



Entering the New Millennium

Nearly a decade ago, Camden-Carlisle celebrated its centennial, commemorating 100 years of service to the young men of the state, the nation, and many parts of the world. As we complete this last year of the twentieth century, Camden Military Academy is experiencing an exciting period of growth, in size and in stature. We are committed to placing the Academy in the top tier of military schools in the United States.

This year we have taken visible steps in that direction. Owing to an across-the-board recruiting effort, our enrollment now stands at 270, the highest in our history. The acquisition of adjacent property has enabled us to add a soccer field. We have been able to attract and retain a faculty of talented and caring teachers. We have been successful in enrolling a corps of fine young men with good potential and character. We have continued our campus beautification program, as well as our efforts to upgrade the barracks, especially privacy features in the bath areas. We have increased opportunities for cadet athletic participation. For example, our nocut policy enabled 140 cadets to participate in some level of football this year. Moreover, we have added more computers in the library and in classrooms and have substantially increased internet accessibility.

An important decision made recently will significantly affect the destiny of Camden Military Academy. Upon the recommendation of the headmaster, the Board of Trustees has decided to make the Academy a 300 cadet school. To that end, construction on new barracks will begin this spring, with the idea of adding more barracks until all cadets reside in modern, comfortable quarters. Some of the old barracks will be converted to classrooms; others will be razed. We anticipate that within three years, not only will all cadets live in new housing, but also construction will have been completed on a new fieldhouse and a chapel.

Physical facilities are very important to a school because they enable students to live and learn in a safe, clean, and comfortable environment conducive to their best efforts; but the Academy will continue to focus equally on measures designed to attract the best faculty available and to improve and strengthen the academic program, with an emphasis on thoroughly preparing our young men to succeed in college level studies.



































Challenges of the New Millennium



People in the New Millennium


The leadership of Camden Military Academy has decided to make the Academy a 300 cadet institution by the next school term. Enrollment at this time already stands at 275; therefore, attaining the desired population is virtually assured. The Academy, however, will enroll only those students who possess the same good character that is typical of our present cadet corps and will add only those instructors and staff who meet our high standards. Growth in quality will be commensurate with the increase in physical size. Camden Military Academy is its people: a corps of young men with good potential and character and a caring and competent faculty and staff to guide them.



During a period of rapid growth in the CMA student population, Gene McCaskill, director of admissions, and Casey Robinson, assistant director, frequently find themselves at the computer. The Academy's enrollment is up over ten percent from last year and will increase by at least that much for the next school term.



Joining the CMA faculty this year was Bob Whitmire (CMA '89) one of three alumni presently on the faculty. In addition to his duties as an English and Spanish instsructor, Bob coaches JV football and JV golf. A graduate of the College of Charleston, Bob distinguished himself as valedictorian of the CMA Class of '89. He was also class president his senior year, president of the FCA, and a member of the football team.



Another alumnus, Ricardo Priester (CMA '94), joined the faculty at the beginning of second semester. From CMA, he went to Wingate College on a full basketball scholarship. A player of superior ability, Ricardo was invited to try out with the Charlotte Hornets of the NBA and still has some professional options. He teaches science and mathematics and is assistant varsity basketball coach. Ricardo is slated to assume the duties of head basketball coach next season.




Battlin' Bravo
























































