


Growth with Quality

Approximately a year ago, the Camden Military Academy Board of Trustees, at the request of the headmaster, decided to make the Academy a 300 cadet school. Pursuant to the Board's decision, we immediately began to implement our plan to increase enrollment. Implementation involved recruiting new cadets, building the physical facilities to house and educate them, adding the personnel necessary to accommodate the increased numbers, and continuing to improve all aspects of the Academy programs and quality of living.

Owing to the high demand for the Academy's educational services and to the fine efforts of the Development Office and other responsible persons, recruitment has been highly successful. We opened this school year with 281 cadets. That number now stands at 310. It is our goal to be the best 300 cadet military school in the United States. We have no plans to expand beyond that number.

Construction is proceeding in a timely manner. Cadets will soon move into a comfortable new 12,000 square foot barracks. Two temporary classroom buildings have been added, pending new construction. The three to five-year building plan includes an auditorium, chapel, and classroom complex which will house English, humanities, and fine arts in one department; a new gymnasium (the old one will be maintained); and a spacious new or refurbished dining hall with a modern kitchen.

New personnel to accommodate the increased enrollment have already been added--an English and a mathematics instructor, both with excellent credentials. Other faculty will be hired as necessary to keep our classes at 16 students to 1 teacher or below.

In order to inprove quality, academic programs are always under review. In the near term, graduation requirements are going to increase. New independent Advanced Placement courses will be offered. Future plans include fully resourced art programs and drama being added to the curriculum. We want to increase extracurricular opportunities as well with such offerings as chess, foreign language, and science clubs.


Our athletic programs are also being adjusted and expanded. The soccer schedule is being moved to spring to allow greater participation by cadets. This year's team will christen the new soccer field. Moreover, the







Academy will have a lacrosse team for the first time this spring. In addition, a swimming team is in the planning stages and will be formed when schedules can be arranged.






































To Be a Cadet




Camden Military Academy started the new school year with 281 cadets, the largest enrollment in the history of the school. The Cadet Corps will exceed 300 members by year's end.



















































































Special Events

Achieving the Goal


Last year at this time, Camden Military Academy stated a goal of enrolling 300 cadets during the next school term. As of February 8, 2001, enrollment stood at 310, and the new barracks is nearing completion. Delta Company, the latest addition to the battalion, has grown to 38 cadets in size and reports few serious infractions during the first semester and a chain of command that is virtually intact. The cadets of Delta are a testament to the Academy's practice of admitting only those students who possess the same good character that is typical of our present cadet corps and of adding only those instructors and staff who meet our high standards. Growth in quality will be commensurate with the increase in physical size. The people of Camden Military Academy are the institution: a corps of cadets with good character and great potential and a competent, caring faculty and staff to guide them.



Gene McCaskill, Director of Development, continues his very important role in the growth of Camden Military Academy as our enrollment expands beyond 300 cadets.



Joining the faculty second semester was Captain Jim Hayes, English instructor. He comes to CMA from Morris College in Sumter. Captain Hayes holds both bachelor's and master's degrees in English from Western Michigan University, where he also studied Japanese. Moreover, he taught in Japan for a year. A welcome addition to the faculty, he brings interesting new perspectives.



Captain Chris Watson also joined the faculty at the beginning of the second semester as a mathematics instructor. Captain Watson has dual ties to Camden Military Academy. He is a 1984 CMA alumnus, and his father, LTC James Watson, was a long-time Carlisle and CMA faculty member. As a cadet, Captain Watson was executive officer of A Company and a member of DKS. He holds a BS degree from the University of South Carolina.








CPT Rivers Killen leads A Company by the reviewing stand. A Company is Honor Company this year.









Excelling in Sports




Running back Darshan Laborde, MVP, outruns defenders to score one of his many touchdowns this season.






Junior Varsity Football





Quality Keeps Pace with Growth

Since Camden Military Academy's enrollment has increased significantly this year, there were some concerns that the quality of instruction might be adversely affected; but adjustments were made quickly to keep the student-teacher ratio at sixteen to one or lower. Two well-qualified teachers were added second semester, one in English and another in mathematics. Two temporary classrooms were set up, pending new construction. The Academy has a sound plan and has responded effectively to the larger numbers. The academic goal of the Academy remains the same: to produce students who can succeed in college level studies, in other postsecondary pursuits, and in meeting the usual challenges of life. A traditional curriculum that includes Latin is mixed with approaches that seek to use computers in the most efficacious ways. 


Location, Innovation, Tradition








