


After completing our dream of the future the two of us, Blake Ellis, and Bob English, returned to our yachts and penthouses to make our second million.




# Faculty


Sunday afternoons are set aside by many local families and visitors to review the dress parades executed by the Corp of Cadets.



This Honor Council has almost unlimited power in handling these matters; therefore this group must be made up of capable and broad-minded men of sound judgment.







The Glee Club has taken many steps to improve the musical world around school, and it is hoped that it will not only improve in ability, but also in popularity.






