Much credit is due this organization as its members spend much of their time decorating for the formal and informal dances which are held at regular intervals.



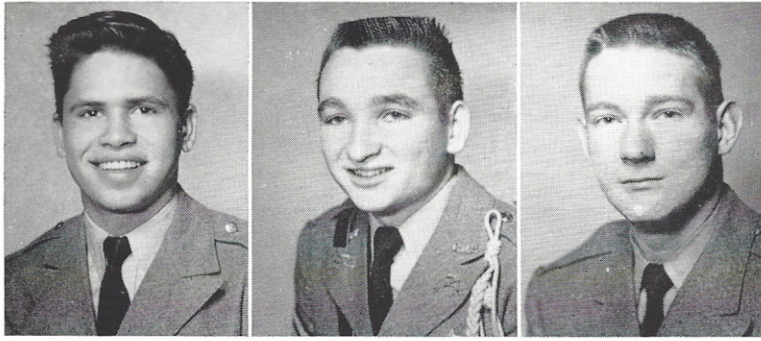

The club has many outings and cross-country flights during the year.

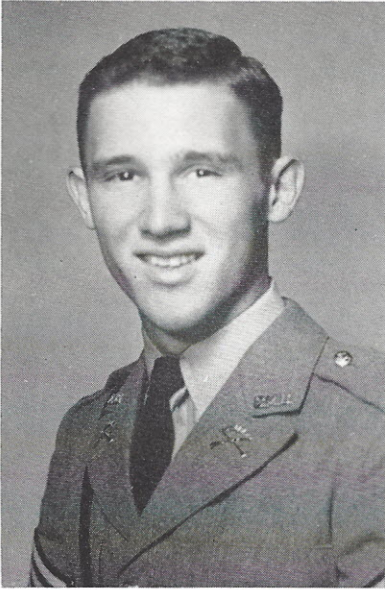

This organization at Carlisle is the most respected of all. Great responsibility is given to this group and discipline of the corps depends upon them.

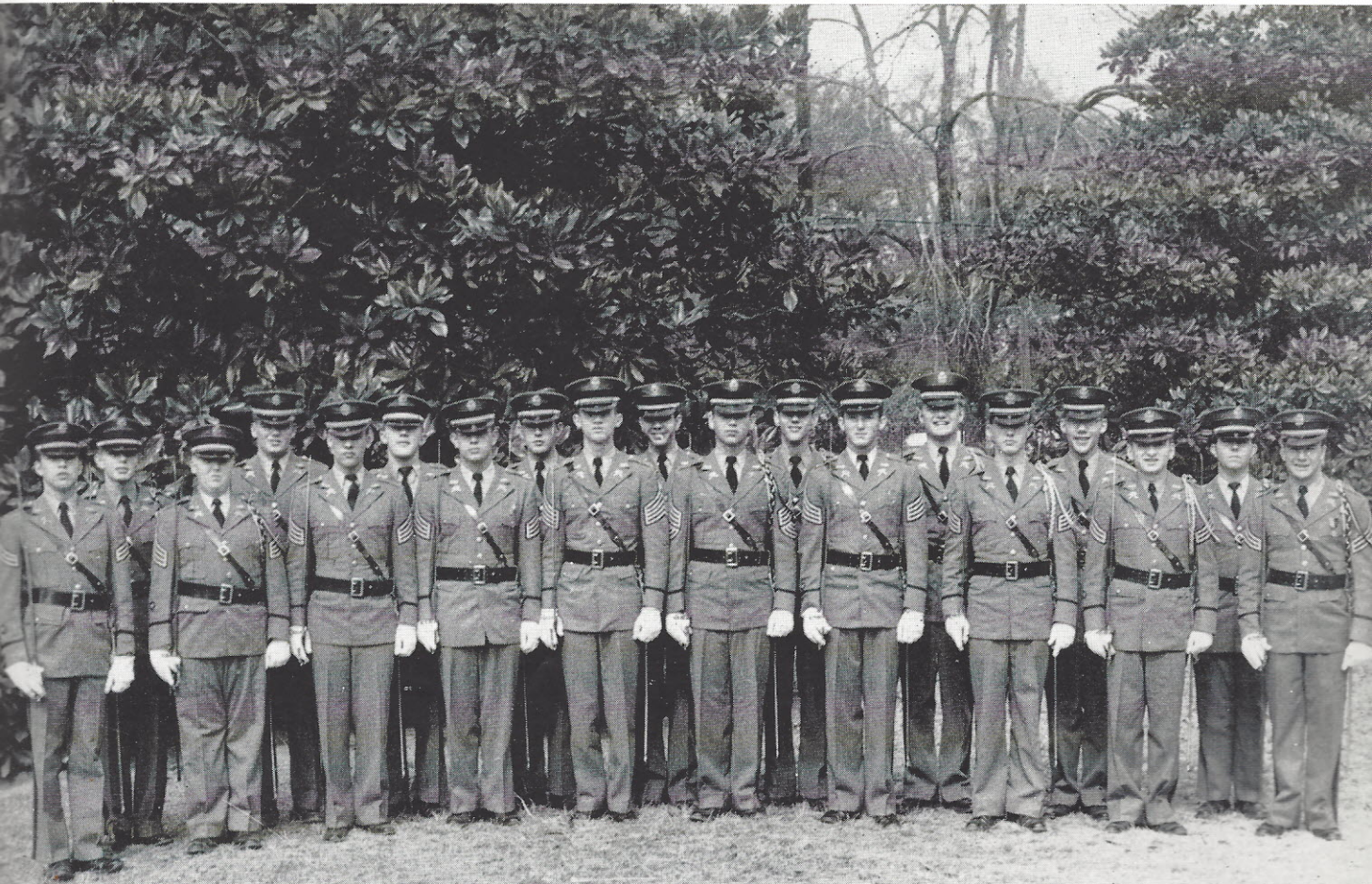

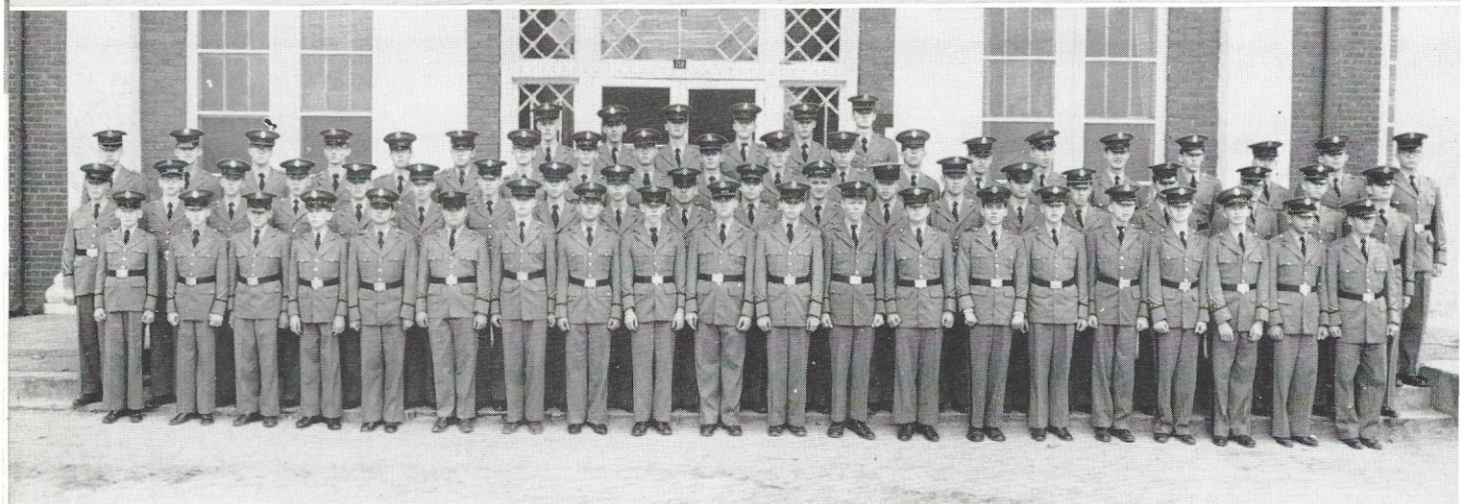
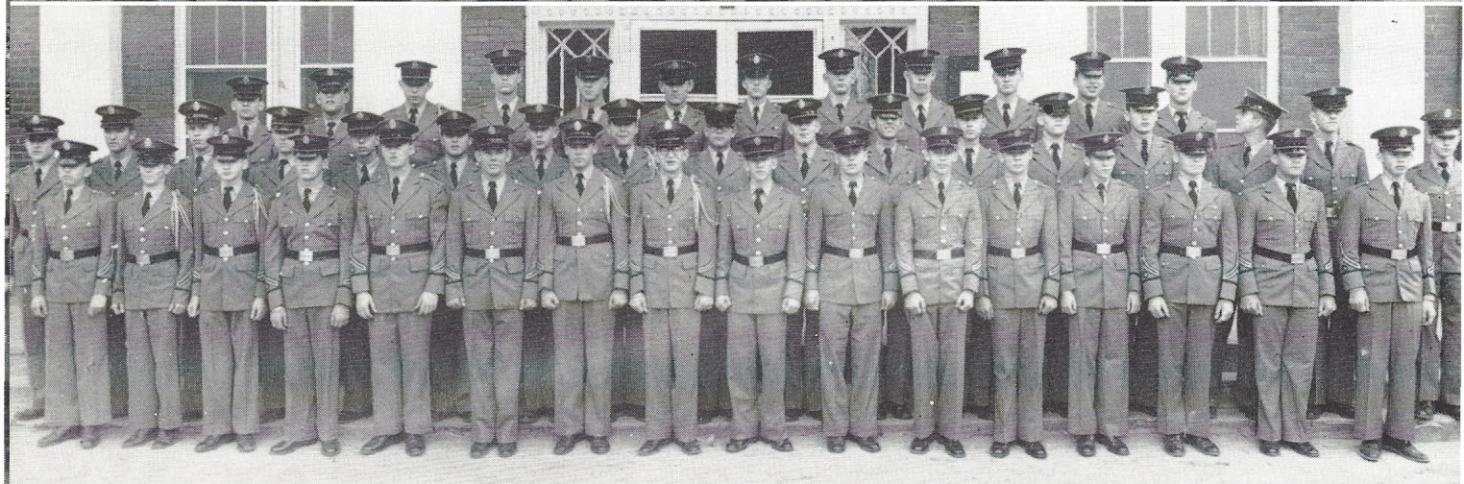
The Cross Saber Club is one of the most honored and respected organizations in school. It is composed of the Commissioned Officers of the battalion, the staff, and the band.
