




























Jonathan Cooper In Memoriam June 5, 1977 — July 27, 1995

In July we lost our friend Jonathan Cooper. He had been with us since the eighth grade and would have been a senior this year.

Jonathan was Cherokee and proud of his heritage. On the wall of his room in B Company, he prominently displayed Cherokee art and poetry.

Jonathan was quiet, but once engaged in conversation, he could easily hold his own. He especially liked to talk about his home and his family.

Jonathan was generous. He was quick to lend or give his possessions. Although he enjoyed material things himself, he seemed to derive greater pleasure from sharing them with others.

Jonathan was a strong athlete, lettering in both tennis and football. He started as offensive tackle on two Spartan conference championship teams. He won the Coach's Award for outstanding performance in 1994.

Jonathan was hard working and persistent. He was always the first player to show up for football practice. As a cadet, he held the rank of master sergeant and commanded the Cannon Detail. He was an Eagle Scout and served actively in his church.

Jonathan was a loyal friend and inspired loyalty in others. We miss him, and we will always preserve his place and memory at Camden Military Academy.





To college professors who inherited his students, he was a teacher who prepared his pupils well to meet the greater challenge of college-level studies.







Honor and Pride






















Varsity Basketball




Jimmy Pollard launches a perimeter jump shot over the opposing player.












We were proud of the many positive comments made by other team's wrestlers and their parents regarding the sportsmanship and gentlemanly demeanor of our wrestlers.












