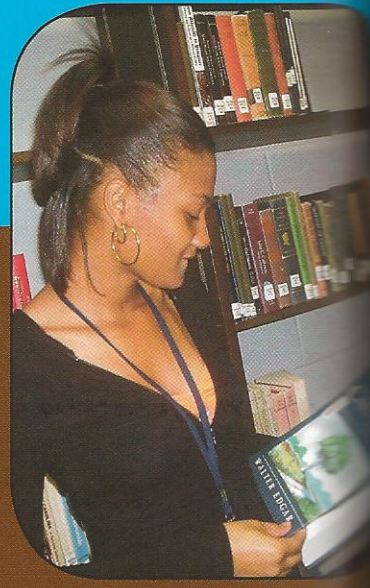


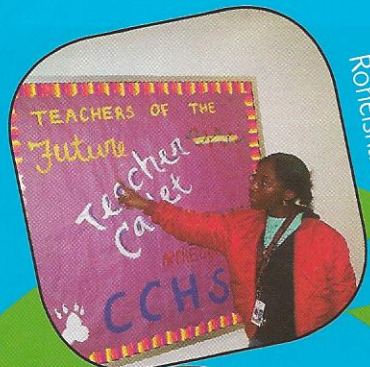

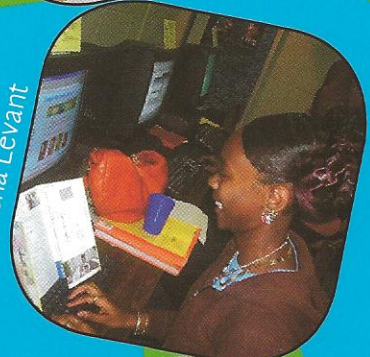
Searching through the South Carolina book of symbols senior Morgan Williams looked for the state bird. "Its amazing how we actually have a state bird," Morgan said.



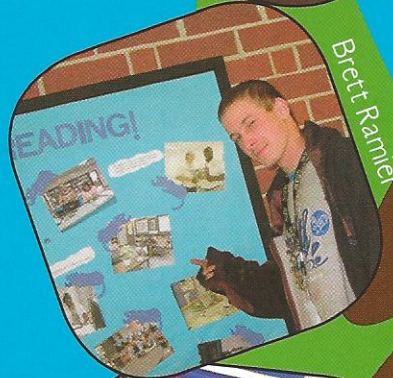
