




This issue of *Excalibur* marks the end of an era that began in 1991 when Lt. Col. Herman Henderson "Sonny" Brown joined the staff of Camden Military Academy, following the retirement of Major Burton Gale. His devotion to CMA and his love of teaching was evident in every phase of his Camden career. He taught all grades of English, served as English department chairman from 1998 to 2006, and was the mentoring force behind all of CMA's journalistic activities. In addition to being a guiding force behind the *Excalibur*, LTC Brown's job description included publishing the school newspaper, taking photos in all CMA photographic events, directing school journalism societies, and serving as the administration's chief editor and quality assurance assistant for school publications and communications. From 1991 until 2007, Camden Military Academy's yearbook has been the annual crowning achievement for each graduating class under his direction. For the first time in sixteen years, *Excalibur* was forced to go to print without his expert and reassuring hand on the helm. The issue that you hold before you is the last that reflects all-so-meaningful personal touch.

Moving Forward

Although we believe that Camden Military Academy is the best secondary military school in the country, we are always looking for ways to improve. We retain a highly competent faculty and staff to serve the young men of character whom we seek to fill our ranks. Academically, we are attentive to the demands of a highly competitive world and add new technological aids as they are available. Since our military component is such an important part of our institution, we are constantly looking for ways to improve organization and performance. We add new buildings as needs require and money permits and conscientiously maintain the existing physical plant. Renovations are often needed as time goes by.

We are fortunate to have a school that attracts young men from all over the country and many parts of the world. The quality of the Cadet Corps has never been higher. We were full very early this year and began operating off a waiting list in October. We are already accepting applications for summer school and next fall. Our consistent enrollment numbers are due to the benefits the Academy offers and to the efforts of Admissions Director Casey Robinson and his able assistants to make those benefits known.

We have an exceptional faculty to teach our young men the courses that they need. The new Faculty Advisor Program for juniors and seniors helps them target the schools they want to attend, submit applications, and solve attendant problems in an increasingly complex process. Curriculum additions this year include a college psychology course through the University of South Carolina (two more to be added next year) and writing/vocabulary courses. Next year we will also add a business law course taught by an attorney. SAT scores are up, a definite indication of progress. Moreover, we are excited about the recent reaccreditation from the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools evaluation process.

An important complement to the classroom, military training teaches discipline, teamwork, self-confidence, and how to give and take orders. Under the direction

of Commandant C. H. Armstrong III, Deputy Commandant Rosvelt Martain, and a very competent group of tactical officers, our cadet corps has been rated an "Honor Unit with Distinction" for many years. This year there has been very little disruption in the chain of command. Our cadet officers take their jobs seriously and do their duty well. Their attitude improves the performance of all cadets. The appearance of the corps as a whole has improved noticeably. Cadets are paying more attention to wearing their uniforms properly.

Under the supervision of Billy Watford, our maintenance staff keep our campus in exceptional condition, both the grounds and the buildings. We have renovated the Carlisle House inside and out to update it and to make it architecturally compatible with the rest of the campus. Our crowning achievement this year, made possible by the generosity of Mrs. Martha Cline, is

the new chapel, which was dedicated on March 17, 2007.

The future of Camden Military Academy is one of great promise. In these turbulent times we provide a safe haven where young men can pursue their studies without many of the distractions they would encounter elsewhere. They are taught by highly qualified, dedicated teachers with whose input we evaluate and change our college preparatory curriculum to meet the demands of the times. Our military leaders, among the best in their fields, are role models whom cadets can confidently emulate. Our physical plant is being well maintained and expanded as our needs require. We are justifiably proud of our Academy and its traditions, but we always seek to improve.

The Camden Experience

At Camden Military Academy one often hears the term "the Camden experience." Those of us who use it, instinctively know what it means because we ourselves have had the experience of being at the Academy for some time. The primary question, however, is what does it mean to a new cadet? First, it means living away from family and friends, often for the first time. It means wearing a uniform instead of the "cool threads" he is used to. It means getting up and going to bed earlier than he really wants to. A new cadet must learn the military system and military drill. He must find a place for himself in his company and learn his role well. He must learn how to take orders without resentment and to give them respectfully. Through this process he gains self-confidence, self-control, self-respect, and the ability to see himself and others as cooperative members of a group working for a common purpose. He begins to appreciate their worthiness and his in the group's achievement of their goals. He begins to take pride in himself, in his uniform, his company, and his battalion. When the drums roll and the trumpets sound, his steps grow lighter. He learns to value the friends he has made at the Academy, friends he will have for life. He has learned lessons that many do not learn in a lifetime. He has become one of a select group of thousands of alumni who have gone on to great success because of their Camden experience.








PECAN FESTIVAL

CIVIL AIR PATROL

This year Civil Air Patrol has experienced some fun and interesting things. At the beginning of the year the squadron visited the Airborne and Special Forces Museum in Fayetteville, North Carolina. Squadron cadets have also participated in a variety of orientation flights in CAP aircraft. Also, many CAP cadets have attended Cadet Training Weekend and various field training exercises. The squadron entered three teams in the Team America Rocket Challenge.

Earlier in the year the Squadron toured the Airborne Museum in Fayetteville, North Carolina. Cadets learned about the importance of the Airborne divisions in modern warfare and about the history of these units as they were first used in warfare. Cadets also learned about special military forces and why they play an important role in American success at war.

This year Squadron 805 has had the opportunity to experience many orientation flights in CAP aircraft. Cadets flew in the Cessna 172, the Cessna 182 and the Cessna 182 with Garmin G1000 glass cockpit display. Then on February 10, 2007 cadets flew gliders, a great chance to learn about the basics of aviation.

This year Squadron 805 has fielded three teams in the Team America Rocket Challenge, a national competition in which each team launches an egg up to 850 feet in altitude and safely brings the rocket and payload down in forty five seconds. The team captains are cadets Aaron Lee, Alex Dirst, and Anthony Oneka.

These are just some of the things CAP Squadron 805 has accomplished this year, and next year will only be better.

This year's cadets attended the winter FTX (field training exercise). FTX is an event where cadets learn about search and rescue and outdoor survival skills. In addition, some of the cadets in the squadron were given the chance to go to CTW (cadet training weekend). CTW is 72-hour crash course in leadership, drill, ceremony and military courtesies.





A campus chapel has been a dream for many alumni of Camden Military Academy, Camden Military Academy, and Carlisle Military School, along with the faculty, staff, families, and friends of the Academy. For years, the cadets have had their choice of attending local churches on Sundays or staying on campus and attending services in the gymnasium.

Thanks to the Cline Foundation, the dream came true when Mrs. Martha Cline of Greenville, South Carolina donated \$1 million for the sole purpose of building a chapel on the campus of Camden Military Academy. Headmaster Colonel Eric Boland said, "It has been our vision to have a house of worship on campus in which we can worship the Lord." It has also been suggested that the chapel also be used for weddings and funerals.

The beginning of this long anticipated project started in August of 2005 with the downing of trees alongside the Risher Administration Building. There have been many cadets who have watched the progress, as well as the faculty and staff members. And with all great projects, there were the "snags" that interrupted its progress.

The structure itself has vaulted knotty pine ceilings, comfortable pews to accommodate more than 400 people, and an exquisite stained glass window that towers above the stage and pulpit. The piano and organ are of top quality sound and there is a 'state of the art' audio-visual system that can be used for special visitors or occasions.

The pews, the stained glass window, and the pulpit have special dedication plaques in place for memory or in honor of alumni. The Bibles and hymnals also have special dedication labels from loved ones.

The Camden Military Academy Class of 2007 is proud to have seen the dedication of this beautiful, as well as unique, chapel that was held on Saturday, March 17, 2007. The alumni of Camden Military Academy from the classes of 1951 to 1979 who attended their class reunion on this same weekend were privileged to witness the dedication, as well as alumni and friends from Carlisle Military School.


Strength in Leadership









JV Basketball











Intramural Opportunities


