Character and Quality

Camden Military Academy has become a very popular school. Our enrollment stands at 330, with a substantial number of applicants on our waiting list. We are selective in whom we invite into our midst. The character of our cadets is better than it has ever been, and academic performance has improved as well. Our SAT average is now higher than the average for the state of South Carolina.

For several years we have been involved in an intensive program to improve our physical plant, and that effort continues on schedule. We were very pleased to have B Company occupy the new barracks at the beginning of this school term. This attractive, spacious building conforms perfectly to our prevailing architectural style and immediately catches the eye of all who enter our main gate. Moreover, we will continue to improve and upgrade our older barracks.

The next new building on campus we desire is a gymnasium. Construction is slated to begin next year. The old field house will remain intact, with a covered walkway connecting it to the new gym. The new facility will provide seating for approximately 600 spectators. It will have a concession stand, a large, state-of-the-art weight room, and private locker space for every cadet.

Another structure we hope to build within three to four years is a multipurpose building that will fill several needs that we have: a place to worship, additional classrooms, and a true auditorium for formal gatherings and entertainment. The plans as presently conceived place the auditorium at the center of the building with classrooms surrounding it. The chapel is to the right of the main entrance. Seating in the auditorium will be approximately 500.

We continuously fine tune our academic program. Next year we plan to offer three levels of Latin, a move that will strengthen academics across the board. We will also offer a semester-long SAT preparation course, with six to eight cadets in each class, available every class period of the day. Starting second semester, cadets may be able to earn college credit in English, history, and mathematics. We will affiliate with a local college for this purpose.

Sports are an integral part of the eduational process at Camden Military Academy. Our no-cut policy for athletic teams assures a high level of cadet participation. New this year was a junior high basketball team, which enjoyed immediate success. We will add a junior high baseball team next year. Another addition will be swimming as an interscholastic sport, with a regular schedule of meets. Scuba training will be offered next year as well.

































Cadet Honor


Camden Military Academy has always had an Honor System, but this year it established a formal Honor Code, which states simply that "a cadet will not lie, cheat, or steal." The code is common sense morality that has existed in even the most primitive human cultures for thousands of years. Applied to cadets it means that they will not lie to anyone, cheat on tests or in their personal dealings with others, or steal from anyone. Honor, however, has a broader meaning that goes much beyond the code. It means accepting responsibility for all of one's actions. It means facing problems squarely at the outset before they grow bigger and get out of hand. It means observing the rules of common courtesy and helping others who need a hand without expecting anything in return. It also means appraising oneself honestly, admitting to shortcomings, and sincerely trying to correct them.


































































Scarborough Barracks

Everyone watched the new barracks as it grew from foundation last year to completion and occupancy at the beginning of this school term. B Company cadets are the proud occupants of this attractive, spacious, comfortable structure that blends in perfectly with other campus architecture. At first, the building was known only as "The New Barracks." Then there was a growing acceptance of "B Company Barracks." On March 1, 2002, the Board of Trustees officially named the new structure in honor of Board Chairman Banks Scarborough. A Carlisle alumnus, Mr. Scarborough has for many years been a fervent supporter of Camden Military Academy. No one deserves this honor more. The most imposing interior feature of the building is the high, wide, well-lighted hall, which creates a sense of openness that banishes any trace of claustrophobia. CSM Rolf Irtenkauf, Tactical Officer, has tastefully decorated the public areas of the barracks. In the fover stands a glass trophy case containing both military and sports awards, with Drill Team recognition predominating. Old and new photographs of B Company Platoons, as well as other inspirational pictures, align the walls of the hall. The computer room, like the living quarters occupied by cadets, is spacious and well lighted. All cadets appreciate the new utilities and privacy features in the bathrooms. CSM Irtenkauf and the chain of command under Company Commander Will Coltharp feel a particular sense of responsibility for maintaining the new structure. "CSM Irtenkauf rides us hard to keep this barracks in shape," said CPT Coltharp. The company has serious cleaning duties in the early morning and in the evening after dinner. They are determined to keep the new barracks new. B Company morale may well have benefited from the new environment. Beta won the Honor Company title first semester.









High Standards




B Company

Lieutenant Colonel Eric Boland, Athletic Director, has been with Camden Military Academy for 20 years. 






Most Valuable Player Vincent Yates rushed for over 1,000 yards in just seven games. He had a yard touchdown run from scrimmage this season.
















Individual Importance




