The REBEL STAFF would like to personally commend and congratulate the members of the Drill Team on their past achievements, and wish them the best of luck, in the future.

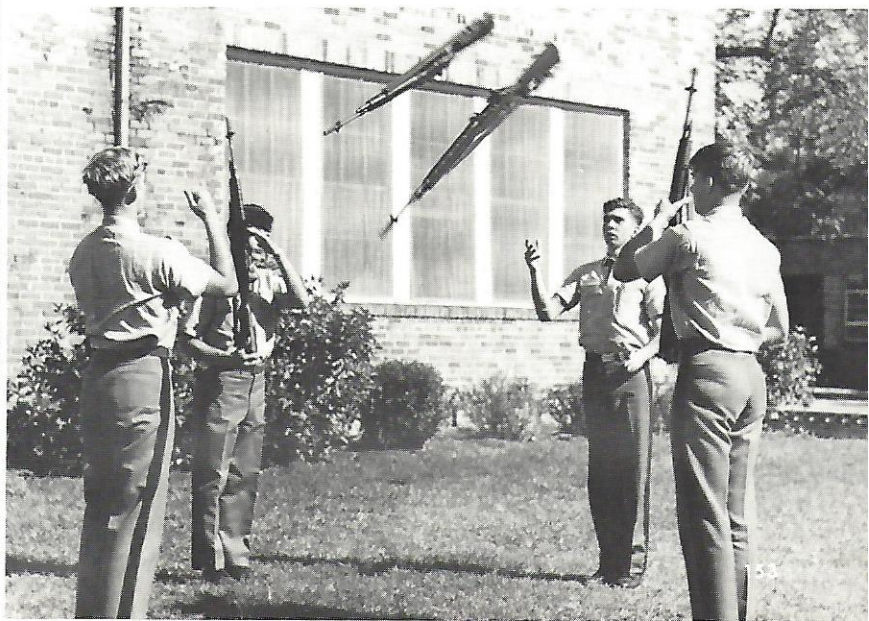

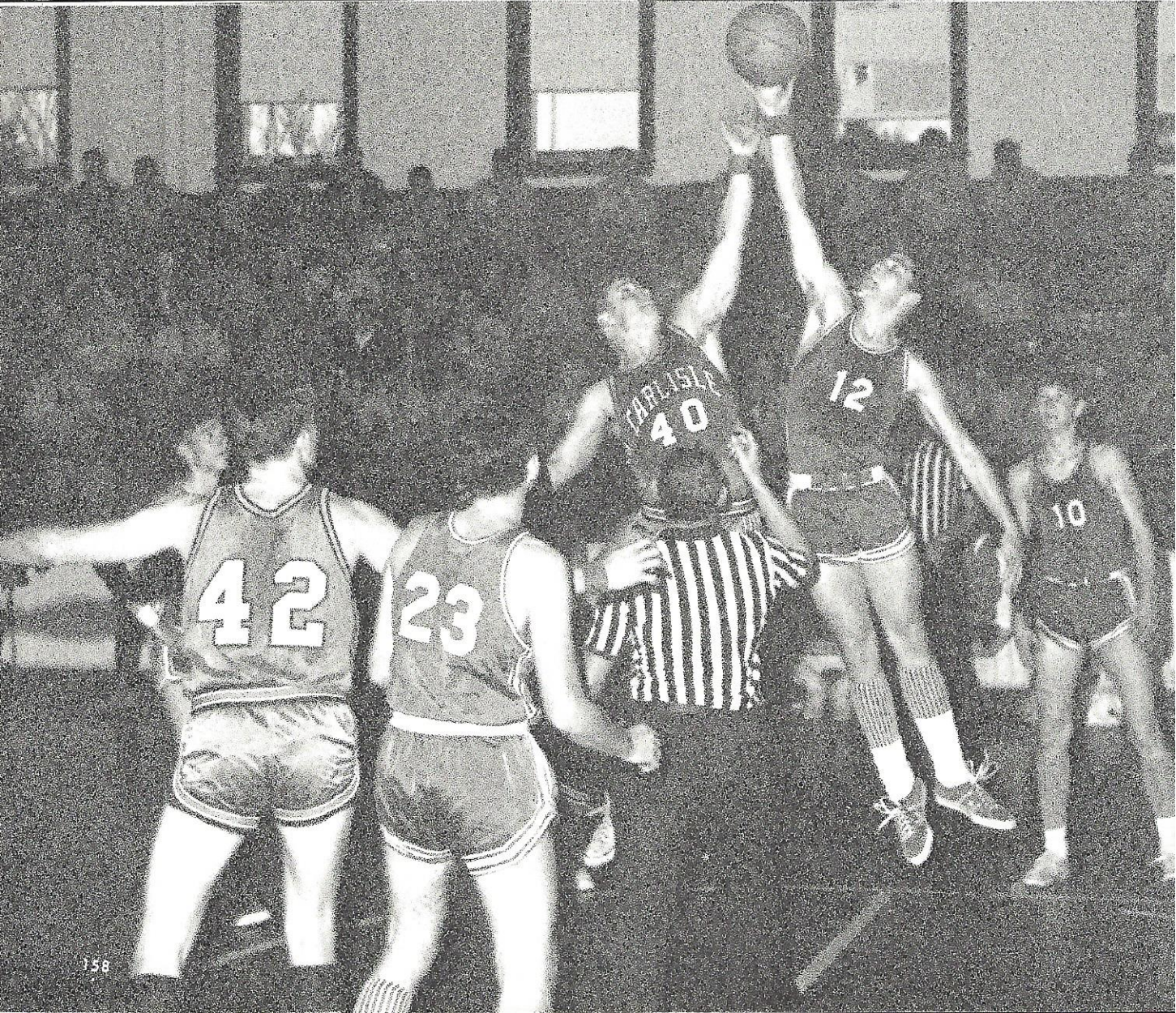
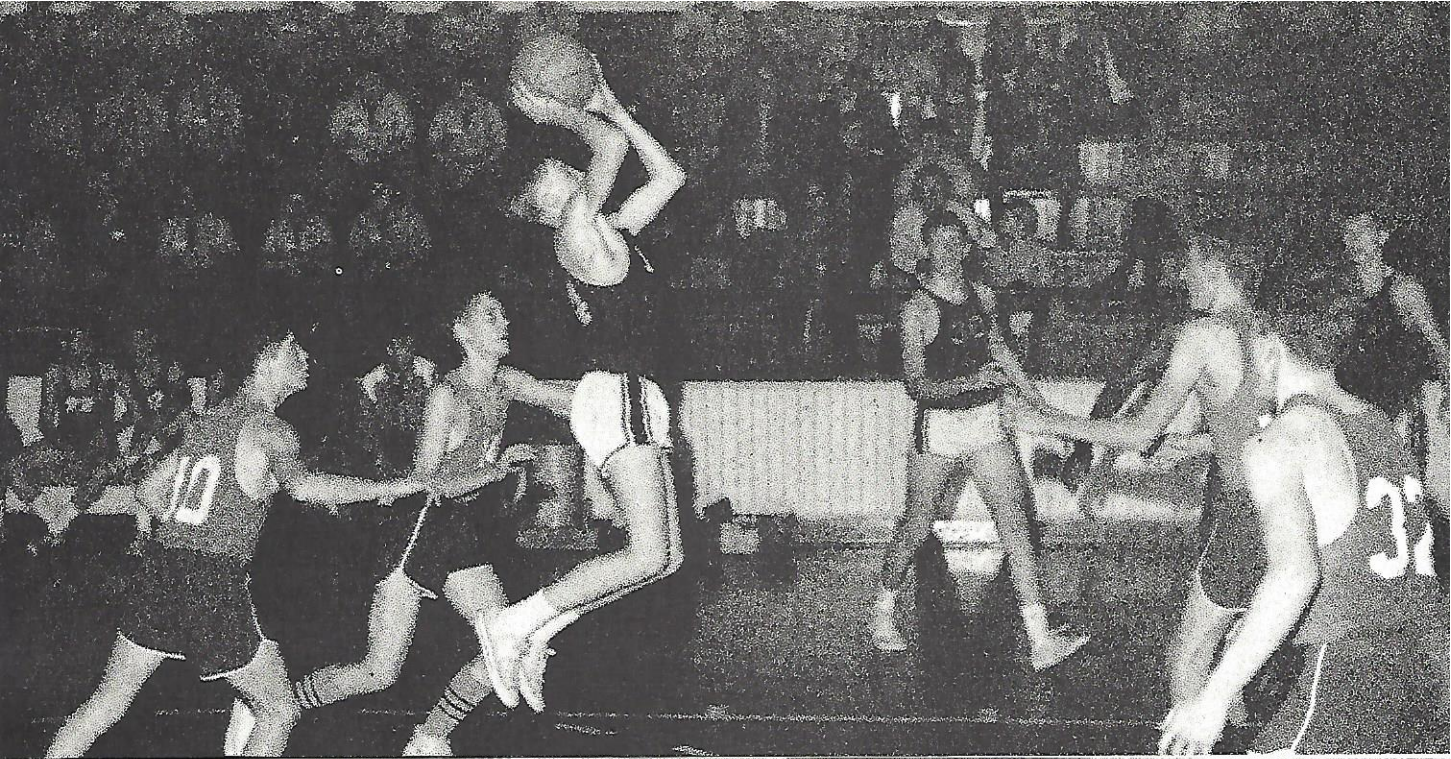
Under the expert guidance and supervision of SFC Ruppe, and the visiting Third Army Instructors, the Rifle Team has made exceptional progress over its performances in the past.

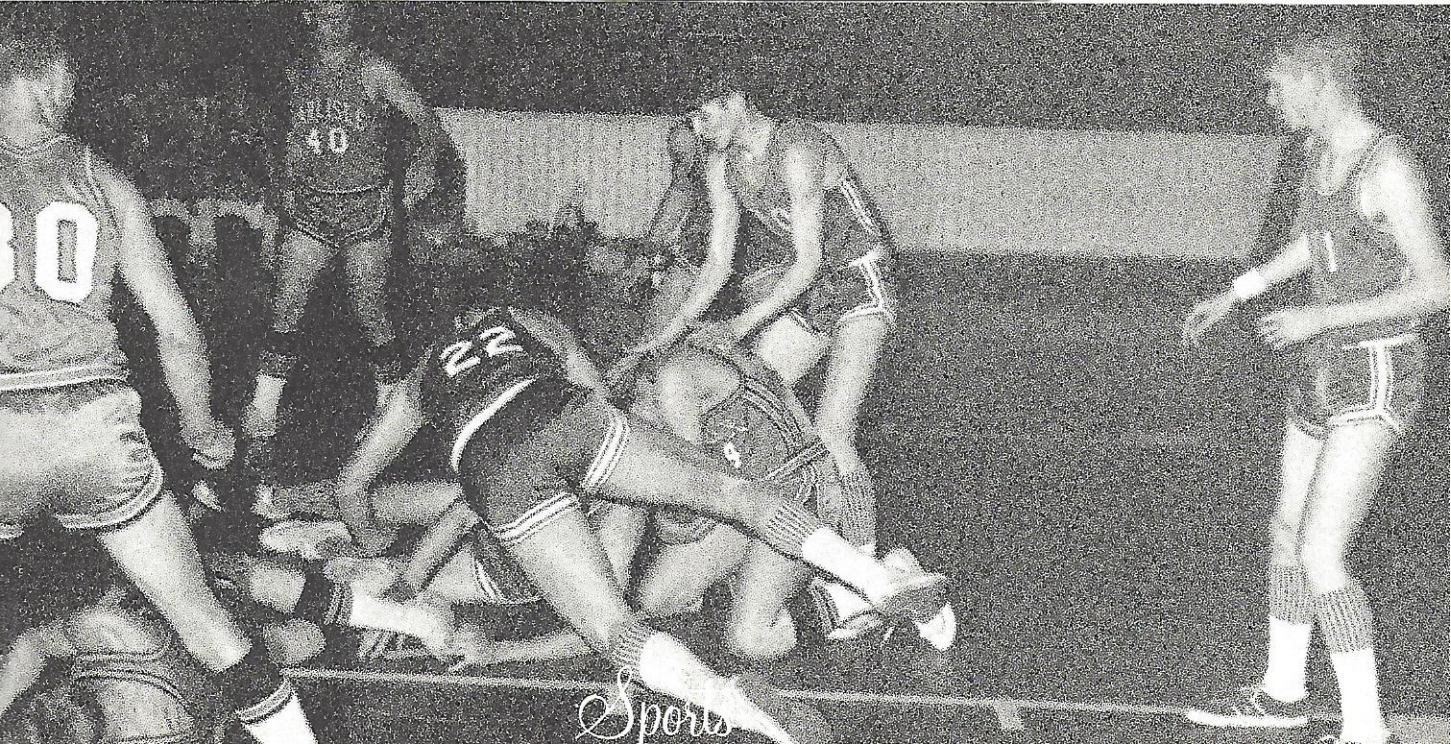
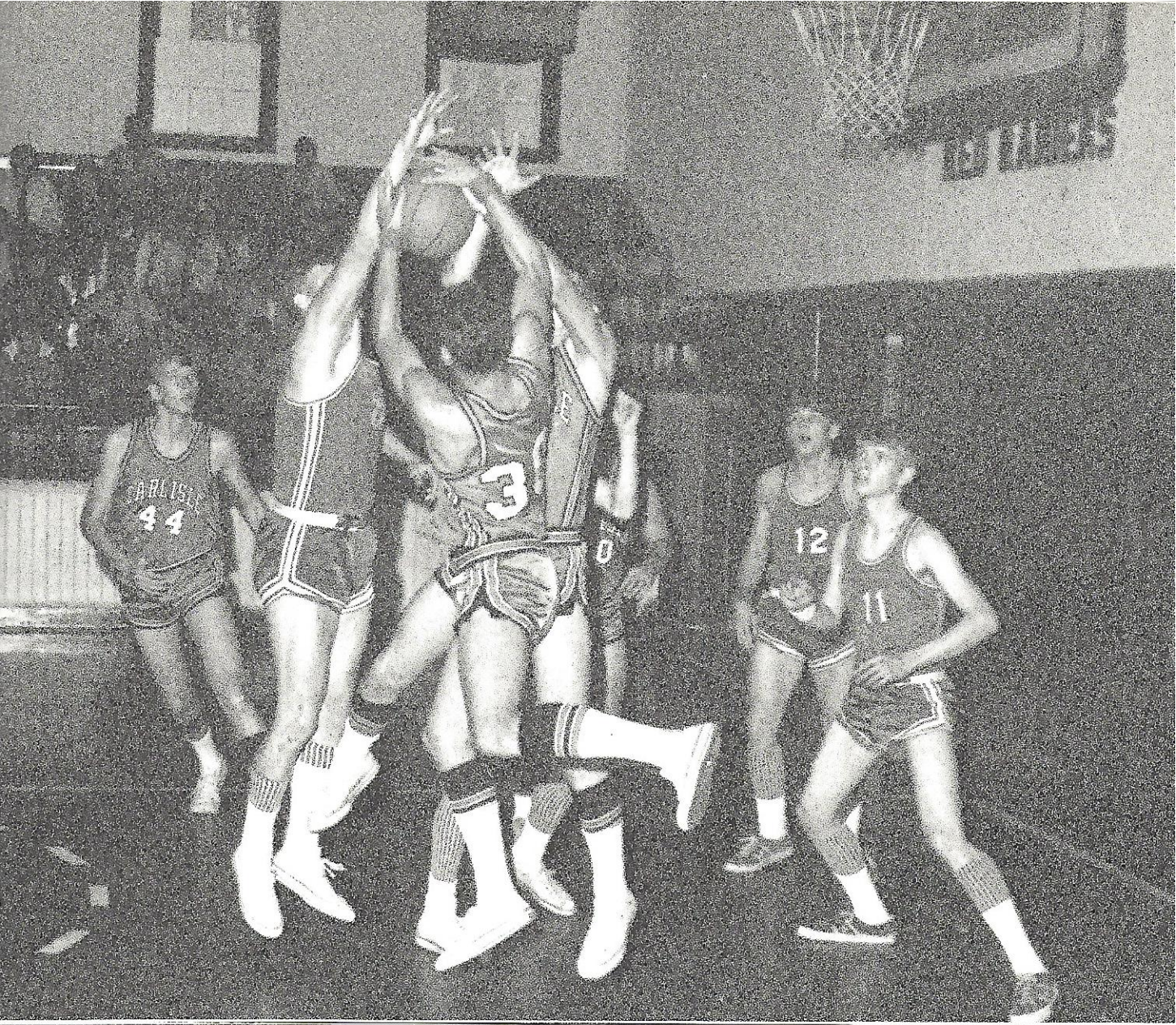
