One of Camden Military Academy's primary focuses is academics. Camden Military Academy is a college preparatory school. The school offers eight dual-enrollment college courses (English 101, English 102, Math 111, Physical Science and History 101 are just a few) taught by University of South Carolina qualified instructors. The academy offers a wide range of other classes from Latin to Psychology. CMA holds Saturday classes, usually once a month, in order to allow more time for students to learn and for teachers to teach. The teacher-to-student ratio is 1 to 8, and the average class-size is eleven students, allowing students to have a more one-on-one experience with teachers. The school offers a wide range of summer classes in order for students to further their academic experience at the school. Popular classes include 20th-Century History, Anatomy and Physiology, Government and Economics, and Calculus. Students and parents are usually impressed with the improvement in grades while attending the academy.



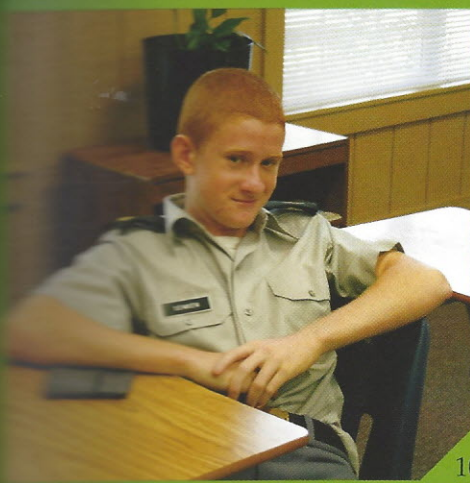

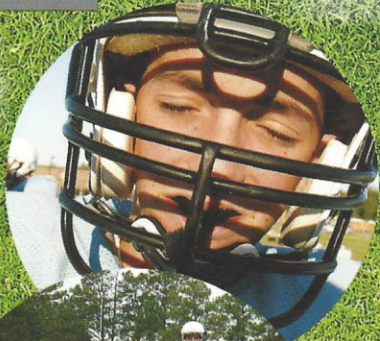
Jr. High Football

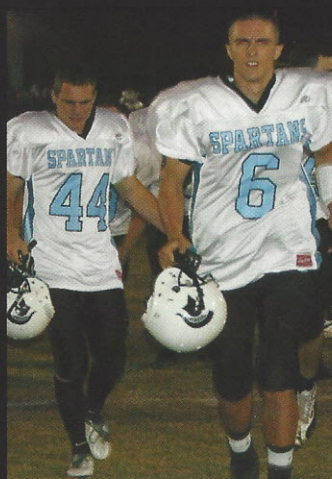

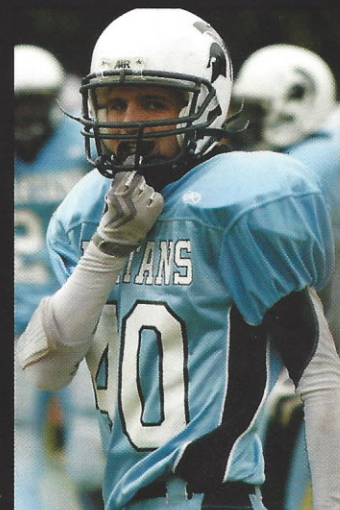

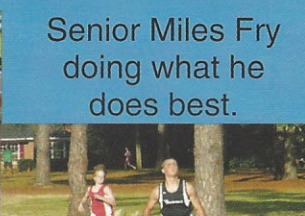

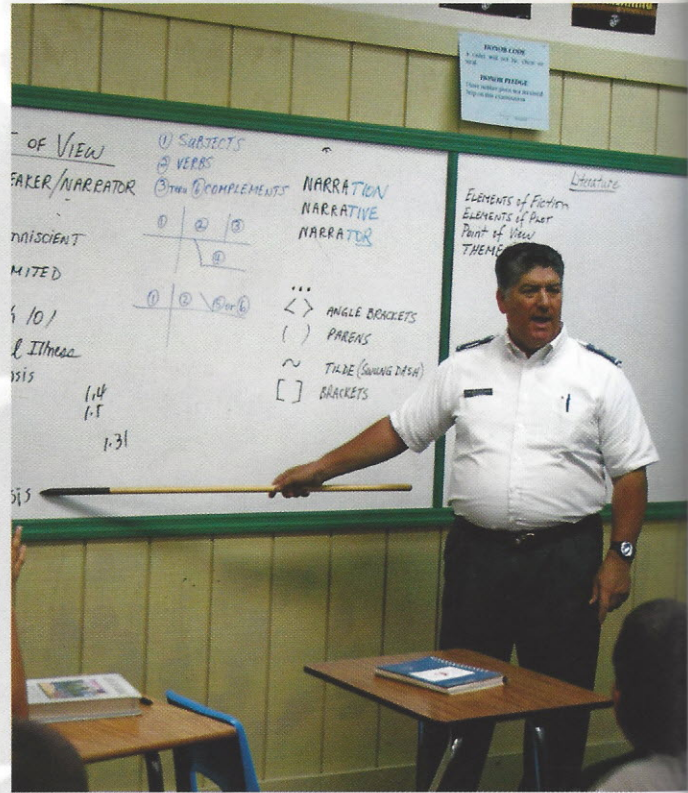
Homecoming

The team was capably managed by Tanner Linder.



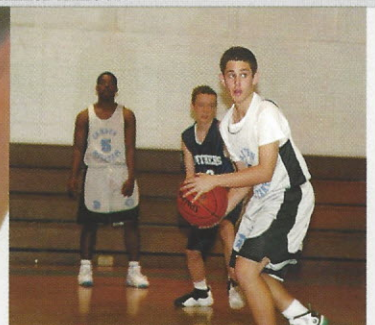

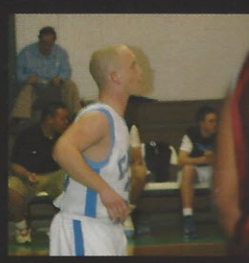
Varsity Basketball

Civil Air Patrol

The Civil Air Patrol is congressionally chartered as a non-profit auxiliary to the United States Air Force. The organization was first formed in the shadow of impending war on December 1st, 1941 as a means of keeping watch on US borders, especially along its coasts.

In subsequent years, CAP's duties have included anti-submarine patrol and warfare. This was undertaken with surprising success. During WWII, the organization sighted and reported 173 enemy u-boats. Amongst these sightings, the patrol attacked 57 times, dropped 83 pieces of ordnance and sank two enemy submarines.

In addition, the CAP provided target tow-planes for training American anti-aircraft personnel. This sounds dangerous, but, while a couple were hit, none were shot down.

Today the organization is made up of junior cadets, as well as senior members. They serve as emergency couriers (e.g. organ deliveries), agents of homeland security, and as participants in search and rescue operations. CAP's low, slow planes are ideal for locating individuals and vehicles on the ground. For the same reason, they are also useful in aerially monitoring drug traffic. Additionally, CAP serves in a national emergency communications hub, networked all over the country.

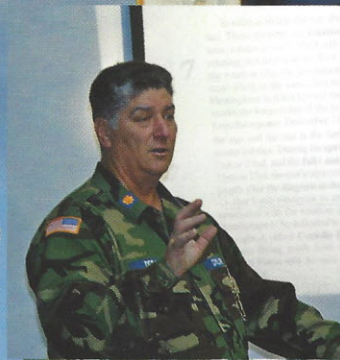
LTC Glenn Melberg (USAF ret.), Math Department Head, formed Squadron SC805 of the Civil Air Patrol here at CMA in 2002. In more recent years, he has been joined by Major Anthony DeCandia (USMC ret.), a CMA English teacher. Maj. DeCandia has been certified as a CAP pilot.

Since its formation, cadets have taken powered orientation flights, glider flights and flights in military aircraft (such as the C-130). They have visited air museums, flight simulators and air shows. Cadets have been trained in radio communications, first aid, orienteering and safety.

Cadets of the Civil Air Patrol meet weekly. They undergo physical and written testing for rank advancement and occasionally cooperate with other squadrons in preparing for these tests.



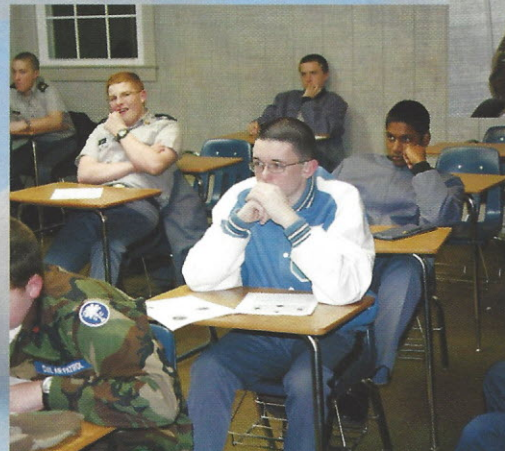

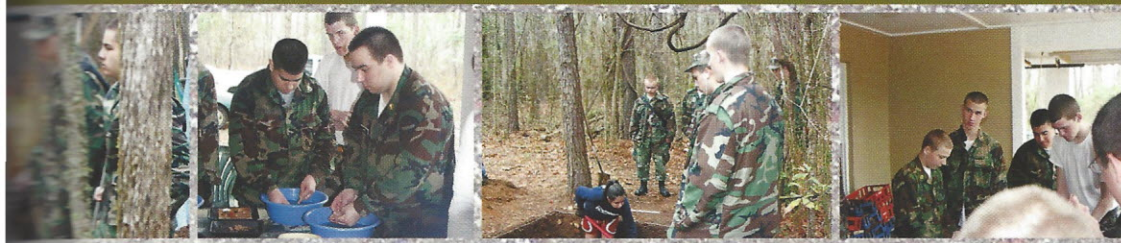
On March 11, 2010, thirteen Camden Military Academy Archaeological Society (CMAAS) cadets descended upon the Kolb Site archaeological project for the second consecutive year. The site is located about two miles inside the 'Great Pee Dee Heritage Preserve, part of the SCDNR Heritage Trust Program.

Professional archaeologists have excavated this site for fourteen years, and the project has served as a learning experience for the general public almost since the project began.

Last year, the cadets excavated 50cm X 50cm test units at the site. This year a deluge of rain forced an early close to fieldwork on the society's day of visitation. However, the day was not lost. The cadets shuttled in the bed of pick up trucks back through the swamp to the CMA school bus. From there, they commuted to the project field house at Roblyn's Neck, where a temporary lab had been set up, and archaeological lab work awaited them.

CMAAS members began their work by painstakingly washing each of hundreds of artifacts under the direction of Christopher Judge, a University of South Carolina archeology professor. These artifacts ranged from architectural and Kitchen artifacts from the 1700's and 1800's to ceramic and stone artifacts (some as small as 1/4") dating to as early as 12,500 years. The lab provided cadets with a unique opportunity to look at the clean specimens close up. In the field, artifacts can be difficult to clean, and hence, only a few are closely examined before they reach the lab. Indeed, it is said in archaeology that some of the most exciting discoveries are made, not by "field mice", but by "lab rats".

As well as processing artifacts, the students were also privy to demonstrations of primitive technologies by SCDNR Archaeologist and technologies specialist Sean Taylor. He showed them how ancient Americans made pottery. He also demonstrated formative weapons including the bow and arrow, the blowgun and the atlatl (spear thrower).
