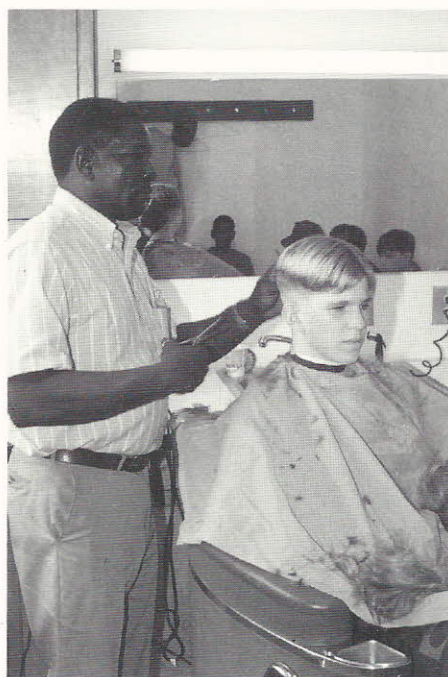

A Fresh Start

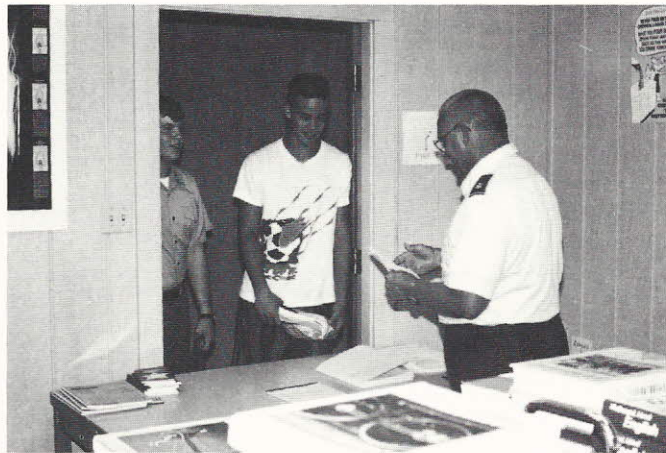

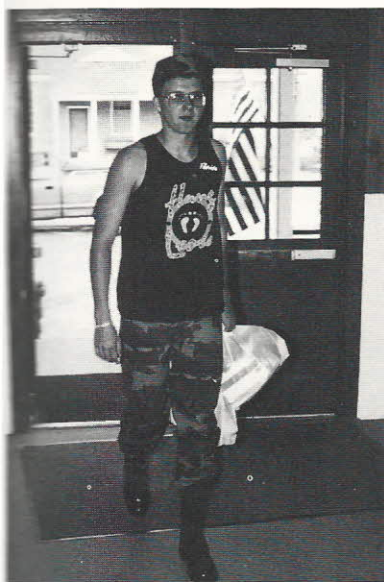

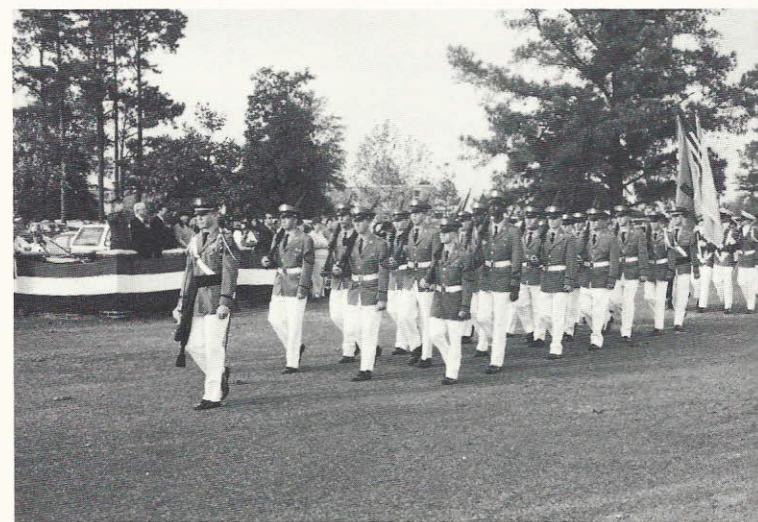

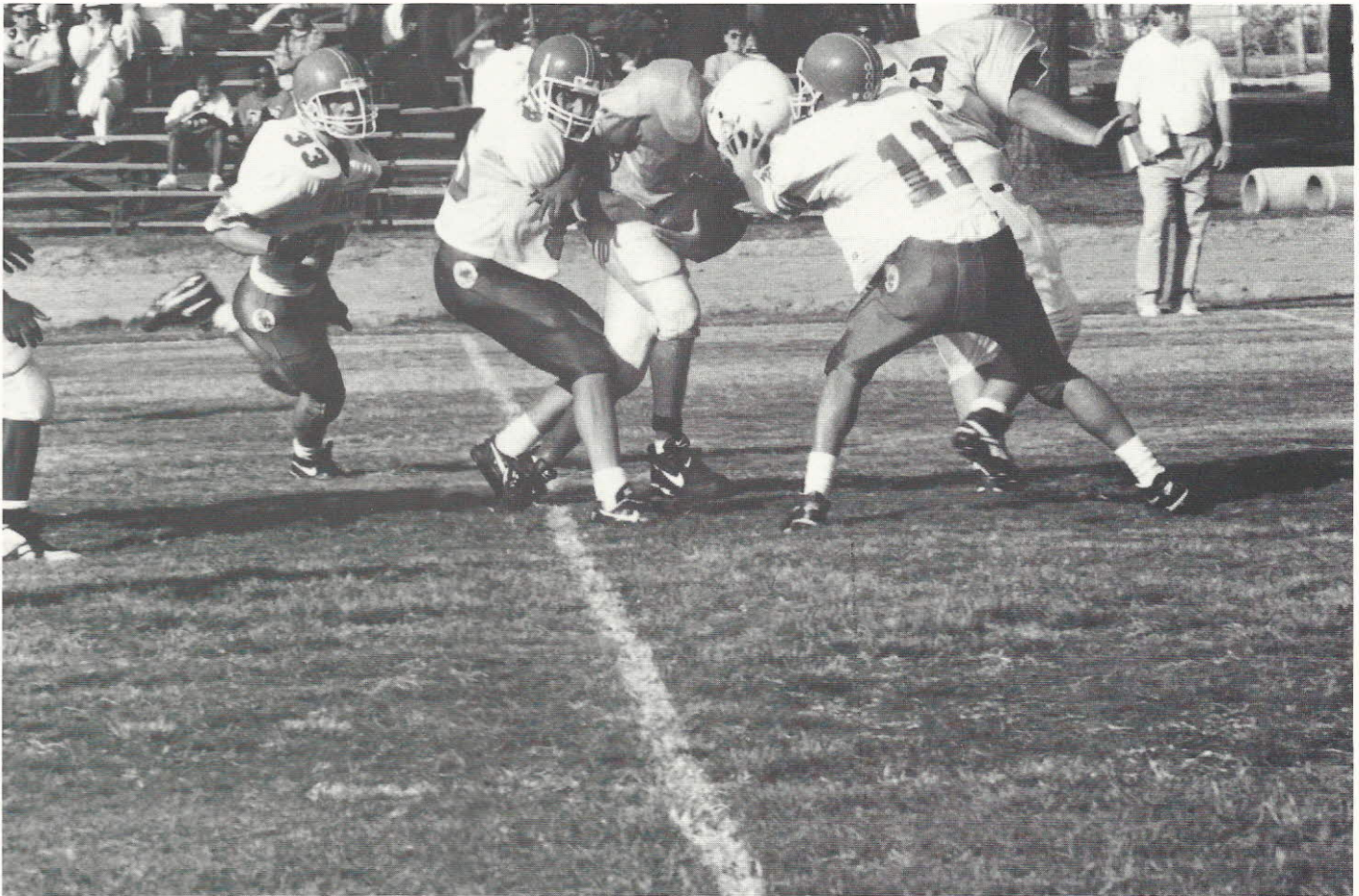

After a 28-20 opening win over Charlotte Latin came an incredible game with Christ Church. The Spartans gained close to 800 yards, yet lost 44-45. The next game brought another loss — to a strong Hammond team. But the Spartans would lose no more in regular season play, tallying five straight wins before falling to Ravenscroft, the eventual state champions.

The highlight of the season was a hard-fought 8-7 victory at Riverside in front of a big Parents'

Weekend crowd. Josh Pressley scrambled for the lone CMA touchdown, and Lynard Gardner rammed in the two-point conversion for the win.

Led by seniors Rod Gonzalez and Allen Sinkler, the whole line was outstanding on offense and defense this year. With Josh Pressley at quarterback, the offense posted big numbers. Lynard Gardner rushed for 1,200 yards in eight regular season games. Ceasar Wright added 750; and Ron Tanner, 300 — plus another 500 on pass receptions.

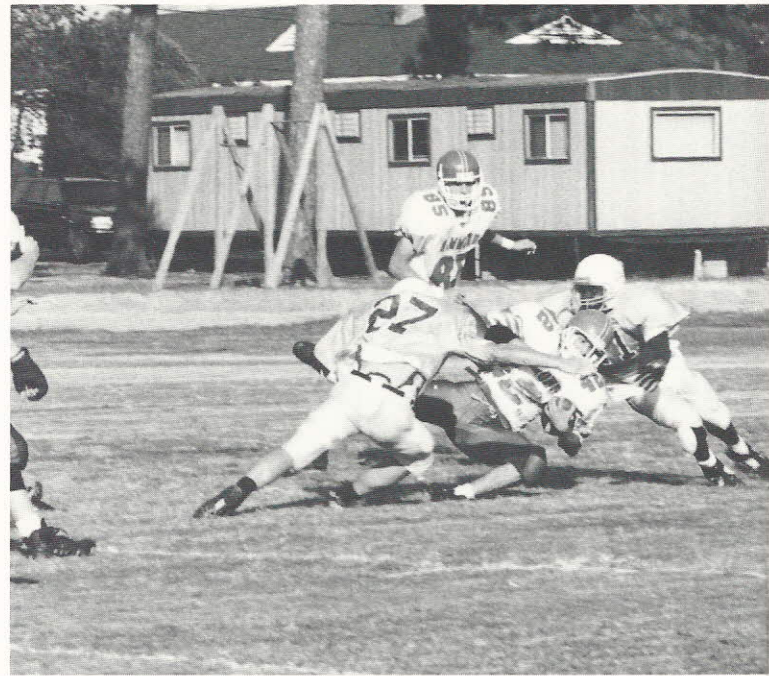

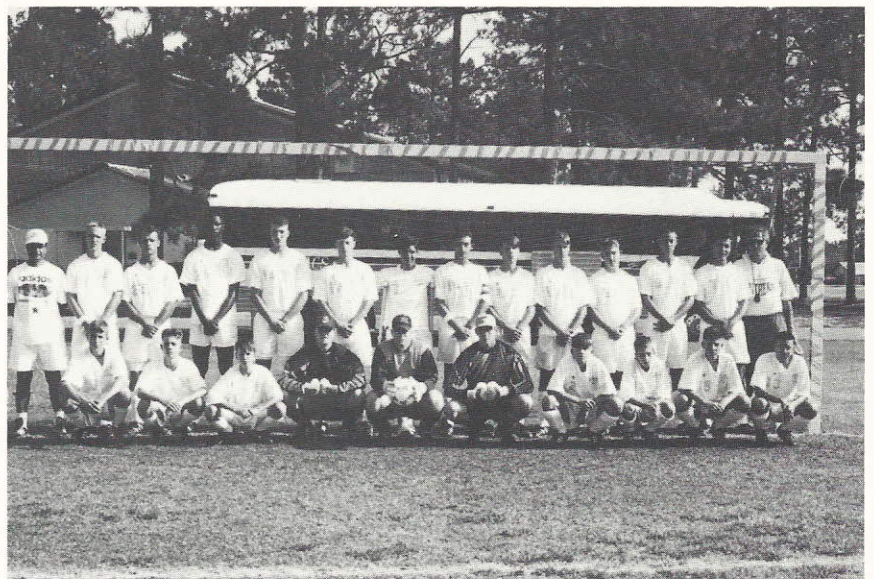


All Conference player and Best Midfielder for the Spartans, Daniel Ragan shows perfect form in a shot at the goal.

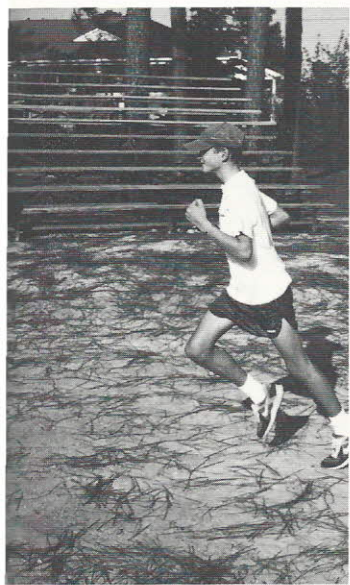

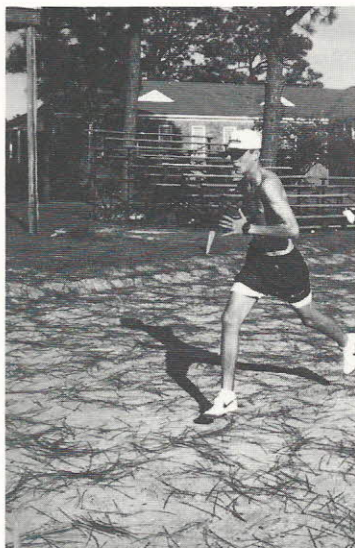

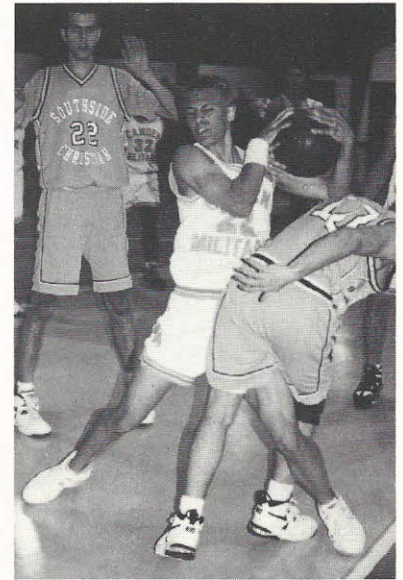

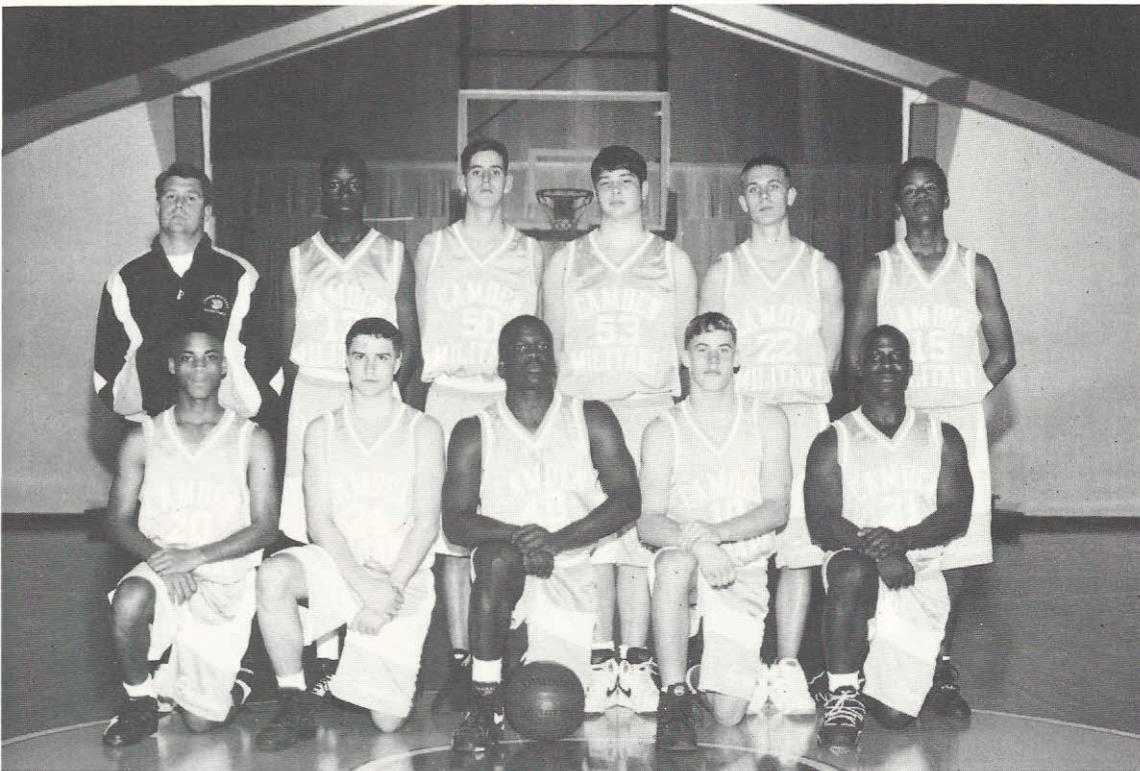

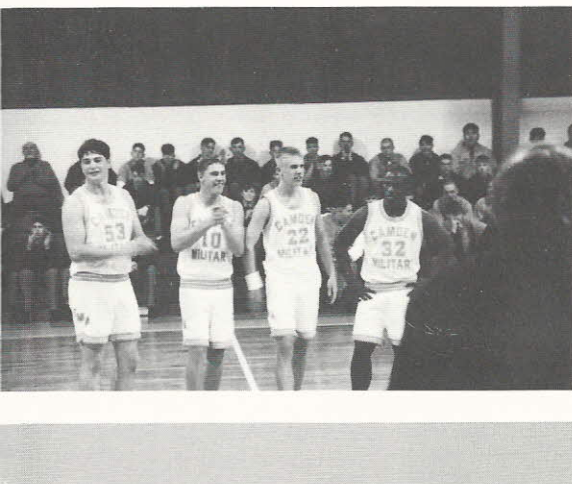

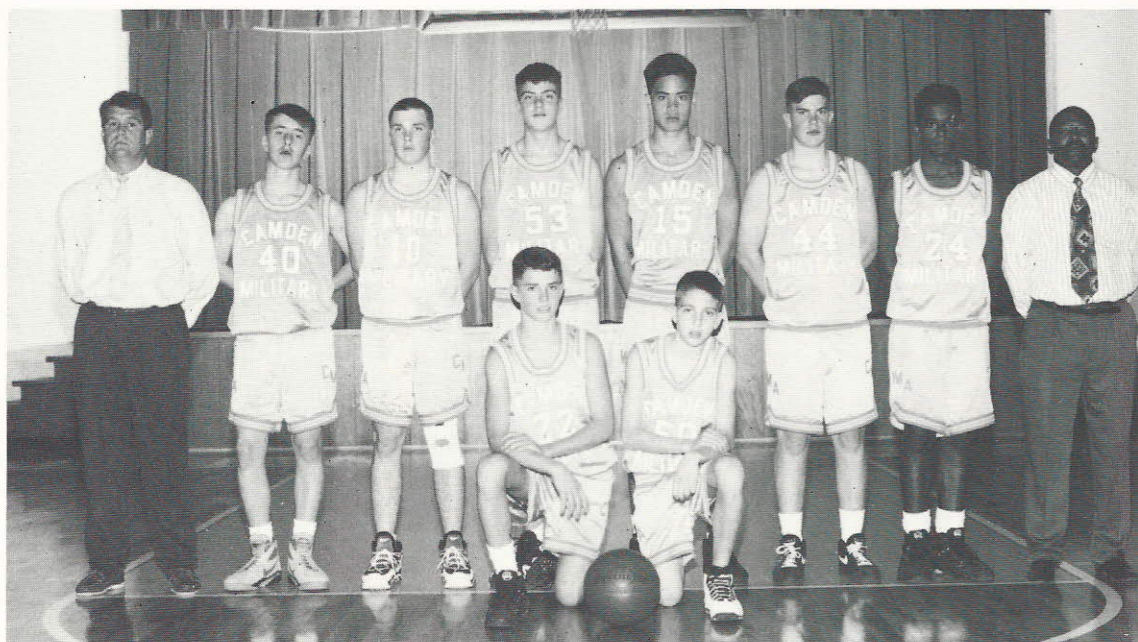
JV Basketball

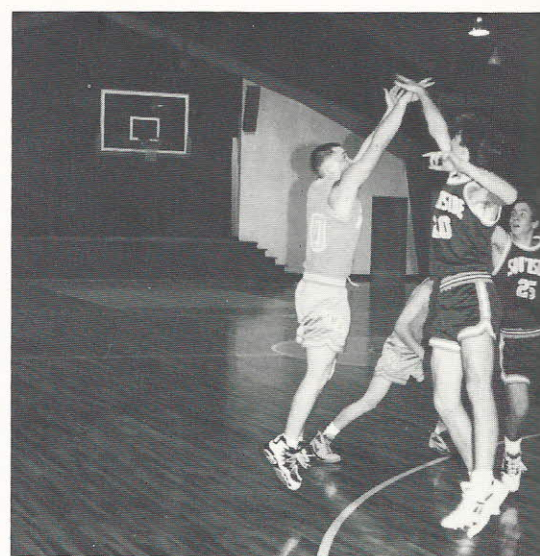

Next year we hope to build on this year's youth and experience, striving towards a team state championship.

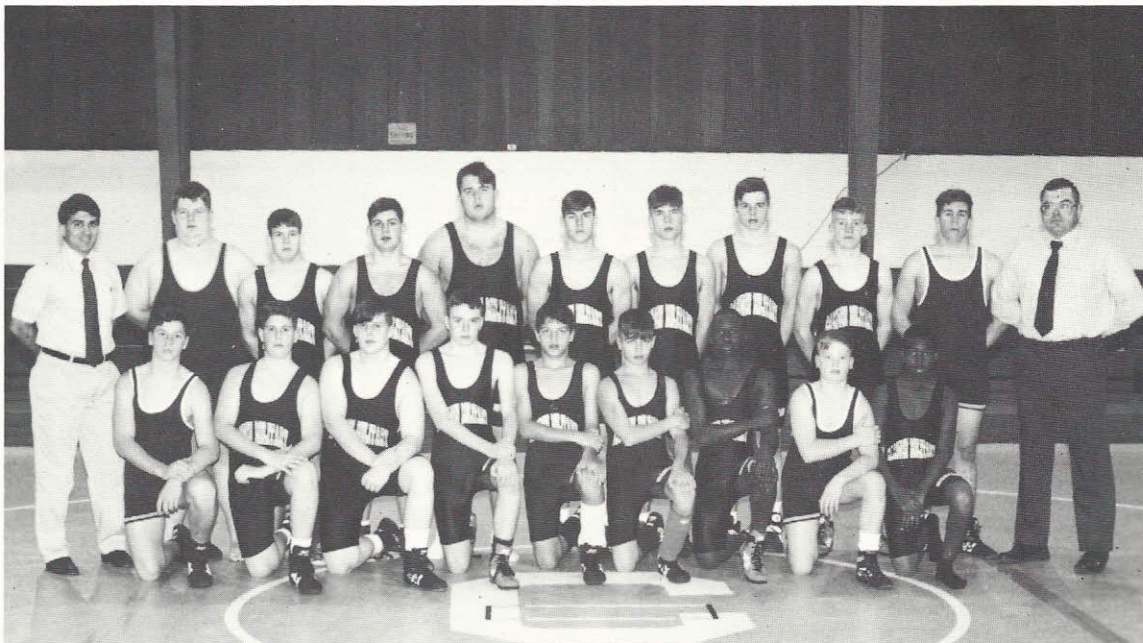


Allen Sinkler sets up his opponent for a takedown.

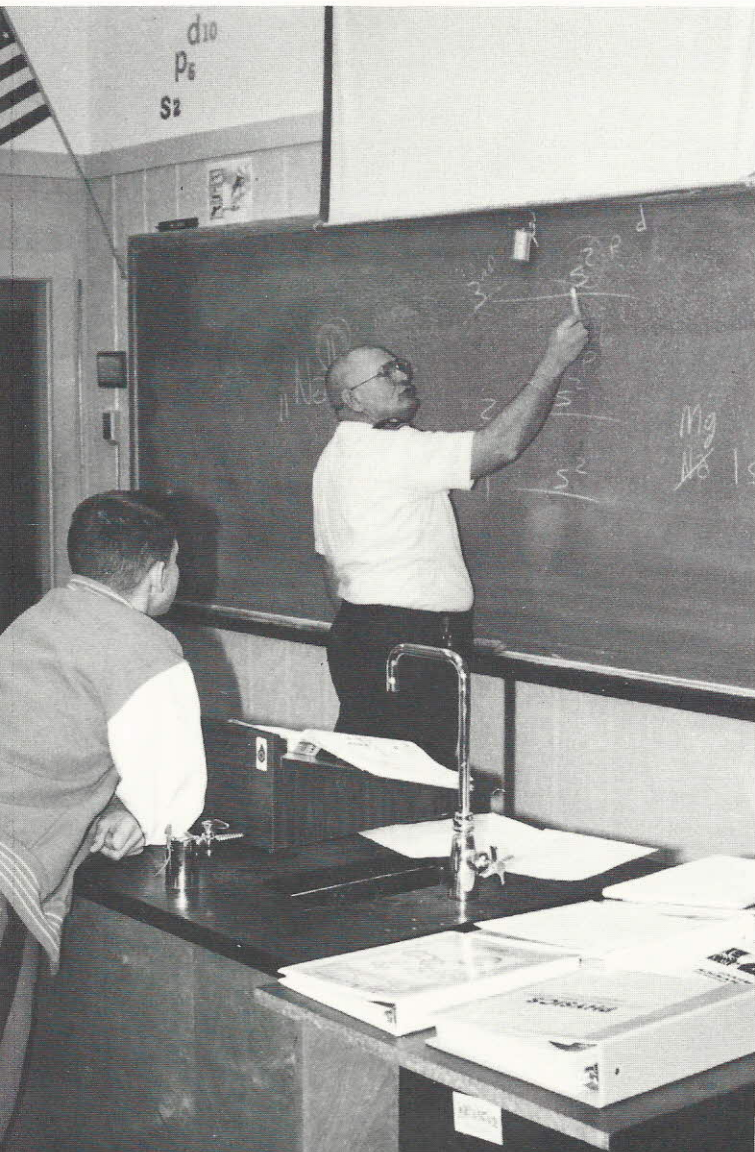

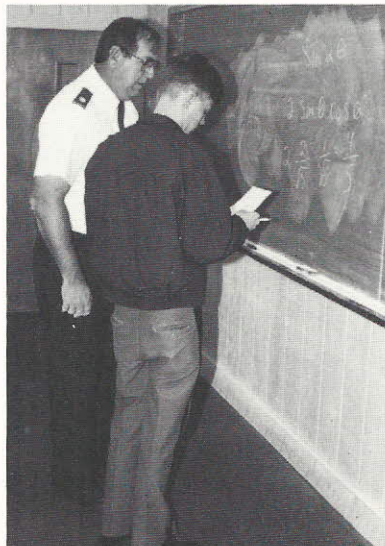

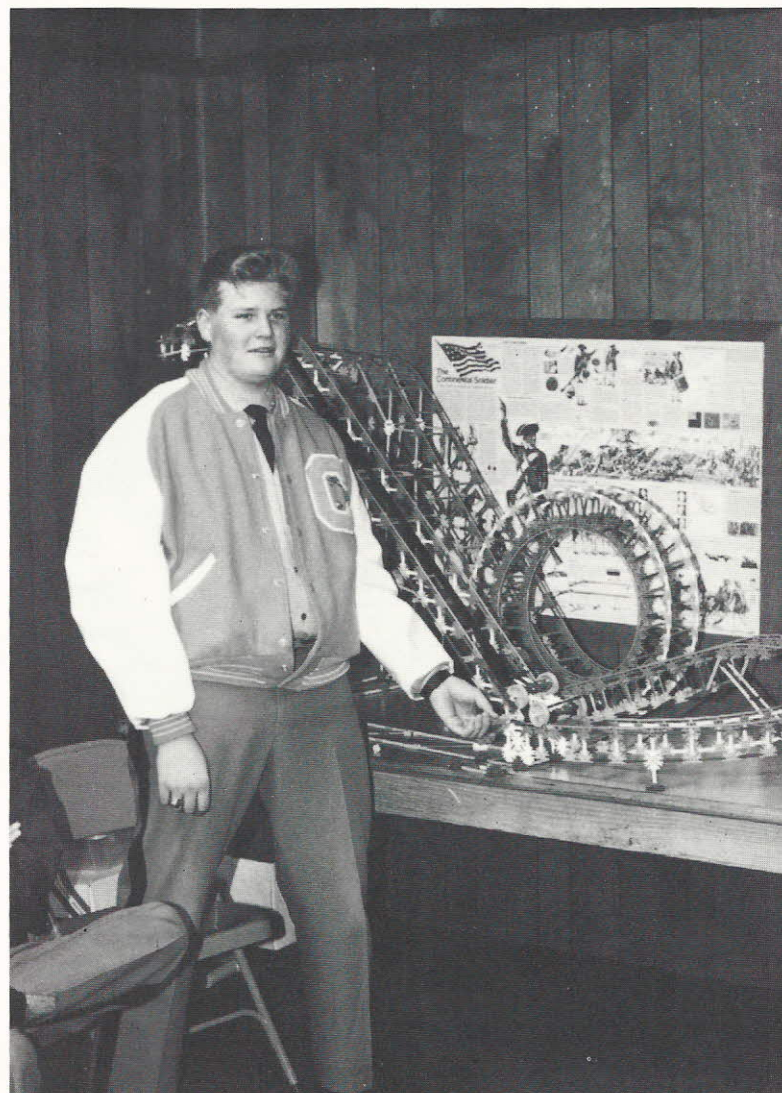

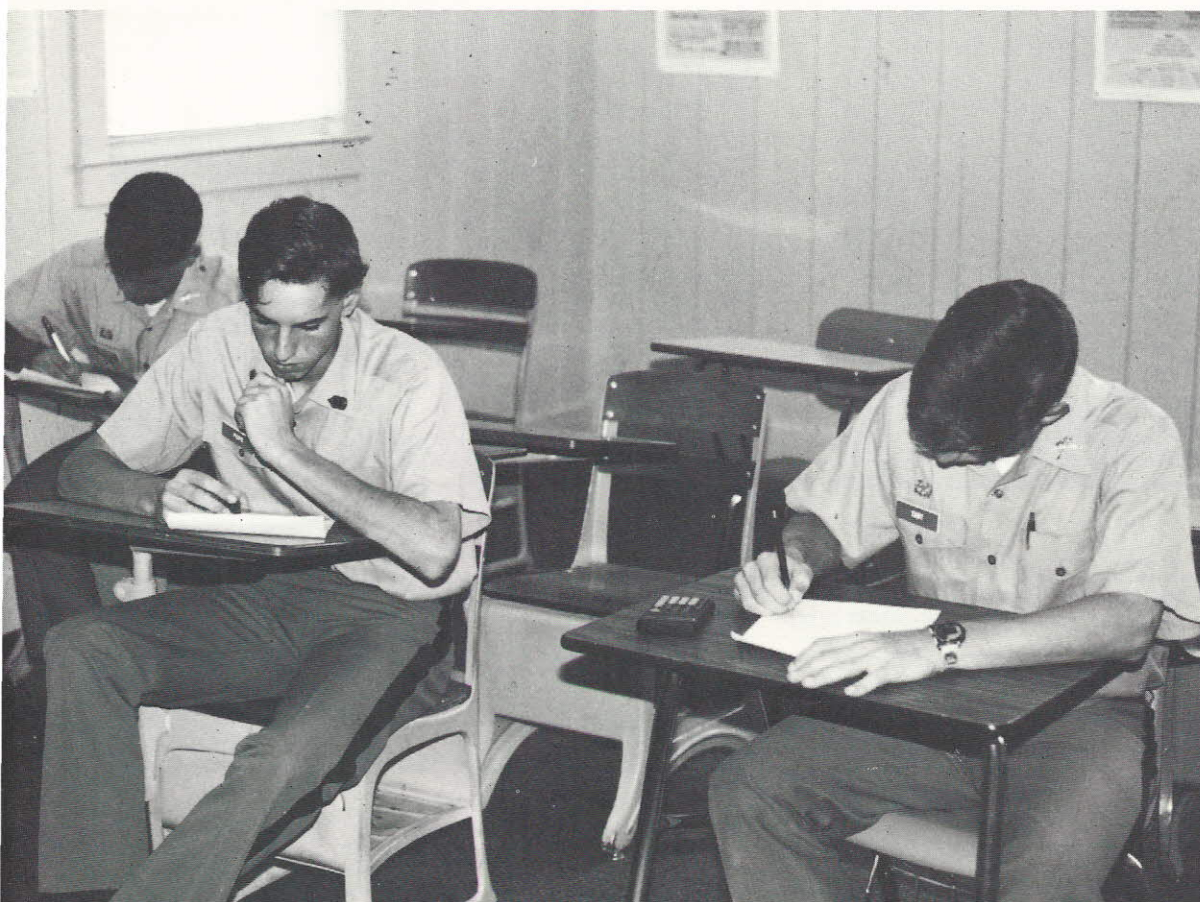

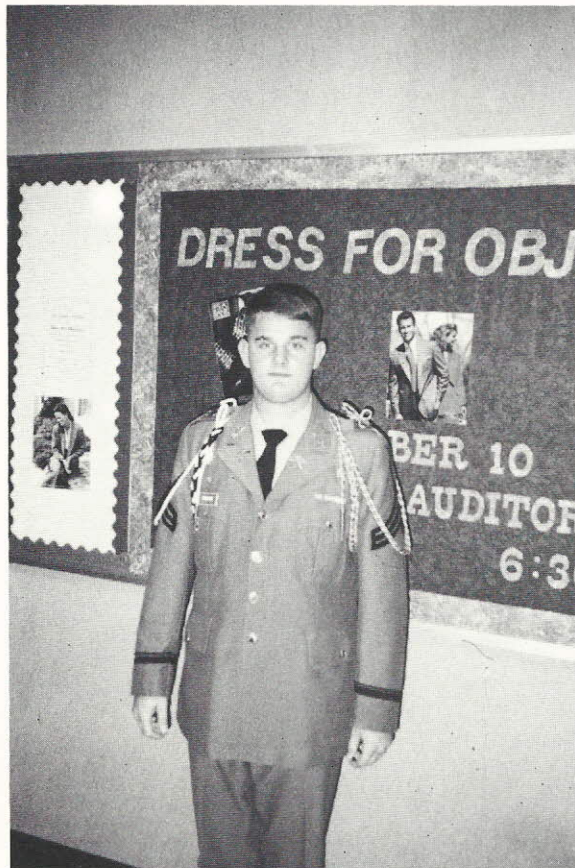
Speech and Debate Team

Camden Military Academy has been a member of the National Forensic League for two decades. During this time the Academy has produced both regional and national level competitors under the tutelage of LTC (Chaplain) Robert G. Swager, US (Ret.), and LTC Kelly R. Schrader, our present Academic Dean. The NFL was founded in 1925 at Ripon College, Ripon, Wisconsin, as a high school speech and debate honor society represented in 2,500 schools nationwide. Over 842,572 students and teachers have gained membership, including such notables as former Vice-President Hubert Humphrey, newswoman Jane Pauley, actor James Dean, and TV host Oprah Winfrey. The league sponsors awards based upon participation and success in various categories of speech and debate events.

This school year the Academy has accumulated more than 300 NFL points by entering a team in regional

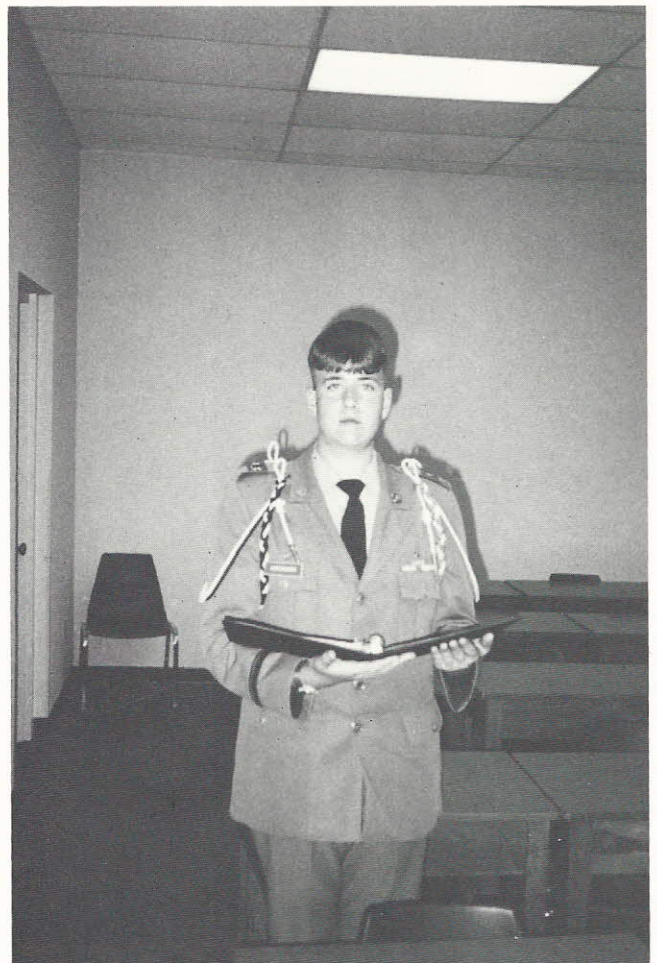

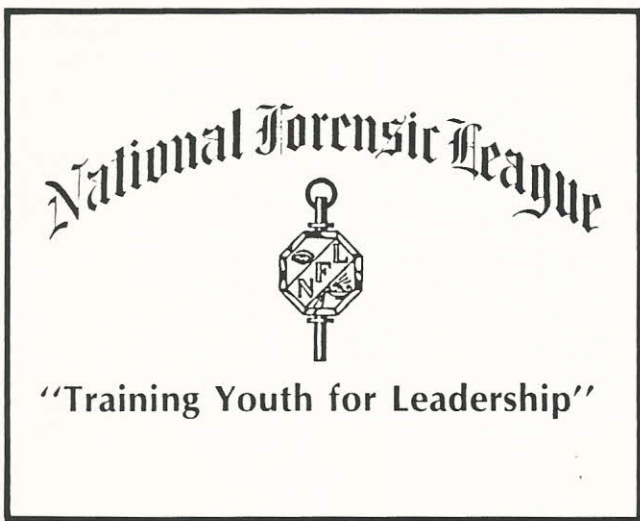


Senior Matthew B. Pfeiffer from Baton Rouge, LA, earned his initial membership by competing in extemporaneous speaking.

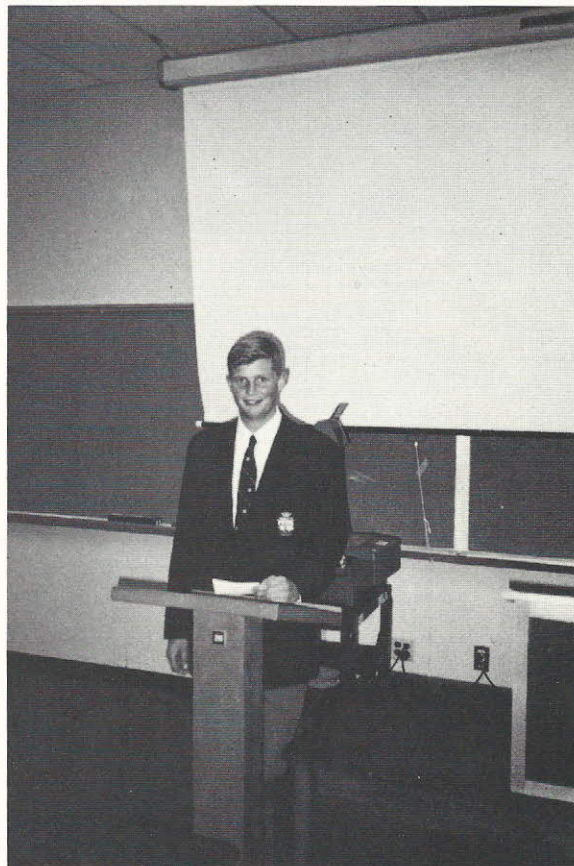
