


































Military Drill and Values











Those Who Care and Serve






Athletic Director Eric Boland

The school term 2002-2003 has been an outstanding one in the history of Camden Military Academy athletics. The football team went undefeated; the basketball team is among the two or three best of all time; the cross-country team had the most wins ever; 50 or more players intend to play soccer; wrestling continues its popular appeal; and in its third year the lacrosse program is stronger than ever. Moreover, with the addition of Coach Johnson to the staff, interest in track and field seems to be growing.

Athletic Director Eric Boland attributes the success of the athletic program to several factors. One is the Academy's high retention rate: "When we get to keep good players for a longer period of time, of course the athletic teams will benefit from their experience and skill level." Coach Boland also points to participation numbers as a factor: "The number of underclass participants in athletics is up. That circumstance always bodes well for team success in the years to come." Another factor that the coach cites is success itself: "Because of our success over the past ten years, we are attracting a better quality student and athlete."

The athletic program at Camden Military Academy has never been stronger. The proof is in the success of the Academy's teams, in the enthusiasm and and participation of the Cadet Corps, and in the superlative competence and dedication of the athletic staff.

Varsity Football

"It was a dream season," said Head Coach Eric Boland. "To go undefeated and never have to punt the football the entire season is a remarkable achievement for any football team. I have had more talented teams, but none more team oriented, who pulled together better as one unit." At the beginning of the season, the coaching staff did not really know what to expect. They thought that a 6 and 3 record might be realistic, but everything came together: the right team chemistry, no key injuries, and no discipline problems. As fortunate circumstances evolved, the Spartans were able to field at least ten players with scholarship potential

One of the largest numbers of players in school history turned out to play one of the toughest schedules and to score the most points. Wins over perennially strong private schools Charlotte Latin and Cardinal Gibbons were complemented by victories over public schools Eloree and Hunter-Kinard-Taylor, which went deep into the playoffs. "The coaching staff did a great job in both scouting and team preparation," Coach Boland added.

























Effective Teaching



Tradition is an integral part of the way we do everything at CMA. It is an important part of any military organization and is an important part of a quality educational experience.



A College of Charleston graduate and a CMA alumnus, CPT Bob Whitmire coaches golf in addition to his duties as Spanish instructor.








A highly effective teacher of world history and government, CPT Thane Maness is also an outstanding baseball coach who devotes many hours after school to his coaching duties.


