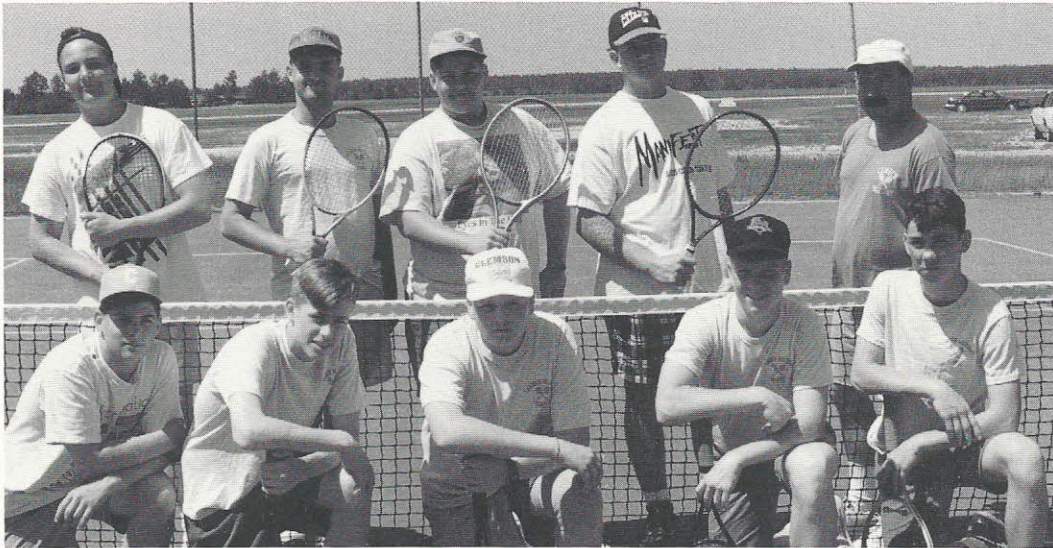

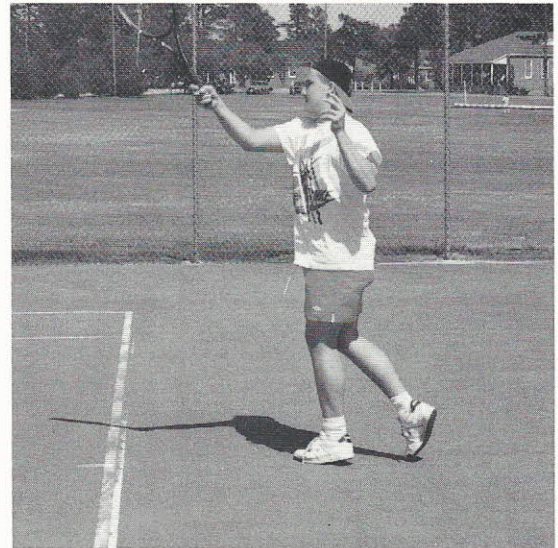

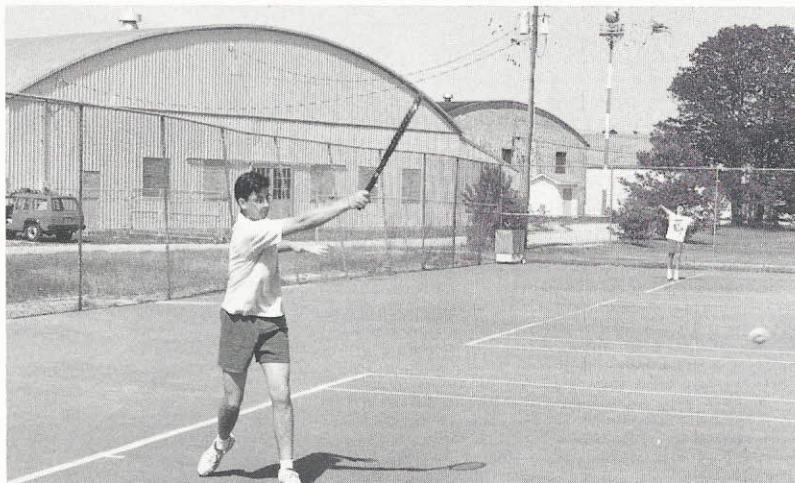


Greg Alexander exhibits a strong forehand as he fires the ball back over the net.

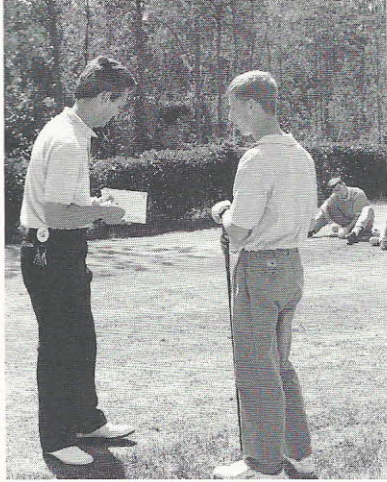

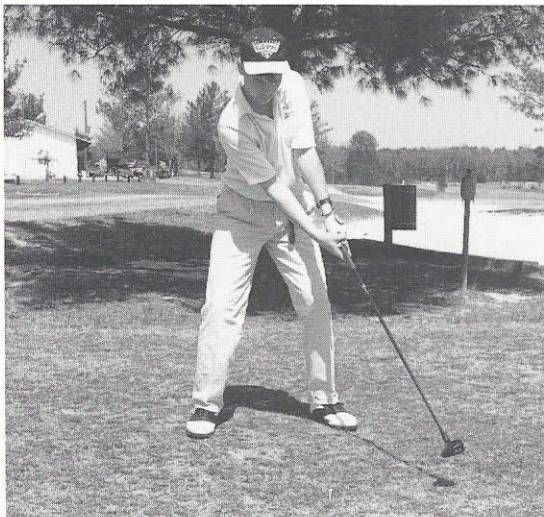

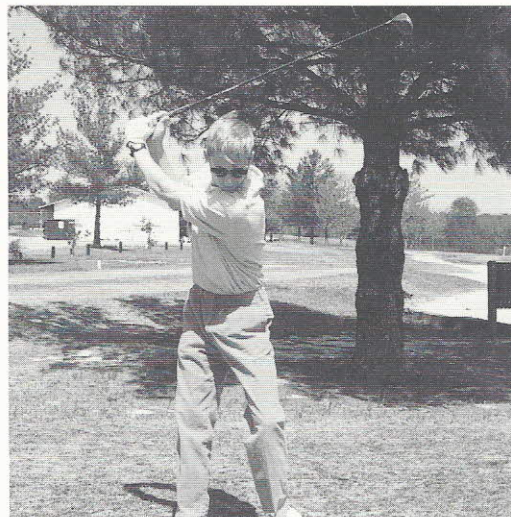

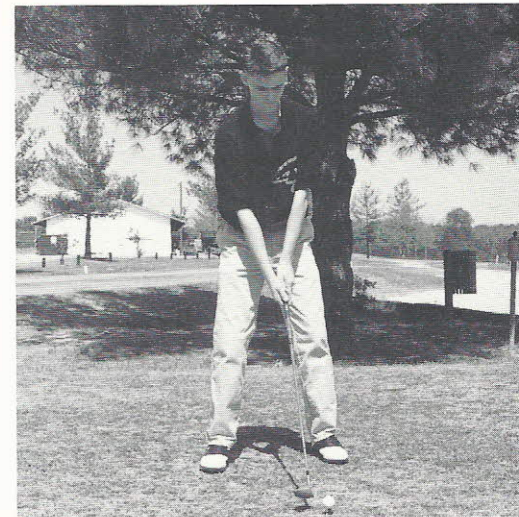
Tripp Blakely, 1993's Most Valuable Player, leads off in action at White Pines.
