The Camden Military Academy Corps of Cadets honored recently retired SGM William Greene and his wife, Juliette, during a special presentation on Saturday, October 18, 2014. The Corps of Cadets marched on the CSM Martain Parade Field for the former Band and Staff TAC officer who had served Camden Military Academy for fifteen years. He had mentored thousands of young cadets to their manhood, similar to those who went through the Colonel James F. Risher young gentlemen principles at Carlisle Military School in Bamberg, S.C. Colonel Eric Boland presented a clock to SGM Greene, that also had the CMA crest and engraved inscription of appreciation for his service. Colonel Boland also presented his Mrs. Greene a bouquet of pink roses, in recognition of her service and support to CMA, as well as for cancer awareness. Sergeant Major William Greene, Jr. joined the United States Army in October 1968. Sergeant Major Greene has earned numerous awards to include the Legion of Merit and the Purple Heart. He served tirelessly here at Camden Military Academy for 15 years and retired in August of 2014. His work with the cadets will surely be missed. Sergeant Major and Mrs. Greene are the proud parents of three children and have four grandchildren.
