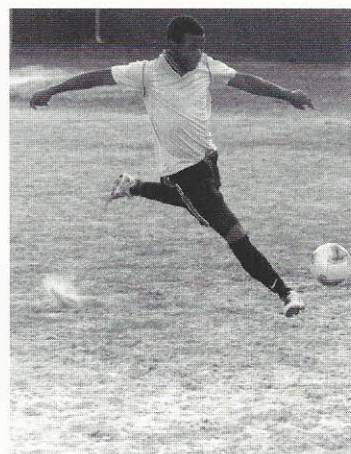

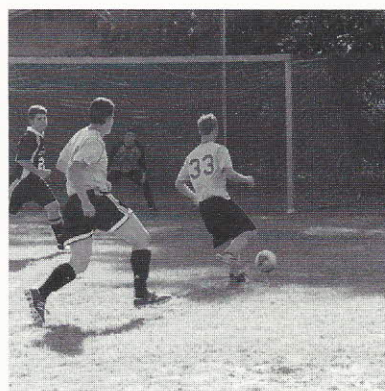
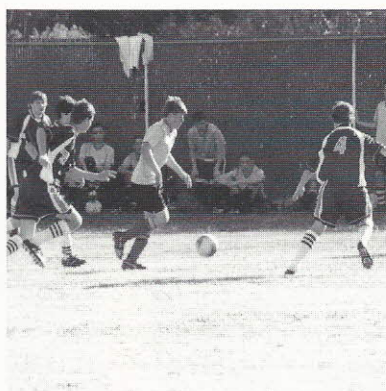


Goalkeeper Vance Caraway punts the ball. He made the Spartans a threat in every game.
