# Continuing the Tradition


In 1992, when Colonel Lanning P. Risher informed the board of trustees that he was contemplating retirement from his position as headmaster of Camden Military Academy, he also had the task of hiring a new commandant. Colonel Risher chose LTC William K. Orris, a West Point graduate who had earned a master's degree in education from Auburn University. After a successful Army career, LTC Orris was pursuing opportunities in education. The Camden opening was particularly appealing because of his military background.

LTC Orris assumed the commandant's duties in December of 1992. By the year's end Colonel Risher was so impressed by LTC Orris's leadership and administrative abilities that he proposed him to the board of trustees' search committee as a candidate for headmaster. The committee nominated LTC Orris and named him assistant headmaster in preparation for taking over the fulltime duties.


Quickly grasping the dimensions and details of his role during the 1993-1994 school term, LTC Orris displayed the qualities that the board of trustees had sought in a headmaster who would continue the Camden tradition: a heartfelt concern for the care and education of young men, a real understanding of the spirit and mission of Camden Military Academy, the ability to make intelligent administrative decisions, and possession of a sound business sense, a necessity for survival in a highly competitive environment. Before the school term ended, Colonel Lanning P. Risher officially retired, and Colonel William K. Orris became the new headmaster of Camden Military Academy.

Under the direction of Colonel Orris, the Academy is thriving. Enrollment is full, and there is a waiting list. The faculty and staff are strong, and graduates continue to enter the colleges of their choice. New computers have been placed in the library--with an internet connection--and in the classrooms. Moreover, the library has acquired many new titles. The most visible physical improvements are the Administration Building, the track and field facility, the swimming pool, and two new faculty homes; but the list is much longer: air-conditioning and renovations in the barracks and upgrades in the classrooms, the dining hall, and the gymnasium. Outside, there are new walkways, landscaping, and irrigation systems. All of these changes have enhanced the quality of life and learning at Camden Military Academy.

For these contributions, for his dedication to the care and education of young men, and for his forward-looking leadership as we embark upon the new millennium, we the Cadet Corps of Camden Military Academy respectfully dedicate the 1999 edition of *Excalibur* to Colonel William K. Orris.





#### The Cadet Challenge

Cadet life at Camden Military Academy has changed drastically during the past few years: air-conditioned barracks, a new swimming pool; winter, spring, and fall vacations in addition to Christmas, Thanksgiving, and Easter; more furlough weekends; and more trips, both educational and recreational. Clubs and organizations exist that appeal to almost every preference. Both intramural and interscholastic sports invite every cadet's participation. Video, audio, and computer devices are omnipresent, having both entertainment and educational utility. Today's challenge to CMA cadets, and to young people everywhere, is not finding something entertaining, engrossing, or absorbing to do, but selecting carefully among that which is available, spending a judicious amount of time engaged in those chosen activities, then devoting the bulk of one's time to the primary role of being a student. Every institution in society--from the family, to the church, to the government, to the schools-clearly states or implies that the primary role of every young person is to be a successful student. All other roles are ancillary. Given that fact, the greatest challenge to young people is to channel their energies in the proper direction--a difficult feat, with all the distractions present; but the military structure at Camden Military Academy is a powerful aid in helping young men learn self-discipline, in helping them make wise choices that will lead to academic success.


























































### To Fort Jackson, Once Again



### **People of Quality**



CPT Thane Maness is making his mark in the Social Studies Department as a knowledgeable teacher of world history and government. CPT Maness also coaches junior varsity football.



### **The Military Tradition**




### Battlin' Bravo

# **Excitement in Sports**































### **Outside the Classroom**










