"I love to dance and that's what made me enjoy my prom so much," senior Kevin Mcubbins said.

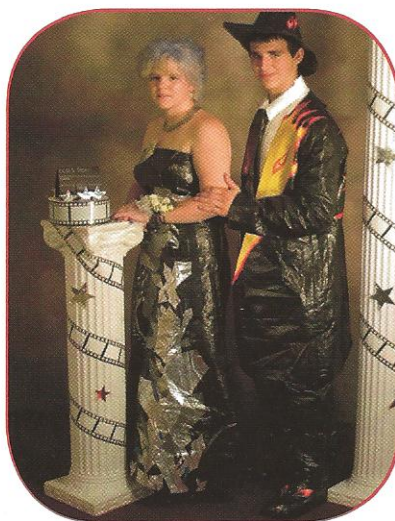


"Prom was hot and a little boring," junior Ashley Chickering said.

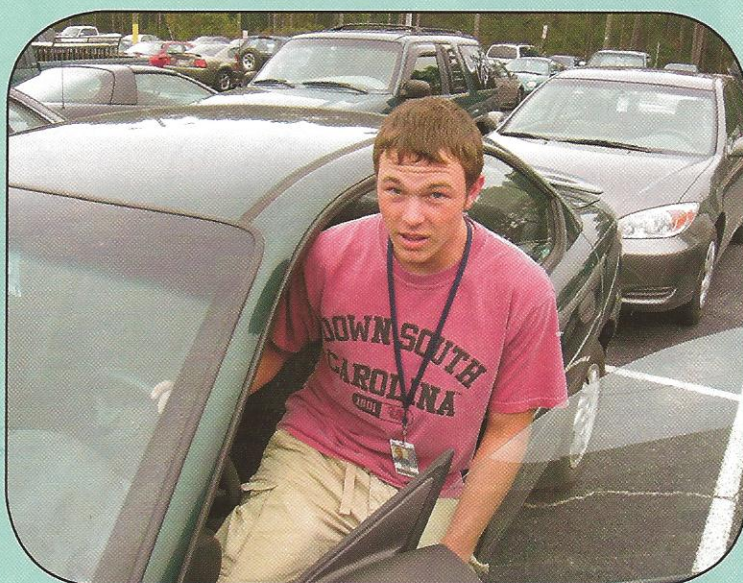
Welcome To My Life

"My routine is very boring, either I go to the commons and talk to my friends or I go to the library and study," senior Brittany Smith said.



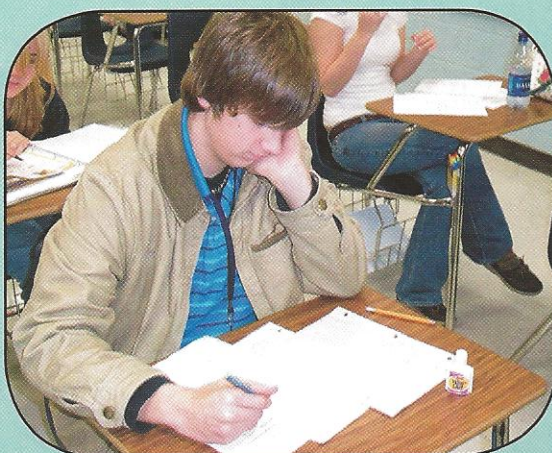

"I get to school at 7:30 A.M. and wait in the commons until school starts," sophomore Leigh Weldon said.

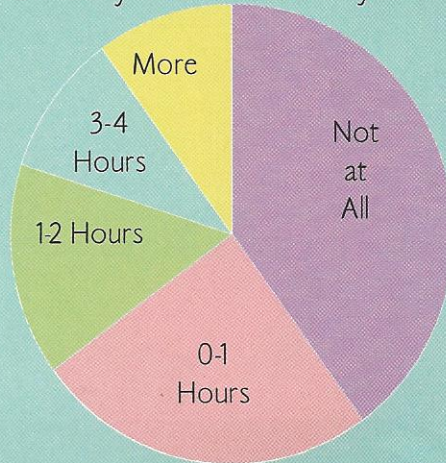

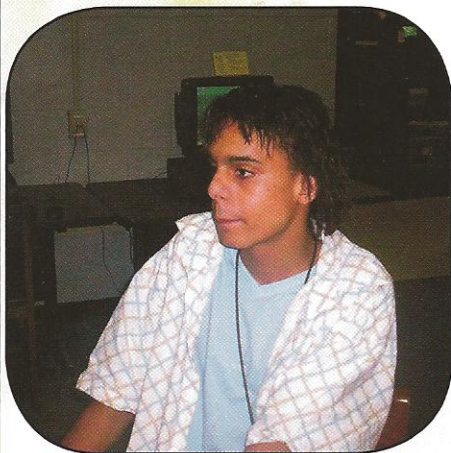

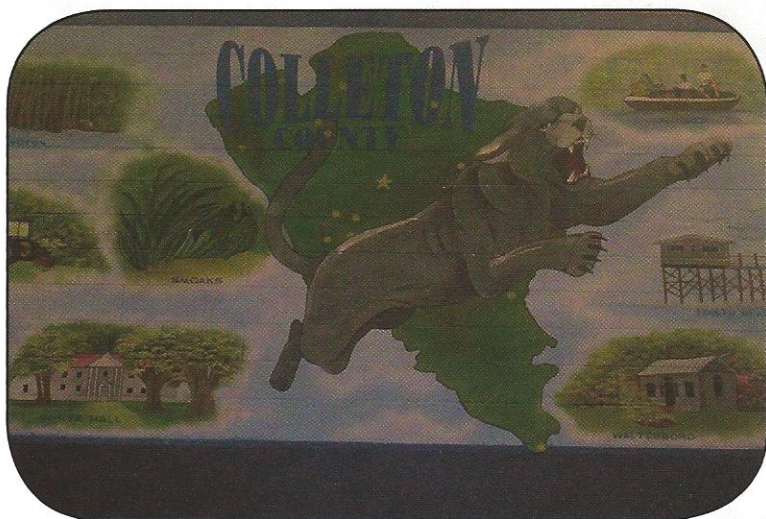

"I use the library so I can do research papers and projects. The media center is a great help to those who don't have computer access at home," senior Kevin Williams said.



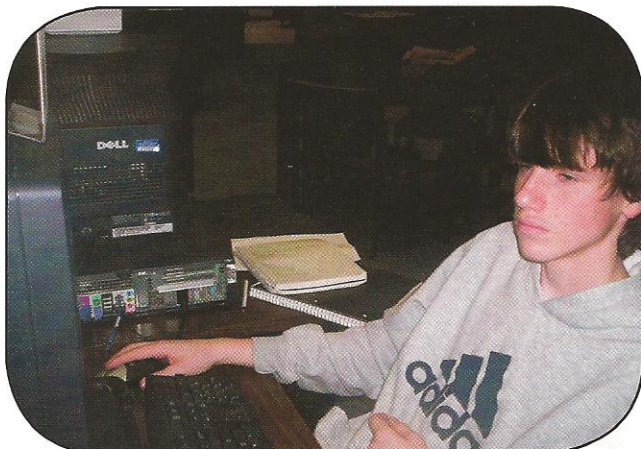

"Icecream is the best and it gives me energy for my classes," senior Aubry Stegall said.



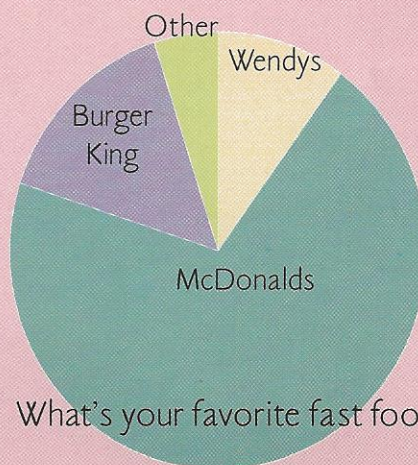

Just a Line in a Song



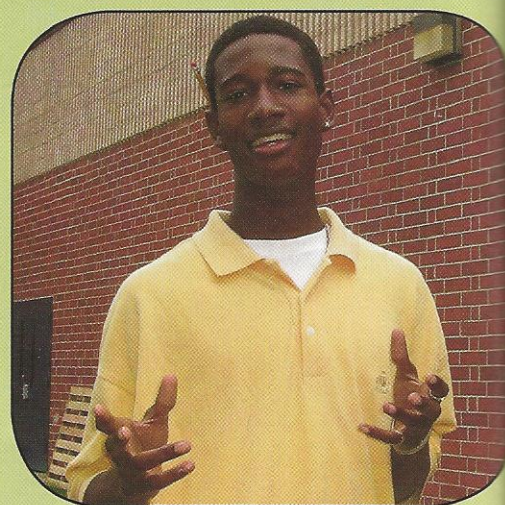

The electives were necessary for the school to meet its main goal, which was to prepare the students for life after high school and usher them into a smooth transition into adulthood.

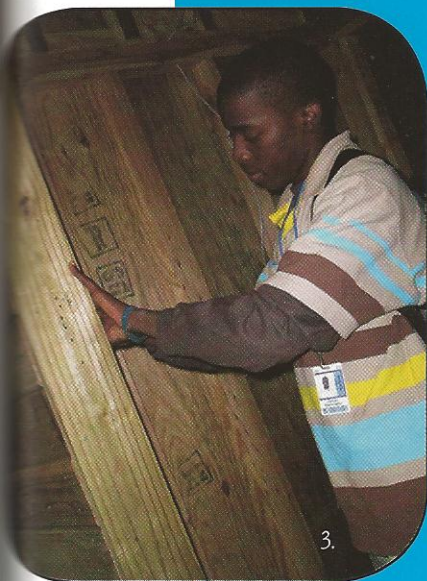
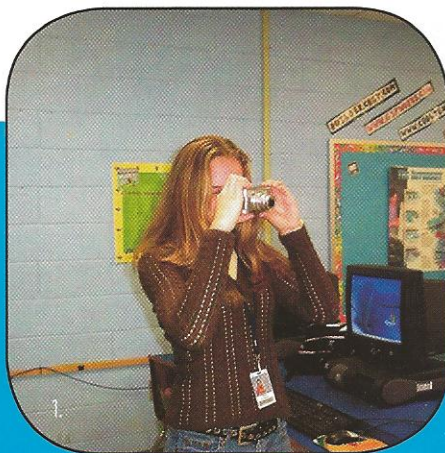
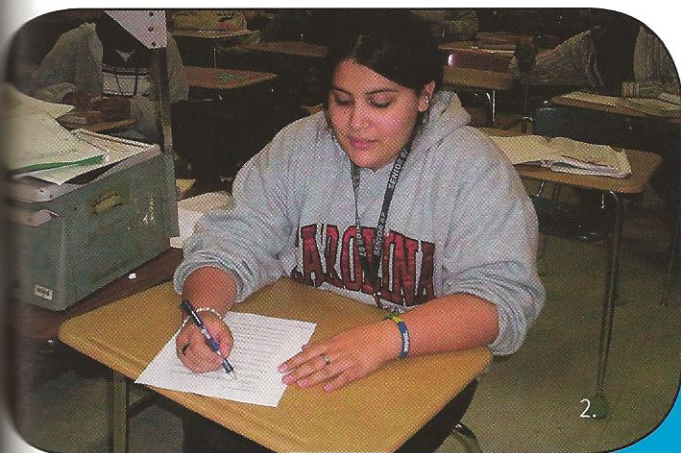

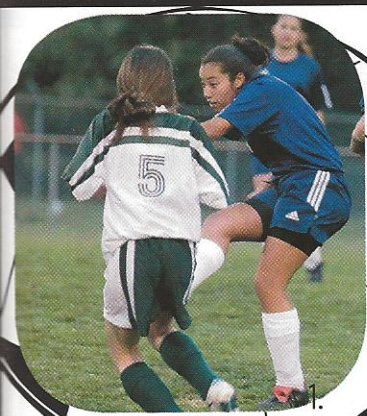
Kick Off

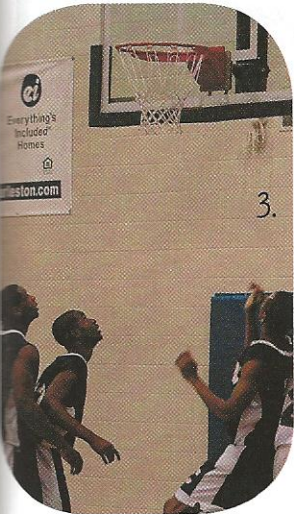
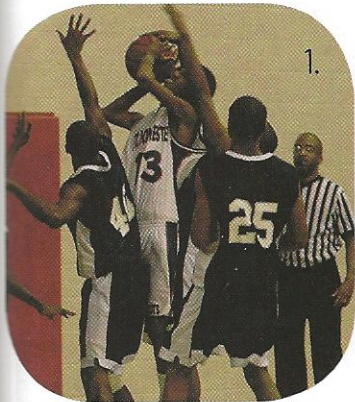
Wanna be a Baller?

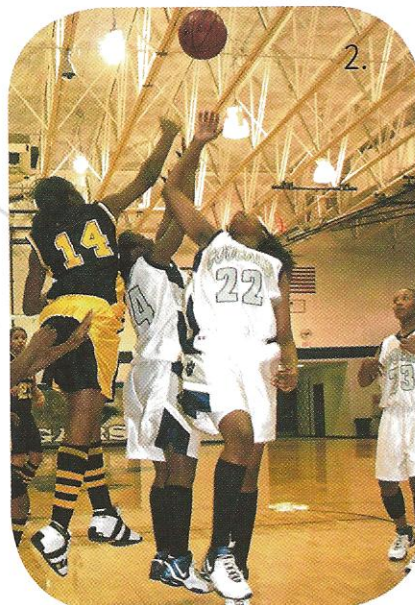
