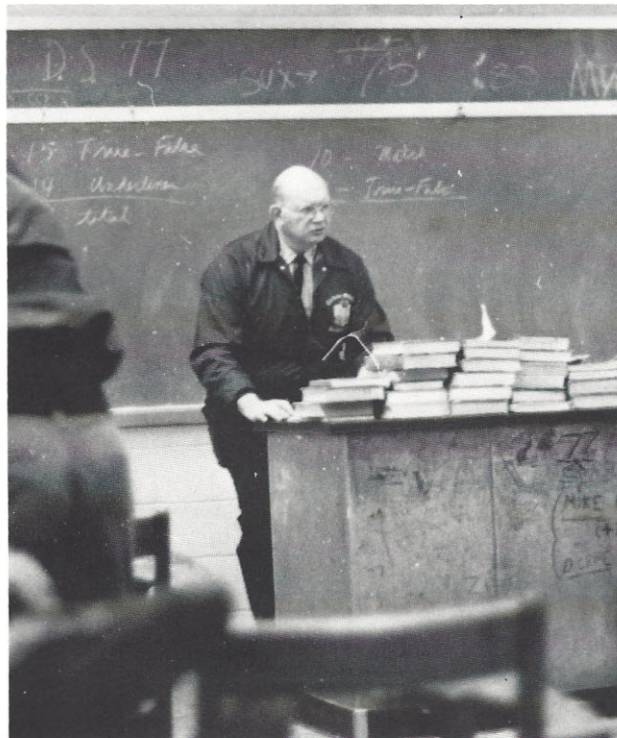




DEDICATION

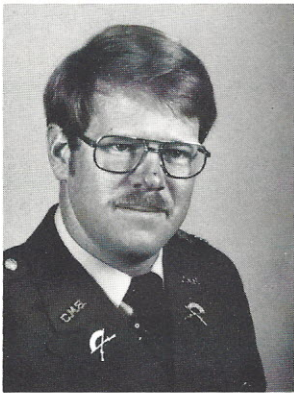
COLONEL WADDY THOMPSON, Dean of Students

COLONEL EDWARD J. COLLINS, Commandant of Cadets

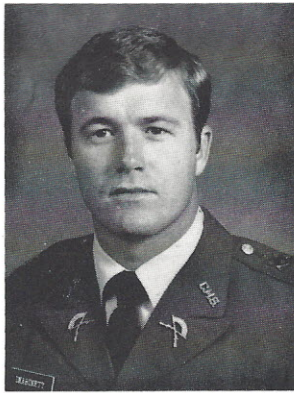
