


Dedication

For over fifteen years, Lieutenant Colonel Herman Henderson "Sonny" Brown has been a mainstay at Camden Miltary Academy. No teacher, tactical officer, or administrative support member has proven more trusted, industrious, or beloved. His imprint on CMA has been profound and will endure well into the future. Indicative of this imprint is the yearbook that you presently hold in your hand. Excalibur is CMA's persona to the outside world, and it has been the school's good fortune to have Sonny at its helm since his arrival in 1991. You can see his care and attention to detail on every page, just as you can see evidence of his positive impression on virtually every senior that CMA has graduated over the last decade and a half.

A native South Carolinian hailing from Friendfield in Florence County, Colonel Brown is a perpetuator of the education legacy inherited from his mother, who herself was a teacher in both Carolinas for 45 years. After graduating from Pamplico High School, he began his college studies at the former Clemson College before trading in tiger stripes for gamecock spurs and graduating with a degree in political science from USC in 1961. Teaching social studies at Wampee High School in what is now known as North Myrtle Beach was the first step in Sonny's teaching career, but it soon led to a second and more enduring step when he demonstrated his acumen with the English language to such a degree that the school's principal asked him to return to school and earn a certification to teach English. This he did over the course of one summer at his alma mater and returned to Wampee the following fall to teach English classes in grades 9-12. After two short years with Sonny at the helm of high school English instruction, Wampee High School students boasted the highest verbal SAT scores in all of Horry County.

After three years at Wampee, Sonny passed the Graduate Record Exam in English and returned once again to USC in 1964 to attend graduate school. A short diversion to Pinehurst, NC, ensued when he accepted an English teaching position at Sandhills Community College, but he resumed his graduate studies shortly thereafter and completed them in 1967. Next came a teaching position at Dentsville (now Columbia Northeast) High School before a farflung career change was pursued at the Research Reading Center in Santa Barbara, California.

While on the west coast, Colonel Brown began a second career, first as an assistant manager then as a district manager of Educator's life, a teachers' insurance company. This career lasted nearly a decade before he returned to South Carolina and began yet a third career as a realtor in the Myrtle Beach area. Eventually, he started his own successful company, which was well known in the Myrtle Beach realty community for several years.

Despite impressive successes in the business world, education remained in Sonny's blood. In the 1980's he returned to the classroom, teaching social studies at Socastee High School. Thereafter, he re-

turned to the USC Graduate School and earned a master's degree in secondary English education in 1982. In 1983 he taught AP English at North Myrtle Beach High School. In the mid-1980's he was lured briefly back into real estate, but before the end of the decade, Sonny was back in the classroom to stay.

Colonel Brown began his "tour of duty" at CMA in 1991, and it has been the school's esteemed privilege to have him on the faculty ever since. He has taught all grades of English during his time with us and only recently relinquished his position as department head, a post he had filled with distinction since 1998. He has left his mark on vitually every graduating class for the past decade as a teacher of senior English. Every *Excalibur* and most issues of the school's student news-

paper have benefited from his personal touch. He takes and edits most photographs that appear in school publications. For the administration he serves as an editor and quality assurance assistant for school publications and other school communications.

It is with unanimous joy and appreciation that the administration, faculty and staff of CMA dedicate this issue of Excalibur to LTC Sonny Brown for his untiring efforts to improve and support our institution and its learning environment. We treasure the time he has shared with us, and we covet the time we still have to benefit from his directionmentoring, and companionship. Thankyou, Sonny. CMA owes much of its luste to your professionalism, your care, and your devotion to its betterment.

Moreover, we excited about the Southern Associafrom evaluation coming up and are premaring for the process.

of Commandant C. H. Armstrong III, Deputy Commandant Rosvelt Martain, and a very competent group of tactical officers, our cadet corps has been rated an "Honor Unit with Distinction" for many years. This year there has been very little disruption in the chain of command. Our cadet officers take their jobs seriously and do their duty well. Their attitude improves the performance of all cadets. The appearance of the corps as a whole has improved noticeably. Cadets are paying more attention to wearing their uniforms properly.

Under the supervision of Billy Watford, our maintenance staff keep our campus in exceptional condition, both the grounds and the buildings. We are renovating the Carlisle House inside and out to update it and to make it architecturally compatible with the rest of the campus. Our crowning achievement this year, made possible by the generosity of Mrs. Martha Cline, is

the new chapel, which we expect to be completed in early May. It will be a true chapel, not a multipurpose structure, used only for religious services, weddings, memorials, and a variety of other appropriate purposes. Large enough to hold the Cadet Corps, faculty, and staff, it will contain 364 seats.



The Camden Experience


At Camden Military Academy one often hears the term "the Camden experience." Those of us who use it, instinctively know what it means because we ourselves have had the experience of being at the Academy for some time. The primary question, however, is what does it mean to a new cadet? First, it means living away from family and friends, often for the first time. It means wearing a uniform instead of the "cool threads" he is used to. It means getting up and going to bed earlier that he really wants to. A new cadet must learn the military system and military drill. He must find a place for himself in his company and learn his role well. He must learn how to take orders without resentment and to give them respectfully. Through this process he gains self-confidence, self-control, self-respect, and the ability to see himself and others as cooperative members of a group working for a common purpose. He begins to appreciate their worthineses and his in the group's achievement of their goals. He begins to take pride in himself, in his uniform, his company, and his battalion. When the drums roll and the trumpets sound, his steps grow lighter. He learns to value the friends he has made at the Academy, friends he will have for life. The CMA Battalion conducts Saturday Morning Inspections approximately every two weeks. These are comprehensive inspections that include cadets' rooms, uniforms, and everything else in their possession. Room inspections occur daily. Assisted by PVT Michel Snelgrove, 2LT Craig Barker inspects Cadet Adam Totten's uniform.

Mission in Mississippi

Katrina's devastation of the Gulf Coast shocked and saddened most Americans, and many responded to the desperate need residents had for help. Among that caring group were CMA staff, cadets, and alumni. On the mission to Mississippi, CMA teachers LTC Glenn Melberg and MSG Tom Hewitt joined CMA Alumnus Art Dumont and his wife Jennie, well-known benefactors of the Academy. CMA cadets in the group were Joel Land, Craig Barker, James Daniel, Nick Leftwich, Alex Peplinski, Robert Sheffield, and Nick Trott. These cadets were chosen from a large pool of other enthusiastic cadet volunteers. Early one Friday morning in October a mini-convoy left Camden loaded with bottled water, canned foods, MREs, and toilet paper. Also aboard were seven tents for housing the CMA contingent, chainsaws and other tools for aiding in the cleanup, and if necessary, for clearing the road to Hattiesburg, Mississippi, the mission's destination.

In Alabama the CMA contingent joined a Salvation Army convoy. The plan was to reach Hattiesburg on Sunday and return to Camden on Monday night or Tuesday. When they reached Hattiesburg, they set up camp, turned over the bottled water to local officials for distribution where it was needed, helped the Salvation Army distribute food and other items to local residents, and with their chainsaws helped clean up roadways and lots. The CMA volunteers provided much needed assistance and comfort to the local populace.

Art Dumont, Colonel Eric Boland, LTC Armstrong, and LTC Melberg planned the mission. Mr. Dumont's business, Custom Glass, funded it. Other missions to the area are under consideration.

"I think the mission is important," Colonel Boland said, "because we try to teach leadership, caring, and responsibility. Doing this gives them all three." He stated futher that he hopes cadets participating in the effort will report to their classmates what they have seen.



Back to Jackson

Under CSM Brooks's watchful eye, CMA cadets returned to Fort Jackson from 1-7 June, 2005, for JROTC Summer Camp, which has become an annual ritual. "The purpose of the camp," said CSM Brooks, "is to teach leadership skills and build confidence, and from what I have observed, it is very effective." Army personnel put cadets through a series of arduous courses that develop physical strength, courage, and mental alertness. These courses include firing live ammunition on the firing range, running and jumping activities, crawling and climbing, high and low rope exercises, land navigation using compasses, and team development. Innovations this year were a new high rope course and basic first aid instruction. Although cadets spend most of their time in training exercises, breaks are provided for recreational activities such as swimming and field events. Cadet Craig Barker summed up his impressions: "The camp provided a great experience for working together as a team and learning how to trust one another."





Dedicated People





Our reputation attracts students from all over the nation and many parts of the world. For over forty years our JROTC Unit has been rated an "Honor Unit with Distinction" by the United States Army. 




Strength in Leadership


Varsity Football




















